If a child takes part in Empathy Week every year from age 5-18, they will have watched, heard and felt the stories of 65 unique and unforgettable people, from all kinds of backgrounds.

These students will leave education with a deeper understanding of empathy through the stories they've engaged with, and the experience of putting empathy into action.

Over the past two years we've engaged over 100,000 students from 40+ countries, providing them with incredible experiences to develop the skills of empathy, leadership and resilience.

Choice and flexibility

Many of our team are qualified teachers who understand the challenges in managing the pressures of curricula and timetables alongside the duty to ensure students are happy, healthy and learning.

We've divided our programme into three stages and it is up to you as a school as to whether you progress past Stage 1 in the year ahead. You can always come back to the other stages later on!

Stage 1 | Discovering Empathy - Watch the 5 films in and around current timetables easily

Stage 2 | Building Empathy - Take it further with our supporting lesson plans and materials

Stage 3 | Empathy+ - An additional opportunity to use and put empathy into practise.

Can't fit all the films into one week? No problem!

Many schools participate in Empathy Week by spreading the films out across 5 weeks. The resources are perfect for assemblies, and spreading the content over time can help to keep the conversation and development of empathy going, even if your students only take part in stage 1!

Core learning: 5 films with structured reflections (15-20 mins per session).

Discovering Empathy

Use our cinematic and powerful films to introduce you students to five incredible individuals, all living out their *Passion and Purpose* in different ways.

Alongside the films, you can hold short, structured reflections with your students to explore the themes further.



Meet Lipa, who's story explores being a young woman in football, racism and "changing the world with a hijab on her head and a football at her feet".



Meet Kwasi, who's story explores chasing his passion for music, going against the grain and being willing to fail.



Meet James, who's story explores his experience of living with Downs Syndrome and living the dream, and how his disability doesn't define him,

Meet Dami, who's story explores her experience of moving countries and her parents being deported, immigration status, resilience in chasing her goals and going to university.



Meet Courtney, who's story explores mental health, growing up homeless and understanding LGBT+.

Important Note: There are laws in some countries prohibiting certain educational content.

Where content is not able to be shown, these topics are removed from the films and materials, ensuring students in these countries can still gain access to the power of Empathy Week's valuable content.

We always seek permission from the people in the films before editing their stories - this is paramount for us.

Stage 1 | Discovering Empathy

Building Empathy

The *Building Empathy* learning resources respond directly to the topics featured in the five films, going deeper into the process of empathy skill building. Through a combination of personal reflection and engaging activities, students will develop six key empathic skills, as detailed below. All resources are differentiated for students aged 5-18 years.

Empathy+

Empathy+ is an additional opportunity where students can further develop their empathy skills and by putting it into action. All Empathy Week packages provide a student and teacher workbook with a structured social action plan for students to follow.

How will students complete the projects?

Ages 5-11 will take part in classroom projects, with teachers supporting using the appropriate workbooks.

Ages 11-18 will take on a project of their choice as a group or individually, supported by the workbook.

Empathy Action Awards

Schools can submit their best Empathy Action Project to the *Global Empathy Awards*, taking place in late June 2022. Our judges are experts in the field of education and assess each entry to decide on a winner. There are two awards: *Outstanding Primary School* (ages 5-11) and *Outstanding Empathy Action Project* (ages 11-18).


