
Actual and perceived social mobility of children, 2016



Money, Money

- The transit and ground passenger transportation market expected to reach a value of nearly \$684.68 billion by 2022, significantly growing at a CAGR of 10.1% during the forecast period.
- 2. Analysts at Mizuho Securities USA said in a note to clients that Open Payment for New York Metro could add \$40 million in annual revenue for Visa and \$27 million for Mastercard once OMNY is fully implemented, in 2021. VISA and Mastercard could see an additional 2.5 billion transactions from the subway each year after the transition, the analysts estimated. 22 May 2019
- 3. 2019 will be the first year to see contactless travel top the **one billion journeys per annum in London** as the popularity of such payments continues to rise among UK users.
- 4. 7 of the top 10 countries by mobile phone penetration are European lead by the UK at +85% of the population

5. The **U.S. is finally embracing contactless payments**, which will likely accelerate the move away from cash in favor of credit, debit and mobile wallets. And it's largely **thanks to hurried commuters**


