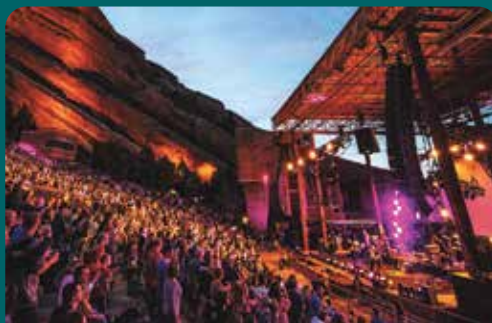

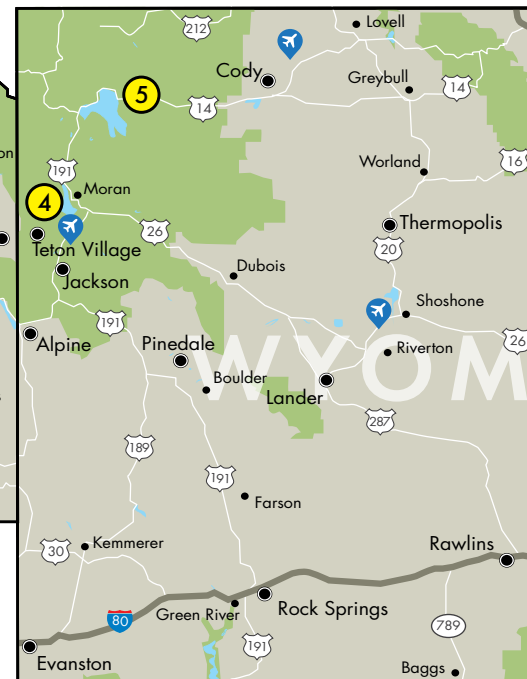

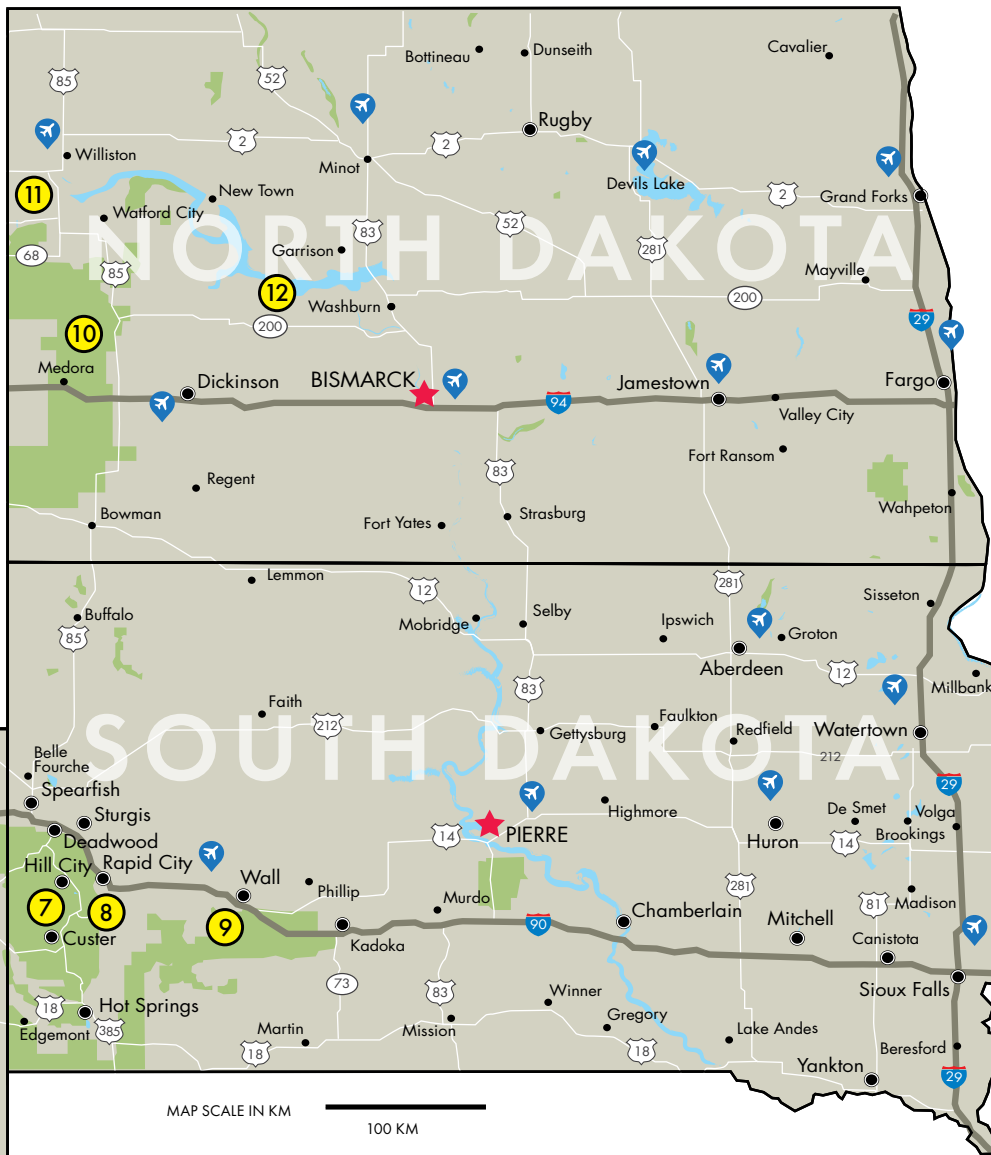

WHERE EVERY TRAIL LEADS YOU TO A STORY WRITTEN IN STONE, RIVER AND SKY.

THE GREAT OUTDOORS:

- ◆ **Rafting Adventures:** Let the river guide you through wild canyons and untamed beauty on the Snake and Salmon, where whitewater meets white linen with gourmet meals and local wines served between rapids. For those craving remoteness, paddle the Payette, Salmon or Bruneau Rivers to secret hot springs and ancient archaeological sites.
- ◆ **Chase Waterfalls:** Northern Idaho's temperate rainforest climate means lush trails, mossy rainforests and cascading waterfalls around every bend. Boardwalk paths make Snow Falls and Copper Falls easy to access, while short hikes with big payoffs reward you with breathtaking scenery and fewer crowds at Granite Falls, Myrtle Falls and Grouse Creek Falls.
- ◆ **Kayak the Scenic Route:** A paddler's dream, glide around Ritter Island at Thousand Springs State Park, float through the crystal-clear Blue Heart Springs in the Snake River Canyon or kayak beneath the towering spray of Shoshone Falls, the Niagara of the West.

Dig through the prehistoric past at Hagerman Fossil Beds National Monument, where saber tooth cats and ancient horse fossils come to life. Trek the otherworldly landscapes of Craters of the Moon National Monument. Bike the sky-high train trestles of the Route of the Hiawatha, an engineering marvel built into forested peaks. Or find a quiet moment of reflection at glacier-carved Priest Lake State Park.

If you are looking for more vibrant experiences, join the celebration in Ketchum for the quirky, crowd-favourite Trailing of the Sheep Festival, where a parade of woolly locals meanders Main Street. Sway to the sound of eclectic beats at Treefort Music Fest in Boise or get your pulse racing at the high-octane Salmon River Jet Boat Races in Riggins.

SMALL-TOWN CHARM

Stay at a Lodge Accessible Only by Water

Tucked deep in Idaho's Frank Church – River of No Return Wilderness, China Bar Lodge near Riggins is truly off the map — reachable only by jet boat or river float.

Tour Mines By ATV

Explore Idaho by ATV on a self-guided ride through Mackay Mine, near Mackay. The remnants of boomtown life are set against a rugged backdrop of the Lost River Mountain Range.

Get Lost in a Ghost Town

Just outside Lava Hot Springs, the pioneer town of Chesterfield offers a rare glimpse of life on the frontier, with over 20 original structures listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

RELAX & UNWIND:

- ◆ **Dark Sky Dinners:** Experience stargazing like never before at the country's first International Dark Sky Reserve. Winter nights unfold under a glass-roofed greenhouse at the Sawtooth Botanical Garden, where constellations and culinary creations share the spotlight as part of its gourmet dinner series.
- ◆ **Sunrise Hot Air Balloon Rides:** Take dawn patrol to new heights as you catch first light while floating above Idaho's Teton Valley in a hot air balloon. The Teton Mountains are magical as sunrise stretches across the peaks with just the wind as your compass.
- ◆ **Wintery Soaks:** Snowmobile through frosted forests to Burgdorf Hot Springs, an off-the-grid getaway only accessible by snowmobile in winter that's definitely worth the chill. Nestled deep in the Idaho backcountry, these rustic log-sided pools offer steamy solace under snow-dusted pines to a soundtrack of bubbling geothermal water and the crunch of fresh powder.

NORTH DAKOTA

IN NORTH DAKOTA, HISTORY LIVES THROUGH GENERATIONS OF TRADITION.

Stories of the Northern Plains are woven into the land and carried forward by the communities who bring them to life, blending cultural roots with a strong sense of place. It's a state that celebrates a sacred past with reverence and connection, while forging a future with purpose and intention.

From the bluffs of the Missouri River to the sweeping prairies and woodlands that stretch to the Canadian border, the legends of North Dakota are anchored by the legacy of the first people layered within the footsteps of explorers like Lewis and Clark. In the Lakota language, "Dakota" means "ally," and that spirit of hospitality invites you to explore with respect, kinship and a deep sense of curiosity.



RELAX & UNWIND:

- ◆ **International Peace Garden:** Straddling the U.S. and Canadian border, this 930-hectare floral sanctuary is a symbol of harmony. With more than 100,000 blooms, quiet walking paths weave past reflective pools, sunken gardens and peaceful prairie beauty.
- ◆ **Lake Metigoshe State Park:** Nestled in the Turtle Mountains, this serene year-round escape offers tranquil lake views, cosy cabins and outdoor activities that connect you to nature – from paddling and hammock lounging in the warmer months to a snowy playground come winter.
- ◆ **Maah Daah Hey Trail System:** Named from the Mandan language meaning "an area that has been or will be around for a long time," this legendary trail system winds through the ancestral lands of the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara tribes. A favourite for biking, hiking and horseback riding, it offers sweeping views and a quiet tie to Indigenous culture – perfect for those who find balance in movement and meaning.

HIGHLIGHTS

Teddy's Legacy

Set in the rugged heart of the Badlands, Medora blends frontier charm with bold vision as it prepares to unveil the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library in 2026. More than a museum, the library is designed to showcase what we can learn from – not just about – the 26th American president. Its ambitious, architecturally striking design is meant to work with, not against, the landscape, a reflection of Roosevelt's enduring conservation legacy.

Peak Solitude

28,300 hectares of unspoiled Badlands beauty – Theodore Roosevelt National Park is a dramatic blend of painted canyons, prairie dog towns and free-roaming bison spread across three distinct park units. Hike remote ridgelines, watch wild horses graze, see the night sky unfold and connect with nature on your own terms.

Small-Town Charm, Big-Time Character

In Fargo, you'll find a thriving arts scene, inventive dining and a playful culture that flips Midwest stereotypes on their head. In Bismarck, the state capital, history and modernity converge along the Missouri River and museums, public art and prairie skies invite exploration.

MUST-HAVE ADVENTURES:

- ◆ **North Dakota Heritage Center & State Museum:** The state's largest museum in Bismarck features an extensive collection of exhibits on the area's tribal nations with artefacts, storytelling and immersive displays that highlight the heritage and resilience of the area's past and present Native culture.
- ◆ **The Killdeer Mountain–Four Bears Scenic Byway:** This route spans just over 102 km through western North Dakota and winds past dramatic Badlands, Lake Ilo, Killdeer Mountain battlefield and Little Missouri State Park. The byway highlights Native American heritage and ends at the Crow Flies High overlook, offering breathtaking views of Lake Sakakawea and the Missouri River breaks.
- ◆ **On-A-Slant Village at Fort Abraham Lincoln State Park:** Step into the world of the Mandan people at a fully reconstructed village, where six full-scale earthlodges offer a powerful window into pre-colonial life on the Northern Plains. Where the land meets the Missouri River, the site is part of a larger state park that includes interpretive tours led by living history guides and a meaningful connection to Indigenous communities.





SOUTH DAKOTA

GREAT FACES, WILD SPACES. THIS IS SOUTH DAKOTA.

HIDDEN GEMS:

- ◆ **The World's Only Corn Palace:** A whimsical roadside attraction in Mitchell, this Moorish-style marvel is adorned with intricate murals made entirely from corn, native grasses and grains. Open year-round for curious visitors, the palace truly shines during its annual festival, when it's reimagined with new designs and transformed into a lively celebration of harvest fun.
- ◆ **Minuteman Missile National Historic Site:** A haunting reminder of the Cold War era, this site preserves one of the once-secret missile silos buried beneath the Great Plains. Stand above the launchpad or take a ranger-led tour underground to see one of the 1,000 missiles first-hand.
- ◆ **Palisades State Park:** A geological wonderland known for its striking Sioux quartzite cliffs, hike along rugged trails, paddle the winding curves of Split Rock Creek or get an adrenaline rush rappelling down the park's dramatic rock faces – all set against a backdrop of ancient stone and tranquil prairie.

The horizon stretches endlessly as every turn invites a new kind of adventure. From the granite guardians of the Black Hills to the technicolour canyons of the Badlands, this is a landscape shaped by time – and begging to be explored. With six National Park Service sites, 63 state parks and more than 200,000 square kilometres of terrain, every path leads somewhere extraordinary. Summit Black Elk Peak, paddle glacier-carved lakes or descend into cave systems below Earth's surface. Ride through rolling grasslands on horseback or pitch a tent beneath some of the darkest night skies in the country.

Whether you're chasing adrenaline, stillness or a little bit of both, South Dakota's natural playground is as vast as it is varied. But it's not just for thrill-seekers. Step back in time in Deadwood, trace wagon-wheel ruts along the Oregon Trail, join a tribal celebration or marvel at prehistoric fossils. From jaw-dropping geology to legendary lore, this is the American frontier at its most unforgettable – untamed, unexpected and worth the detour.

Rev Your Engines

Feel the rumble as hundreds of thousands of bikers descend on the Black Hills for the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally – the world’s largest motorcycle festival and a high-octane gathering of music, culture and open-road camaraderie.

Witness the Great Bison Roundup

Watch in awe as cowboys and riders thunder across the plains, driving a herd of 1,300 bison during the Custer State Park Buffalo Roundup & Arts Festival in a dramatic display of Old West tradition.

Celebrate Wild West Heritage

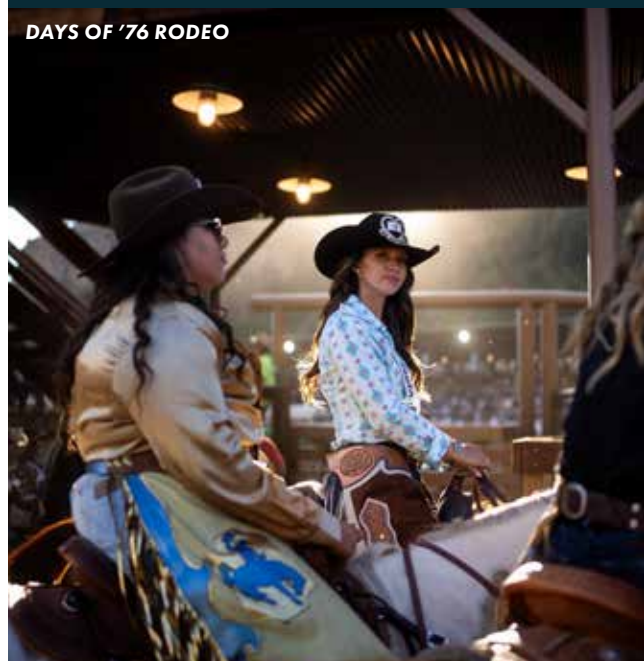
The Days of '76 Rodeo brings five days of high-energy rodeo action and frontier-style revelry to historic Deadwood, honouring the town’s Gold Rush roots with bull riding, parades and pageantry.

MUST-HAVE ADVENTURES:

- ◆ **Mount Rushmore National Memorial:** Carved into the granite cliffs of the Black Hills, Mount Rushmore honours four presidents who helped define the American dream – Washington, Jefferson, Roosevelt and Lincoln – each representing a chapter in the nation’s birth, growth, development and preservation. Walk the Presidential Trail for close-up views, then step into the Sculptor’s Studio to learn about the vision behind immortalising history in stone.
- ◆ **Crazy Horse Memorial:** This staggering Black Hills landmark pays tribute to the spirit and legacy of the Native nations. Still a work in progress, it’s the world’s largest mountain carving in the making – an awe-inspiring testament of pride and resilience. The most memorable time to visit is during the biannual Volksmarch, one of the only times the public can hike up the outstretched arm of the mountain itself.
- ◆ **Wind & Jewel Caves:** Venture below the Earth’s surface to explore two of the world’s longest cave systems. Wind Cave National Park shelters delicate boxwork formations found almost nowhere else on the planet, while Jewel Cave National Monument shimmers with crystalline chambers of calcite splendour.

Crazy Horse Memorial®, located north of Custer, South Dakota, is a great attraction for everyone. Home to the world's largest mountain-carving-in-progress, a year-round visitor complex, gift shop with American-Indian-made and one-of-a-kind souvenirs, plenty of free parking, and a restaurant and snack shop offering a wide variety of mouth-watering specialties – including a local favourite, buffalo stew. Explore the extensive museum, cultural centre and sculptor's studio home. Enjoy special events and Native American performers in season.

Experience an active indoor paleontological dig site and museum at **The Mammoth Site** of Hot Springs, where you will travel back in time to the late Ice Age. Walk the edges of a sinkhole that boasts the largest concentration of Columbian mammoths in the world at one of only two accredited museums in the Black Hills. You'll see where Columbian and woolly mammoths as well as over 87 other species became trapped, leaving an ancient treasure trove of fossil remains. Enjoy hands-on learning and ongoing scientific research and STEAM education. Named 2025 Tripadvisor Travelers' Choice award winner and Best Museum in the Black Hills 3 years in a row.

AMERICA'S 250TH BIRTHDAY IS MORE THAN A MILESTONE — IT'S A MOMENT TO CELEBRATE IN PLACES THAT EMBODY THE NATION'S SPIRIT. FEW DESTINATIONS CAPTURE THAT BETTER THAN RAPID CITY, WHERE PRESIDENTIAL HISTORY, WESTERN HERITAGE, AND BREATHTAKING LANDSCAPES COME TOGETHER TO SHOWCASE REAL AMERICA — RIGHT HERE IN RAPID CITY, SOUTH DAKOTA.

Rapid City is an unexpected treasure nestled in America's heartland, surrounded by the allure of the **Black Hills** and rugged **Badlands**. For centuries, these lands have drawn seekers of solace and adventure, offering a connection to nature that feels otherworldly. The area is rich in history, where the heritage and the spirit of the Old West blend with modern life.

Giant concrete dinosaurs have been straddling the city skyline and capturing traffic heading to **Mount Rushmore** since 1936. **Life-sized bronze statues of American Presidents** decorate downtown streets next to charming facades of historic buildings filled with shopping and restaurants. Look closely at each pose in "The City of Presidents", you'll be surprised how well local artists have depicted their time in office. History continues at the **Berlin Wall exhibit**, paying homage to the local Air Force Base's role in the Berlin Airlift. Nearby, the **Stratobowl** marks the onset of the Space Age. Visit in September for an annual balloon launch from the centre of the stunning bowl-shaped limestone cliffs.

Take part in other forms of celebration at the **Black Hills Powwow** or the **Black Hills Stock Show & Rodeo®** – two iconic events that represent the diverse culture of the region. Western culture can also be found at a **Fort Hays chuckwagon and live music variety show**, situated next to the 'Dances with Wolves' film set. Along the same stretch of road also lies a diverse assortment of wildlife, from exhilarating **gator shows** at the **world's largest reptile zoo** to a **drive-through park** inhabited by with free-roaming North American wildlife such as black bear, elk, mountain lion. DEVILS TOWER NATIONAL MONUMENT

HIGHLIGHTS:

- ❖ **Devils Tower National Monument:** America's first national monument, Devils Tower rises nearly 400 metres above the Belle Fourche River – an unmistakable landmark carved by volcanic forces and shaped by centuries as a sacred geological wonder. Revered by Indigenous cultures and beloved by climbers, its iconic silhouette has inspired generations of travellers.
- ❖ **Medicine Wheel Historic Site:** Perched high in the Bighorn Mountains, this ancient Native American ceremonial site is shrouded in mystery and meaning, composed of carefully placed stones steeped in spiritual significance. Framed by sweeping alpine views, it is a place of prayer, reflection and reverence.
- ❖ **Wild Horses and Mustang Tours:** An iconic glimpse into the unbridled spirit of the West, Wyoming's wild horses roam free across vast, rugged landscapes like Pilot Butte and the McCullough Peaks. Embark on a guided tour or self-drive adventure for a rare, awe-inspiring encounter with these majestic creatures in their natural habitat.

A hidden gem in western Wyoming, Fossil Butte National Monument is home to some of the best-preserved fossils in the world, where ancient fish, indigenous plants and prehistoric reptiles tell the story of an ecosystem frozen in time.

Soak Your Cares Away

Nestled in the charming town of Thermopolis, the free therapeutic mineral pools of Hot Springs State Park offer a rejuvenating escape after a day of adventure as you unwind to a backdrop of roaming bison, sweeping mountain views and seasonal flower gardens.

Rock and Reel

Straddling the Wyoming-Utah border, Flaming Gorge is a high-desert playground where towering red rock cliffs meet brilliant blue-green waters. Beloved for boating, fishing, kayaking and soaking up the sun, this scenic reservoir delivers both adrenaline and awe. Whether you're casting a line, cruising the lake or simply taking in the views, it's home to some of the most striking landscapes in the state.
