HORNBILL FESTIVAL TOUR

November & December

SEEK THE **ENDANGERED** WHITE ONE-HORNED **RHINO**, VISIT **ANCIENT** HINDU **TEMPLES**, AND MEET THE LAST OF THE **HEAD HUNTERS** IN THEIR TRADITIONAL **NAGA VILLAGES** BEFORE CELEBRATING THEIR **SONGS**, **DANCES** AND **SPORTS** AT THE ANNUAL **HORNBILL FESTIVAL**

Follow the mighty Brahmaputra River from historic Guwahati to Kaziranga National Park. Cross the plains of Assam to Majuli Island to visit ancient Hindu monasteries. Head into the forested hills of Nagaland up to the Burmese border and meet the last of the Naga headhunters in their own traditional village homes, before reaching the former British hill station of Kohima. Finally, meet all 16 Naga tribes at the Hombill Festival for extravagant celebrations of dance, song, cuisine and sport.

TREK IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF THE IDU-MISHMI TRIBE HUNTERS THROUGH THE PRISTINE JUNGLE OF THE EASTERN HIMALAYA AND DISCOVER THE BEAUTY OF SEVEN REMOTE HIGH ALTITUDE LAKES

Drive from Dibrugarh on the banks of the Brahmaputra River in a comfortable, modern, private vehicle to arrive at your homestay in the Idu-Mishmi tribe village of Anini, nestling in the upper reaches of the Dibang Valley. Continue on foot, following traditional hunting paths, rising steeply through lush grasslands and jungles of the eastern Himalaya with porters to carry your bags, sleeping each night at prepared camps. Discover no fewer than seven beautiful, isolated, pristine lakes amongst the clouds, each steeped in traditional Idu-Mishmi folklore.

NORTHERN HIGHLIGHTS

May to September

JOURNEY THROUGH THE AWE-INSPIRING MOUNTAINS OF NORTHERN PAKISTAN RIGHT TO THE CHINESE FRONTIER

From the bazaars of Peshawar, drive through the wild Hindu Kush mountains, exploring ancient Buddhist sites in the green Swat Valley to reach the unique Kalash Valleys. Follow ancient trade routes over majestic Shandur Pass to reach the kingdom of Hunza, set amidst incredible mountain peaks. Explore Karimabad's medieval forts, then head up to Khunjerab Pass on the Chinese border. Pass through the thronging bazaars of Gilgit, once an important crossroads on the Old Silk Road, before flying back over the Karakoram mountains to Islamabad.

DRIVE THE LENGTH OF PAKISTAN FROM THE IMPERIAL CITIES OF THE NORTH TO THE ARABIAN SEA IN THE SOUTH

Set out, either from modern Islamabad or from Mughal Lahore, and drive across the plains of Punjab, first through Multan, city of revered mystics and Sufi shrines, then along the mighty River Indus through Sindh. Next, head through Cholistan Desert and finally reach the shores of the Arabian Sea in the far south. With visits to both Harappa and Mohenjo-Daro, amongst the earliest settlements in South Asia, this tour propels us on a journey through time, encompassing the greatest historical and natural sites that south Pakistan has to offer.



TREK TO THE SUMMIT OF NORTH AFRICA'S HIGHEST MOUNTAIN, TREK THROUGH TRADITIONAL BERBER VILLAGES AND SWIM IN THE MOUNTAIN WATERS OF LAKE IFNI

A wonderful week-long trek to climb Jebel Toubkal, at 4,167m, the highest mountain in North Africa. The hike to the summit is challenging, but requires no mountaineering experience and the panoramic views from the summit make all the work worthwhile. With the start of the trek just a couple of hours' drive from Marrakech, you can reach the summit and complete a circuit around its southern flanks, taking a swim in the waters of the stunning Lake Ifni, within a week and still have time to return and explore Morocco's most captivating city.



- Climb to the summit of Jebel Toubkal, North Africa's highest mountain
- Swim in the mountain waters of Lake Ifni
- Trek through traditional Berber villages
- Enjoy fantastic panoramas from a succession of mountain passes

A **TREK** IN MOROCCO **WITH A DIFFERENCE**: LIVE LIKE A **NOMAD**. JOIN A SEMI-NOMADIC, TRANSHUMANCE **BERBER** FAMILY OF THE **AÏT ATTA** WARRIOR TRIBE, ON THEIR GREAT ANNUAL **MIGRATION** TREK FROM THE **HIGH ATLAS** MOUNTAINS TO THEIR HOMELAND IN **JEBEL SAHRO**

Join a Berber family of the Aït Atta warrior tribe, along with their camels, sheep and goats, hens, donkeys and dogs, on their great annual migration trek from their summer pastures in the High Atlas Mountains in September back south to their homeland in Jebel Sahro. Alternatively, reverse this trek and head northwards with the family in May to their summer pastures. With hardly a permanent settlement along the entirety of this route, follow an exceptional, remote and high-level trail, only ever used by the Ait Atta themselves on their migration trek.

EVEREST BASE CAMP TREK

May to September

TREK ON TOP OF THE ROOF OF THE WORLD TO THE BASE CAMP OF THE VERY HIGHEST MOUNTAIN ON EARTH

Take on the challenge of trekking along the renowned Khumbu glacier and through the natural wonders of Sagaramatha National Park to reach the base camp of the highest mountain on Earth. Enjoy wonderful views of Mount Everest itself, while getting close to other Himalayan giants, too, including Mount Lhotse, Mount Cho Oyu and Ama Dablam, culminating in an ascent of Kala Patthar (5554m). All this while undertaking a spiritual journey through this Buddhist heartland of temples, monasteries, chortens and prayer flags.
