Basic Language X



Mobile, on-demand, enforceable:

This tool is to be accessible both in a class environment, and for individual use, in order to allow repeating the exercises when away from the teacher, to reinforce learning.

Accelerated Learning:

This tool communicates with the learner in their mother tongue, thus breaking the wall of words and that of the vernacular language. The instructions for using the tool are written in the simplest language (currently in French and in English), then translated and recorded in the corresponding mother tongue.

Combines linguistics and culture:

Learning is based mainly on animations which contextualise the elements of language. These animations showcase two avatars: Ludo (male character) and Vic (female character), designed so as not to stigmatise any population on Earth, and to promote gender equality. Not only do the learners memorise the elements of language X, but they also gather behavioural information: how does a person act when they are of the culture linked to language X.

Using the learner's mother tongue (L1)



Fast transmission of information pertaining to target language (L2), in their mother tongue, particularly in the first stages of the learning process.

Reducing stress for the learners (mainly caused by their fear of failing, or of producing a sentence)

The dialogues for these animations were supplied by the CAVILAM Alliance Française in Vichy (regarded as the « Mecca » of French as a Foreign Language) and cover level A1.1, and can be transcribed into any other language, be it scripted or not, remaining thus in the context of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Level A1:

An extension comprising another hundred or so dialogues will allow to reach this level

Languages:

Our prototype is being developed with L1 being English, and L2 being French.

It has been tested in the Paris area on migrants coming from Bengladesh, who have resided in France for at least 2 years without acquiring basic French.




