Wishing to achieve a better consistency with the needs of society, Tallinn University has set a goal of becoming the promoter of intelligent lifestyle in Estonia. Accordingly, we have directed our resources and activities into five broad interdisciplinary focus fields.

## EDUCATIONAL INNOVATION

We support the realization of 21st century learning culture and its implementation in Estonian education area. We develop and propagate the content of changing approach to teaching and learning, and create support systems for its implementation. We define and apply principles of the new organisation and management of education. We support educational policy that favours modern learning culture, and raising the prestige of teaching in the society.

## DIGITAL AND MEDIA CULTURE

We train creative professionals who can create a contemporary world of images and enrich the culture in Estonia as well as in the whole world. We help to make Estonian cultural heritage digitally available. We are frontrunners for promoting digital literacy, studying the impact of human-computer interaction, and improving digital didactics as well as digital teaching and learning materials. We contribute to the elaboration of innovative solutions in the information society, and to the introduction of digital and media culture in different spheres of life.

## CULTURAL COMPETENCES

We help to build a society where languages, cultures and creativity are treasured, and to open the road for the development of Estonian cultural area. We develop historical, linguistic, cultural, artistic and philosophical traditions of different nations in parallel with those of the Estonian language, history and culture, as well as the study and teaching of historical-cultural environment. We integrate knowledge of the languages and cultures of various countries and cultural sciences into an interdisciplinary whole.


## HEALTHY AND SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLE




- Geographically, Estonia is located on the north-eastern edge of the European Union. Finland is a short trip across the sea - just 80 kilometres by ferry.
- Estonia is in the Schengen Area. Lennart Meri Tallinn Airport, named after our first president in post-Soviet era, has direct flights to most of Europe.
- Estonia has a population of about 1.3 million but its territory is larger than Denmark or Netherlands.
- The Estonian language is a Finno-Ugric language - it mostly resembles Finnish and is different from Latvian and Russian languages.
- Estonia was occupied by the Soviet
   Union for decades but Estonia sees itself
   as more influenced by Nordic tastes and
   traditions Scandinavia with a twist.

 Around 55% of Estonian territory is covered with forest. There are over 1500 islands,

1000 lakes and 7000 rivers in Estonia.

- Estonia is an e-society: we have electronic ID-cards, e-government, e-health, e-school, e-parking, etc. Most people use e-banking, pay for parking with a mobile phone and pay their taxes or even vote online. The Skype software was developed by Estonian engineers. Wireless internet access can be found everywhere.
- Estonia boasts a long tradition of providing quality education. Its vibrant and international education and research environment makes Estonia an attractive place for people who wish to work and study abroad. 90% of international students are satisfied with their overall living and studying standard in Estonia (global average 88%).



- Tallinn is our medieval capital and by far the biggest city with a population of around 400 000.
- Tallinn's Old Town was entered on UNESCO's list of World Heritage Sites in 1997.
- In 2011, Tallinn took on its role as European Capital of Culture.
- Tallinn serves as a home for NATO's main research centre for cyber defence.
- The Estonian Song and Dance Celebration, held in Tallinn every five years, assembles one of the world's largest choirs. Up to 30 000 singers usually participate.

- At 314 metres, Tallinn's TV tower is the tallest building in Estonia. On a clear day, the coastline of Finland is visible from its observation platform.
- Tallinn is a maritime town. The length of the coast is 46 kilometres.
- The Raeapteek on Town Hall Square is Europe's oldest continuously-operating pharmacy. It has been open since 1422.
- Tallinn is the city of the first Christmas tree in the world. In 1441, the fraternity of Tallinn's unmarried merchants, called the Blackheads, put up a Christmas tree in the Town Hall Square.

# WEARE DEMANDING & SUSTAINABLE

Tallinn University's goal is to support the sustainable development of Estonia through high-quality research and study, education of intellectuals, public discussions and promotion of academic partnership.

#### ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Our goal is to achieve high-quality research and competitive study programmes, to create university centres of excellence, strengthen the support functions in science and improve the results of doctoral studies. Studies that are demanding for both the students and lecturers are secured by study programmes that follow the needs of society, labour market and learners.

#### **GREEN UNIVERSITY**

As centres of knowledge creation, universities have a unique opportunity as well as an obligation to support and advise the community on social, cultural, economic and environmental issues. In this way, the principles of sustainable development can be implemented across the whole society. Tallinn University initiated the Green Academic Footprint idea in the Network of Universities from the Capitals of Europe (UNICA) in order to participate in the process of intertwining the principles of sustainable development and everyday life.



## TALLINN UNIVERSITY

We are the largest university of humanities and social sciences in Tallinn and among the top 5% of universities in the World, according to QS World University Rankings\* 2020.

Tallinn University is an advocate and planner of intelligent lifestyle in Estonia, supporting the sustainability of our society as well as individual self-realisation. At our university, longest traditions of teacher training in Estonia and the only film and media school in the Baltic countries exist side by side. Tallinn University was established by a decision of the parliament of Estonia on March 18, 2005 when a number of Tallinn educational and research institutions were consolidated into a single institution. Tallinn University is composed of six schools and one regional college:

## WE ARE INTERDISCIPLINARY

Challenges that the society is facing today require cooperation across different disciplines. Tallinn University follows the principle of interdisciplinarity in order to offer innovative solutions and exert significant influence on society.

#### UNIVERSITY CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE

TLU Centres of Excellence are aimed at advancing international cooperation, supporting interdisciplinary collaboration for excellent research and creative results as well as improving external cooperation. We have 5 interdisciplinary Centres of Excellence in behavioural and neural sciences, educational innovation, intercultural studies, interdisciplinary lifecourse studies and in media innovation and digital culture.

#### INTERDISCIPLINARY TEACHING AND LEARNING

Implementation of interdisciplinarity in studies and research in cooperation with students, academics and professionals in the field offers students an education that corresponds to the needs of the labour market. Tallinn University provides all students with experiences of interdisciplinary teaching and learning every student participates in at least one interdisciplinary project in the course of his/her studies. Students in various specialities address topical issues in the society, and discuss their future potential. In this way, general competencies such as problem-solving skills, self-expression and cooperation skills that are necessary in the labour market, take shape.



## WE ARE INTERNATIONAL

Tallinn University is a reliable and valued employer and partner in international research. We create conditions for internationally competitive academic staff and conduct research projects with international cooperation.

## INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY

We have approximately 900 international students in degree and exchange studies. Every 10th academic person is of foreign background. Active international cooperation, well-known guest lecturers and our bachelor's, master's and doctoral programmes in English help to create the multicultural university community.

## INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

Tallinn University has over 40 partner universities around the world. These agreements include both student and staff exchanges as well as collaboration in projects and research. In addition, schools of Tallinn University have over 400 Erasmus+ mobility agreements offering extensive opportunities for the members. Tallinn University is a member of 6 international networks (UNICA, EUA, EUA-CDE and Magna Harta).

#### TALLINN SUMMER AND WINTER SCHOOL

Every year about 400 people from more than 50 countries participate in courses offered by the Estonia's biggest international summer and winter school. In ten years, Tallinn Summer and Winter School have developed into one of the most successful international projects of Tallinn University.
