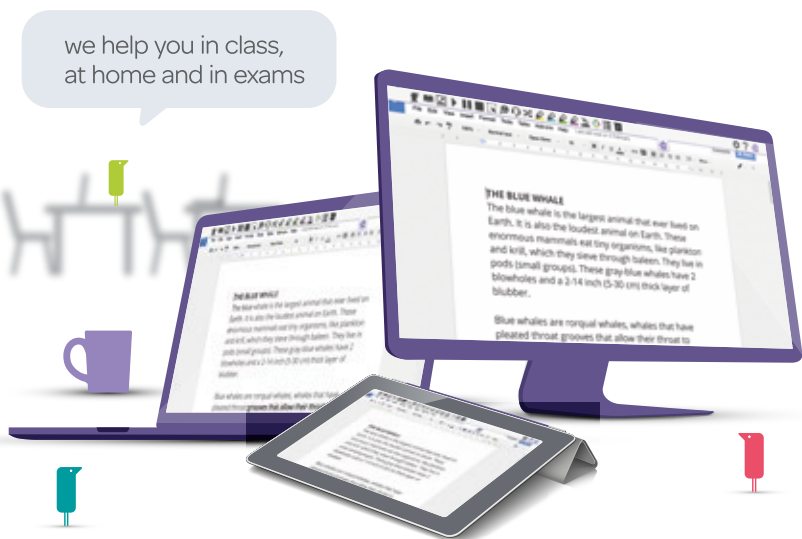

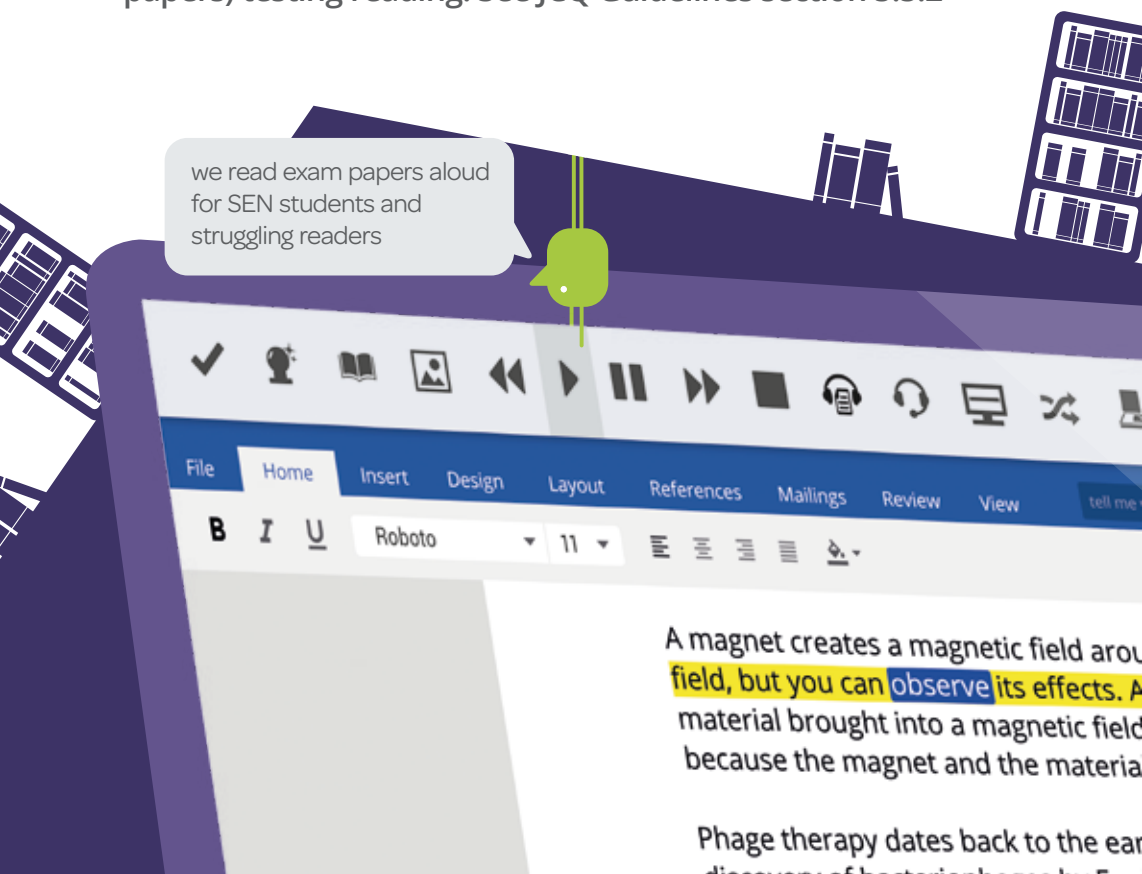

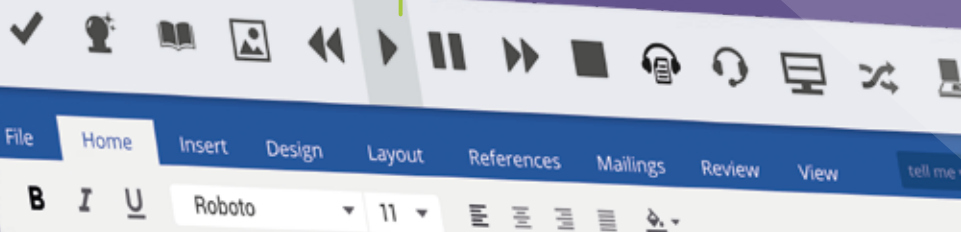
Exam help when students need it most

Read&Write can be used as a **computer reader in exams**, making them more accessible and inclusive for students with **dyslexia and other literacy challenges**. It's a great alternative to human readers, saving on extra staffing costs around exam time. And replacing a human reader means less stress for pupils, who can listen privately on headphones in the exam room, instead of being isolated from their peers.

A computer reader is allowed in papers (or sections of papers) testing reading. See JCQ Guidelines section 5.5.2

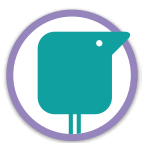
