

# SITUATION OF LIFE ON LAND



With population growth, subsistence hunting and slash and burn agriculture has led to drastic forest degradation and is threatening the Sangu-Matamuhuri Reserve Forest, habitat to 30 globally threatened species. The degradation is also threatening the local water supply as the forest is the source of Sangu and Matamuhuri Rivers.

# OUR IMPACT ON ENVIRONMENT



Our primary surveys show that direct incentives through our environment-friendly livelihoods work best for protecting wildlife. Additionally, each family working with Crafts for Conservation sign contracts declaring that they will not harm wildlife. Thus, potentially, reducing hunting of 30 globally threatened species.



### SOCIOECONOMIC CONDITION



Studies reveal that poverty in the project area is among the highest in the country, with 40%+ people below the poverty line, due to remoteness, and social exclusion.









A typical Mru family consists of 7-10 members, with no access to basic necessities like health or education

## OUR IMPACT ON HOUSEHOLDS



To address this issue, Crafts for Conservation is promoting traditional skill and knowledge to bring people out of poverty. Households working with Crafts for Conservation has at least 50% more income compared to baseline.









#### **GENDER** SITUATION



Historically, the women in indigenous communities have been master-craftsmen, but use their talent to produce for household use only.





## OUR IMPACT ON WOMEN



Crafts for Conservation is creating a market for indigenous women's craftsmanship, and providing tools and skills required to sustain an income\*, for long-term economic empowerment.





## OUR IMPACT ON **CHILDREN**



With improved income\* generated from environmentally-friendly livelihoods, the families now have more resource to spare on education and health for children.







### CURRENT STATE CRAFTS FOR CONSERVATION

# COMPLETED 2 YEAR PILOT PROGRAM

After completion of a 2 year long successful pilot program, Crafts for Conservation finally launched its products in September, 2019. The initiative is currently working with 15 households (supporting 150 people approx), with an average of 2 households joining every month.
