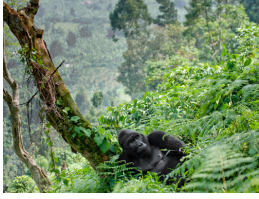

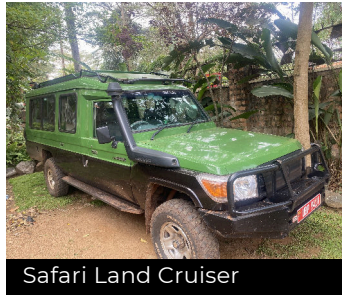

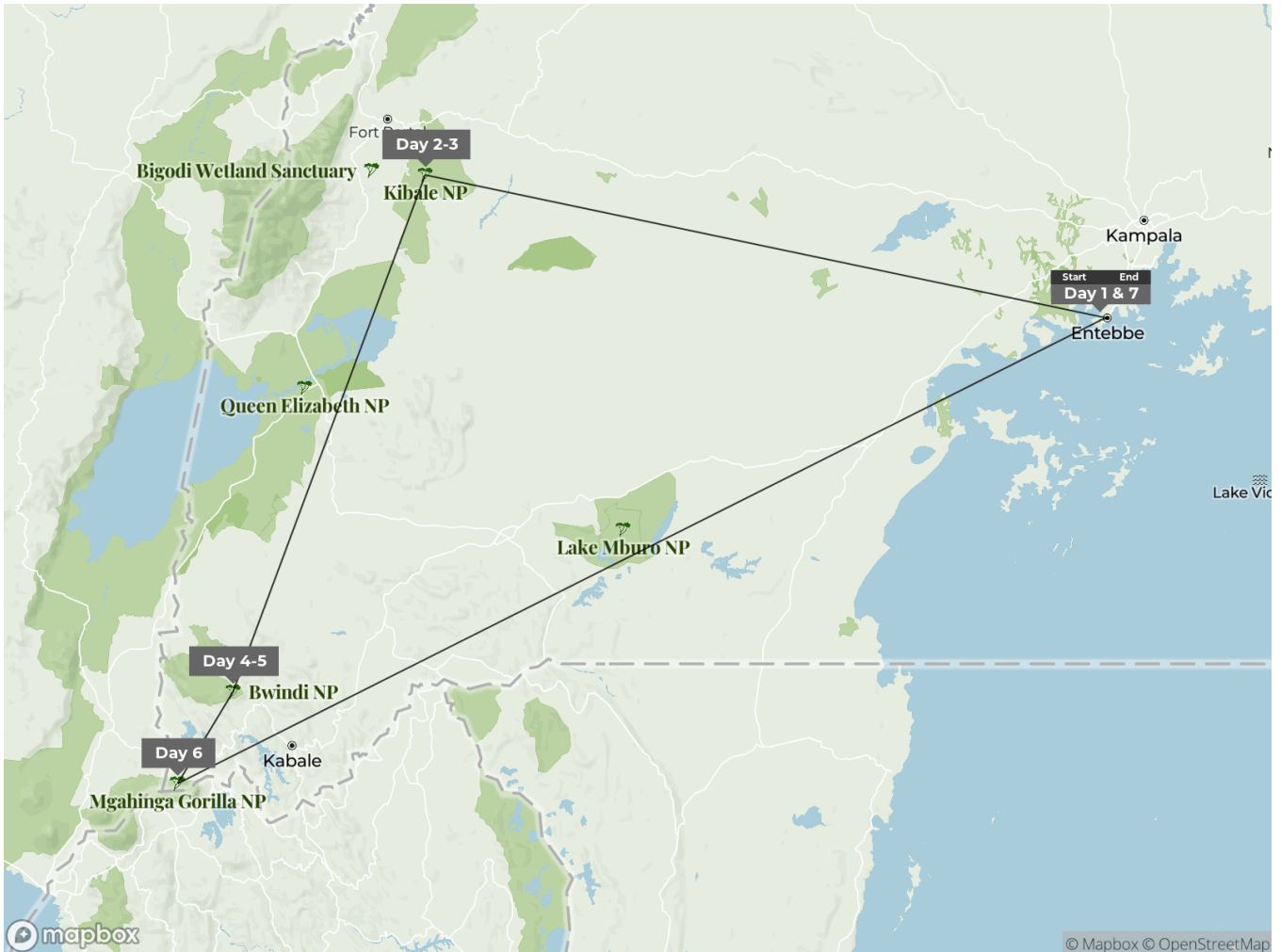

Welcome to Uganda and welcome to your safari! It all begins here with an introduction to your guide and with a chance for you to ask any questions. Then it's time to get out there and enjoy your safari. Because you chose Uganda, you have so much to look forward to.

Often referred to as the primate capital of East Africa, Kibale National Park is famed as Uganda's top site for tracking chimpanzees. Other primates you're likely to see here include red colobus, black-and-white colobus, L'Hoest's monkey, red-tailed monkey, olive baboon and Uganda mangabey. Only the lucky few will encounter Kibale's secretive population of forest elephants, but you are certain to enjoy the prominent birdlife. Kibale National park, which averages about 3,300 feet in elevation, is an extension of the great rainforests of Central Africa. It is inhabited by three large communities of chimps, each numbering more than 100 individuals. Each community has a complicated social structure. The big adult males dominate the group and defend the community territory against incursions by male outsiders; the females usually wander in small family groups

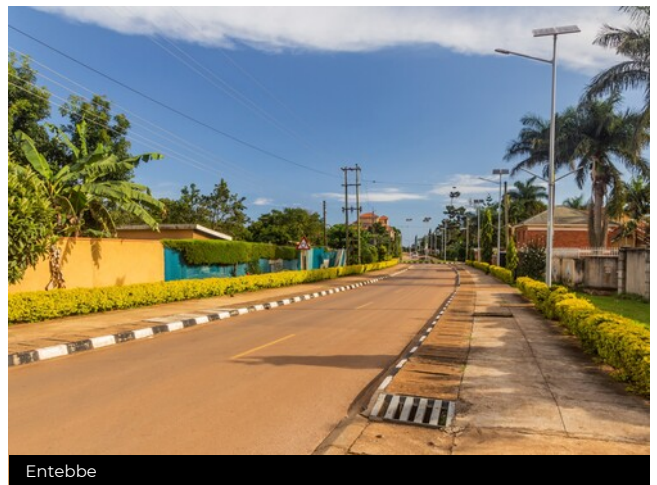
Activity Day 1

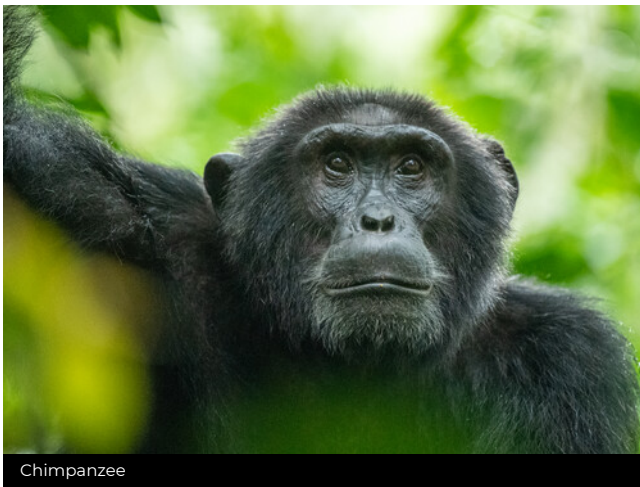

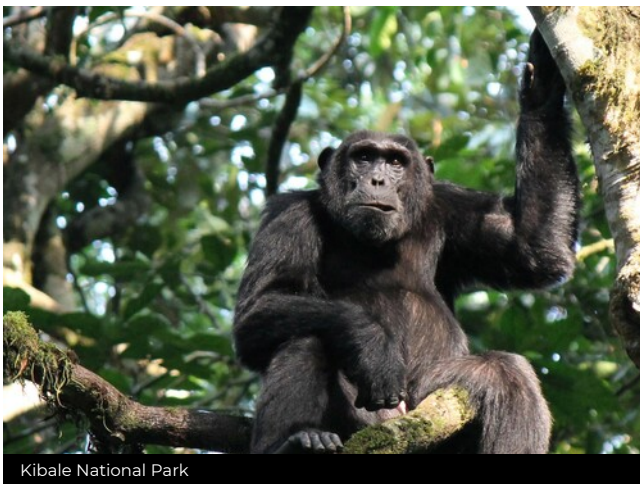

Kibale National Park

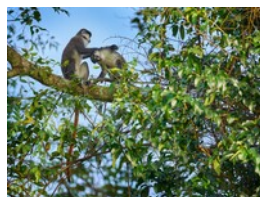
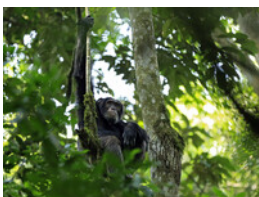
Set on fertile volcanic soils studded with beautiful crater lakes, Kibale National Park protects a 766km² tract of mid-altitude rainforest extending northwards from Queen Elizabeth National Park. Here, you can look forward to seeing a wide variety of monkeys, birds and butterflies, but the star attraction is a 1,000-strong population of chimpanzees, and their hysterical pant-hoot vocalizations, which carry deep into the forest interior.

Activities Day 2

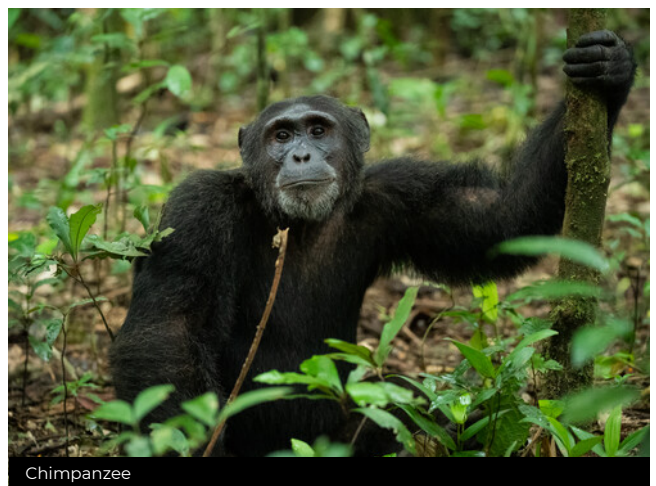
→ Transfer by Road, **Entebbe** via **Fort Portal** to **Kibale National Park**.

Early morning after breakfast we continue driving through the undulating highlands of south-western Uganda on our way to the greener and beautiful Fort Portal area. The lush rolling hills of this region provide good photo opportunities.

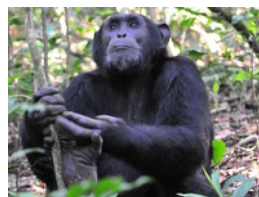
As you approach Fort Portal in the foothills of the Rwenzori Mountains, you enter Uganda's famous tea plantation region. A carpet of green spreads before you, as far as the eye can see, and seems an unusual contrast to the countryside through which you have just passed.

Afternoon

→ This afternoon we explore **Bigodi Wetland Sanctuary**, a patch of forest-fringed marsh set aside by the local community to protect a diverse selection of birds and monkeys. You will expect birds like the great blue turaco, blue monkeys, baboons, otters, mongoose, bushbucks, bush pigs and others.

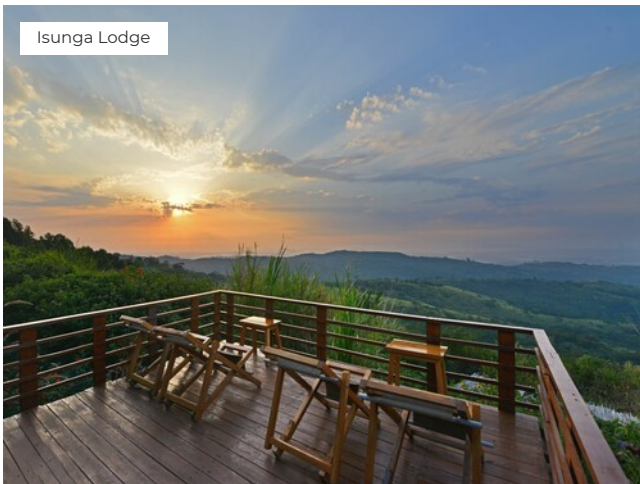

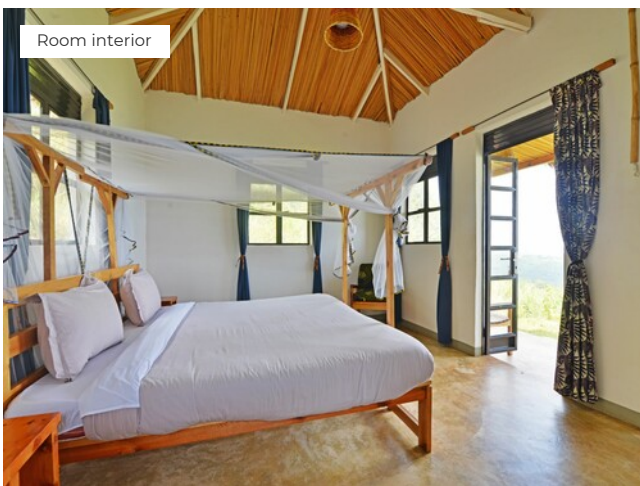

We also enjoy the down-to-earth atmosphere created by the lodge's friendly Scottish owner-managers, and the facility to explore the surrounding crater lakes by bike or canoe.

Activity Day 3

Morning

→ Come with us on a forest trek to search for chimpanzees this morning in **Kibale National Park**. Spending time with these creatures is sure to be a highlight of your safari.

Chimpanzees are man's closest cousins though they are one of the most threatened primate species. More primates like black and white colobus monkeys, L'Hoest monkeys, grey-cheeked mangabey, red-tailed monkeys, bush babies, pottos and many bird species like the yellow-spotted nicator, rumped tinker bird, little greenbul, green breasted pitta, the crowned eagle, black bee-eater and mammals like elephants can be seen in this walk.

Typically, we locate the chimps by listening for their pant-hooting calls, then hustle to the area from which they are calling. We get to observe them as they feed in fruiting trees, lounge, and socialize with each other, or even, occasionally hunt.

While most of today's forests are no more than 12,000 years old, Bwindi's vegetation has been weaving itself into tangles over at least 25,000 years, in the process accumulating a lengthy species list. This includes 310 species of butterfly, 51 reptiles, 200 trees, 88 months, and an exceptional 120 types of mammal including 10 primates. The latter includes chimpanzee, L'Hoest's, red-tailed and blue monkey, black and white colobus, baboon, and Bwindi's most famous resident, the mountain gorilla.

Activity Day 4

Afternoon

→ Today we shall be driving to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. Bwindi is a prime destination for birdwatchers. Its 350

species include seven which are IUCN red data listed and 90% of all Albertine rift endemics, species which are difficult or impossible to see in any other part of East Africa.

Ichumbi is a very intimate lodge in the middle of the Bwindi forest. The rooms were amazingly nice and very private and quiet.

Fitted with a sun terrace, the units feature a flat-screen TV. A balcony with garden views is offered in each unit. Each room has a private bathroom with free toiletries.

Vegetarian, buffet, full English/Irish, continental, and American breakfast options are available each morning at the lodge.

Ichumbi Gorilla Lodge offers a terrace. For guests' convenience, the accommodation has a business centre. Guests can also relax in the shared lounge area. Advice on the best sites to visit in the area is offered at the 24-hour front desk.

Activity Day 5

→ You'll never forget the time you spend with the mountain gorillas when we take you trekking through the forests to find them in **Bwindi Impenetrable National Park**.

After breakfast, proceed for the morning briefing before enjoying the highlight of the trip - gorilla trekking, which may last the entire day.

We trek through the rainforest and bamboo covered slopes, accompanied by a guide and trackers, in search of a mountain gorilla family. The walking can sometimes be tough and long, but when you catch a glimpse of the magnificent silverback, any discomforts will be quickly forgotten. When sighted, visitors will be guided to within 6 metres from the gorillas, sit around them for a whole hour while gazing into their big round eyes.

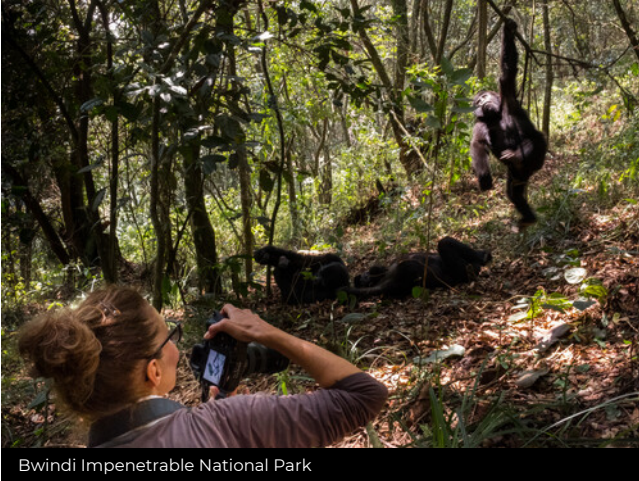
Gorilla trekking is unpredictable. It's difficult to foresee how many hours you will hike. The gorilla excursion can take from 2 up to 8 hours. Expect to walk along distance in steep and muddy conditions, sometimes with rain overhead, before you encounter any gorillas. A good physical condition is recommended. For conservation purposes, time spent with the gorillas is limited to one hour. A ranger will brief you on how to behave with the gorillas.

Mgahinga Gorilla National Park

As its name suggests, Mgahinga Gorilla National Park is a key stronghold for the mountain gorilla, and one of only four places worldwide where this charismatic ape can be observed in the wild. Despite being Uganda's smallest national park, it has an impressive altitude span, ranging from 2,227m at the entrance gate to 4,127m at the summit of Muhabura, the tallest of three volcanoes situated within its boundaries. There are no roads inside the park, but its varied habitats, which include cathedralesque bamboo stands, dense rainforest and high-altitude moorland, can be explored on various guided foot excursions.

Activity Day 6

→ Golden monkey tracking starts at Mgahinga

Gorilla National Park headquarters at 7:30 am for pre-tracking briefing (on the dos and don'ts of tracking the golden monkeys). The actual trek begins at 8:00 am. Hiking through the forests to sight the golden monkeys is not so strenuous like gorilla trekking because golden monkeys live in lower areas, so tourists do not track for more than 3 hours. When tourists encounter the golden monkey family, they are given one hour.

It is estimated that Mgahinga Gorilla National Park has between 3000-4000 golden monkeys grouped in troupes of 30s led by a principal adult male. Golden monkeys are primarily to be found in the bamboo forest that skirt the lower slopes of the volcanoes. They are quite more active in the bamboo canopy. Golden monkeys are opportunistic feeders. What they feed on could be by the availability of fruits, leaves of bamboo trees, shoots of bamboo, shrubs, flowers, invertebrates and these make it to be restricted to the highland forest, mostly the bamboo forest.
