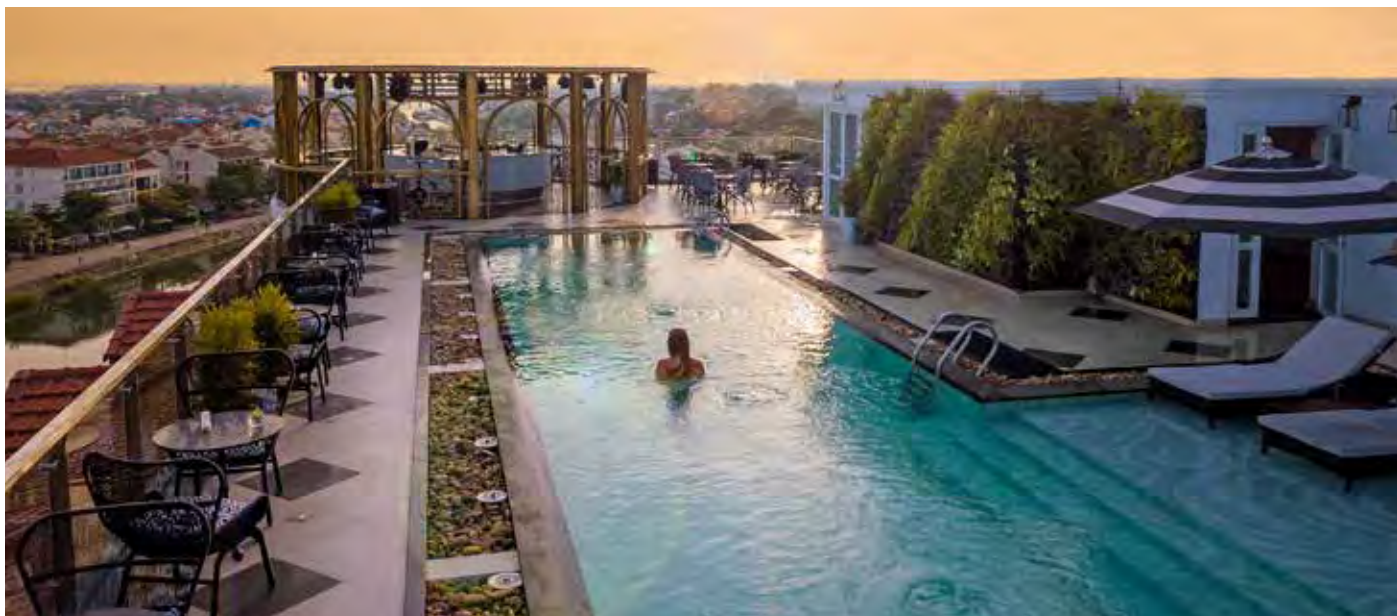
To give you flexibility, our tours are planned without international flights. However if you would like us to organise your flights we would be happy to do so, and we will only use reputable airlines.

Accommodation in Asia

Wildlife

With so many of Asia's wild animals under threat, we support every endeavour that seeks to keep endangered species from the brink of extinction. Most countries have a programme of conservation and have created national parks in order to protect the country's natural habitats. It is gratifying to be able to report a rise in the numbers of Royal Bengal tigers and Asiatic one-horned rhino in recent years, causes we have supported throughout the years.

Waterharvest

This non-profit organisation helps provide safe drinking water in rural villages in Rajasthan & Gujarat. In 2018, TransIndus pledged five WaterHarvest systems to provide safe, clean, sustainable water for five families in the Barmer area of Rajasthan. We chose this pledge because we wanted to make a difference to the destination that has given the company and its guests so much. We also wanted to help protect its delicate rural community.

And at our annual Summer Garden Party in 2019, thanks to the generous donations of our guests, we raised £287 through a charity raffle prize draw. TransIndus matched this money raised for a total donation of £575 to WaterHarvest.

The Jaipur Virasat Foundation

The Jaipur Virasat Foundation (JVF) is a charitable trust, set up in September 2002 to conserve Jaipur's heritage, and brings together traditional arts and craft skills with modern market requirements to generate employment. Popularly known as the Golden Triangle, this tour takes in the most popular sights of the country and is a true introduction to India. Start in the city of Delhi with the tree-lined boulevards of Lutyen’s New Delhi and the hustle and bustle of the Old City. Move on to Agra to admire one of the most iconic and beautiful buildings in the world, the Taj Mahal, as well as the impressive Agra Fort with its Diwan-i-Am & Diwan-i-Khas (halls of public and private audience) and lastly, the Pink City of Jaipur, with its stately forts, sprawling palaces and colourful bazaars.



Itinerary

Day 1: Delhi

Greeted on arrival in Delhi and transferred to the Suryaa Hotel or similar for two nights. The remainder of the day is at leisure, with a welcome dinner at a local restaurant in the evening.

Day 2: Delhi

Explore Delhi starting with a tour of Old Delhi with a cycle rickshaw ride through Chandni Chowk and visits to Jama Masjid, Raj Ghat. After lunch, drive past Lutyen's Delhi and visit the tomb of Humayun and the lofty Qutab Minar.

Day 3: Delhi - Agra

Drive to Agra (4-5 hours) for an overnight stay in the Grand Mercure or similar. In the afternoon visit Agra Fort, the tomb of Itamudud- Daula and enjoy a heritage walk of Agra.

Day 4: Agra - Jaipur

Visit the Taj Mahal at sunrise and returning to your hotel for breakfast before continuing to Jaipur (6-7 hours). Enroute visit Emperor Akbar's abandoned City of Fatehpur Sikri and the impressive Chand Baori step well at Abhaneri. Stay at Shahpura House or similar for three nights.

Day 5: Jaipur

Visit the hilltop fort of Amber and its sparkling Mirror Palace. Later, visit the City Palace including the museum, Jantar Mantar astronomical observatory and the Hawa Mahal.

Day 6: Jaipur

Day at leisure or take one of our optional excursions. This evening enjoy a colourful cultural performance and dinner at an ethnic restaurant.

Day 7: Jaipur - Delhi

Drive back to Delhi this afternoon (5 hours) for an overnight stay at Heritage Village Manesar or an airport hotel.

Day 8: Delhi

Transfer to the airport for your onward flight.

Suggested Extensions

Ganges at Varanasi - 2 nights

Day 7: Jaipur - Varanasi

Transfer to the airport for a short flight to Varanasi. Transfer to the Radisson Hotel for two nights.

Day 8: Varanasi

Varanasi is the oldest continuously inhabited places on earth. Streams of Hindu worshippers still come here today to bathe in the sacred waters. Enjoy a peaceful early morning boat ride on the Ganges. The afternoon is spent visiting Sarnath, the site of Buddha's first public discourse. In the evening we head back to the Ganges to witness ceremonial worship with oil lamps.

Day 9: Varanasi - Delhi

A midday flight back to Delhi. On arrival, transfer to an airport hotel for the night.

Day 10: Delhi

Transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Golden Temple Amritsar - 3 nights

Day 8: Delhi - Amritsar

Take the early morning Shatabdi Express (6 hr train journey) to Amritsar for a two night stay at Ranjit Vilas. Afternoon at leisure.

Day 9: Amritsar

Visit the Golden Temple complex, one of the holiest shrines of the Sikh faith and Jallianwala Bagh. In the afternoon drive to the Wagah border to see the indulgent joint 'retreat' ceremony of the Indian and Pakistani guard.

Day 10: Amritsar

Fly back to Delhi. On arrival, transfer to an airport hotel for the night.

Day 11: Delhi

Transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Ideal for first time visitors who want to explore a little of India's nature along with the big hitting sights. We start a tour of Old Delhi, including the Jama Masjid and the Red Fort, and explore the bazaars of Old Delhi by cycle rickshaws before driving through Lutyens' Delhi to Humayun's Tomb and head towards the iconic 2000 year Qutab Minar. In Agra we visit the iconic Taj Mahal and Agra Fort. Then we visit the Pink City of Jaipur, with its stately forts, sprawling palaces and colourful bazaars. Lastly, our foray into nature takes us to Ranthambore where we seek out the tiger.



Itinerary

Day 1: Delhi

Greeted on arrival in Delhi and transferred to the The Suryaa or similar hotel for two nights. The remainder of the day is at leisure, with a welcome dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 2: Delhi

Explore Delhi on a full day sightseeing tour. Start with a tour of Old Delhi in the morning: enjoying a cycle rickshaw ride in the bustling lanes of Chandni Chowk followed by a visit to see the Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India, and the Raj Ghat, a memorial built for Mahatma Gandhi, a prominent figure in India's struggle for freedom. In the afternoon, drive past Lutyen's Delhi. Visit the tomb of Humayun and the lofty Qutab Minar, an early Mughal structure made of red sandstone and white marble.

Day 3: Delhi - Agra

Drive to Agra (4-5 hours) for an overnight stay in Grand Mercure or similar. In the afternoon, visit the impressive Agra Fort whose buildings, made of red sandstone and marble, are a mix of Hindu and Islamic architecture followed by a visit to the ornate tomb of Itamud-ud-Daula. Finish the day with a heritage walk of Agra.

Day 4: Agra - Jaipur

Visit the Taj Mahal at sunrise. After breakfast back at your hotel, to Jaipur (6-7 hours) with a stop at Fatehpur Sikri, the red sandstone city built by Emperor Akbar that was abandoned after just 14 years. Closer to Jaipur, stop to see the impressive 9th Century Chand Baori step well at Abhaneri. Stay Shahpura House or similar hotel, for two nights.

Suggested Extensions

Shimla Hills - 4 nights

Day 9: Delhi - Kalka - Shimla

Board the early morning Shatabdi Express to Kalka. Journey onward, on the narrow gauge railway towards Shimla. On arrival, check-in at Radisson Jass Hotel for three nights.

Day 10: Shimla

A morning's sightseeing tour of Shimla includes a visit to the Vice Regal Lodge, Mock Tudor Library and, Jakhu Temple as well as a walk down the busy Mall Road to see the Gaiety Theatre and Christ Church. The remainder of the day is at leisure.

Day 11: Shimla

Your day is at leisure to explore the neighbouring towns of Kufri, Naldhera and Chail or enjoy a walk in the picturesque mountains.

Day 12: Shimla - Delhi

Drive to Kalka to board the Shatabdi Express back to Delhi. Stay overnight at Lemon Tree Premier or similar.

Day 13: Delhi

Transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Day 5: Jaipur

Visit the 17th century hilltop fort of Amber and the sparkling Mirror Palace. In the afternoon visit the City Palace complex including its museum and the 18th century Jantar Mantar astronomical observatory, a UNESCO World Heritage monument. Drive through the busy bazaars for a photo stop at the recently restored Hawa Mahal, one of the most famous buildings in Jaipur.

Day 6: Jaipur - Ranthambore

Drive to Ranthambore National Park this morning. We stay for two nights at Jungle Vilas or similar hotel. Afternoon enjoy a game drive.

Day 7: Ranthambore

Enjoy morning and evening game drives in Ranthambore National Park in search of the elusive Royal Bengal tiger. Other animals include leopard, sloth bear, sambar deer, chital, nilgai, black buck, langur and macaque.

Day 8: Ranthambore - Delhi

Drive back to Delhi this afternoon (5 hours) for an overnight stay at Heritage Village Manesar or an airport hotel. Ranthambore National Park is also renowned for rich birdlife including Indian Gray Horbills, Sandpipers, Eagles, Falcons, Parakeets, Graylag goose, etc.

Day 9: Delhi

Today you will be transferred to Delhi International airport for your onward flight.

Focusing on Rajasthan's royal heritage, including the Taj Mahal and other great monuments of the 'Golden Triangle', this popular two-week tour follows a classic route around northwest India's more regal and opulent locations: from the Mughal wonders and packed bazaars of Delhi to Akbar's ghost city at Fatehpur Sikri, Jaipur (the 'Pink City') and the fairy-tale desert citadel of Jaisalmer. From there, you head across the sandflats to Jodhpur, the 'Blue City' and end the tour beside the shimmering waters of Lake Pichola at Udaipur. Along the way, we spend time in some rural locations and stay in elegant palaces.



Itinerary

Day 1: Delhi

Greeted on arrival in Delhi and transferred to the Suryaa Hotel or similar for two nights. The remainder of the day is at leisure, with a welcome dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 2: Delhi

Explore Delhi on a full day sightseeing tour. Start with a tour of Old Delhi in the morning: enjoy a cycle rickshaw ride in the bustling lanes of Chandni Chowk followed by a visit to Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India, and the Raj Ghat, a memorial built for Mahatma Gandhi, a prominent figure in India's struggle for freedom. Drive through Lutyen's New Delhi in the afternoon. Visit the tomb of Humayun and the lofty Qutb Minar, an early Mughal structure made of red sandstone and white marble.

Day 3: Delhi - Agra

Day 4: Agra - Jaipur

Visit the Taj Mahal at sunrise. Taj is a particularly mesmerising sight at sunrise with the building changing colours as the sun rises. After breakfast back at your hotel, continue to Jaipur with a stop at Fatehpur Sikri, the red sandstone city built by Emperor Akbar that was abandoned after just 14 years. Closer to Jaipur, stop to see the impressive 9th Century Chand Baori step well at Abhaneri. Stay Shahpura House or similar hotel, for two nights.

Day 5: Jaipur

Visit the 17th century hilltop fort of Amber and the sparkling Mirror Palace. In the afternoon visit the City Palace complex including its museum and the 18th century Jantar Mantar astronomical observatory, a UNESCO World Heritage monument. Drive through the busy bazaars for a photo stop at the recently restored Hawa Mahal, one of the most famous buildings in Jaipur.

Day 6: Jaipur - Bikaner

Leave the "Pink City" in the morning and head towards Bikaner. Stay overnight at Narendra Bhawan or similar hotel. Visit the Junagarh Fort and Camel breeding farm in the afternoon.

Day 7: Bikaner - Jaisalmer

Drive west towards the lone city of Jaisalmer, at the edge of Thar desert. The old part of the city was built almost entirely of yellow sandstone, lending to the settlement being affectionately termed "The Golden City". Stay at the Mandir Palace or similar hotel for two nights. In the evening, enjoy cultural performances by local artists.

Day 8: Jaisalmer

In the morning, visit Jaisalmer Fort, which

dominates the local landscape. This impressive structure comprises a maze of alleyways and narrow lanes that lead to various Havelis or merchant homes and Jain temples, all enclosed within the fort. Also visit the Gadisar Tank, once the sole water supply of the city and now a repository of small temples and shrines.

Day 9: Jaisalmer - Manvar

Drive towards Manvar for a desert experience complete with dining under the stars and unwinding as local folk musicians play out the night at the Manvar Sevan Tented Camp. There will also be an opportunity to explore the villages and ancient temples scattered in the desert.

Day 10: Manvar - Jodhpur

Turning eastwards, the morning's drive brings us to 'The Blue City' of Jodhpur. Stay at Balsamand Palace or similar hotel for two nights.

Day 11: Jodhpur

Morning take a jeep safari to nearby villages of Bishnoi tribes. In the afternoon, visit Mehrangarh Fort, one of the most imposing forts in India. Enjoy a panoramic view of the city from one of the ramparts. Later visit Jaswant Thada - the Royal Cenotaphs.

Day 12: Jodhpur - Udaipur

Heading south, traverse the Aravalli Hills to Ranakpur, home of an intricately and painstakingly carved Jain Temple complex. Continue to Udaipur where we stay for two nights at Fateh Niwasl or similar.

Day 13: Udaipur

A morning city tour takes in the City Palace, a complex of 11 palaces, all with intricate stone work and interiors featuring glass mirror and ornamental tile. Also visit Sahelion Ki Bari, the old city and the Jagdish Temple. The afternoon is at leisure to browse through the markets. Enjoy a sunset high tea cruise on the lake in the evening.

Day 14: Udaipur - Delhi

Enjoy a leisurely morning before taking an afternoon flight back to Delhi. The morning is at leisure to explore the bustling markets of Udaipur. In the afternoon, fly to Delhi and transfer to Lemon Tree Premier or similar hotel for an overnight stay.

Day 15: Delhi

Transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Suggested Extension

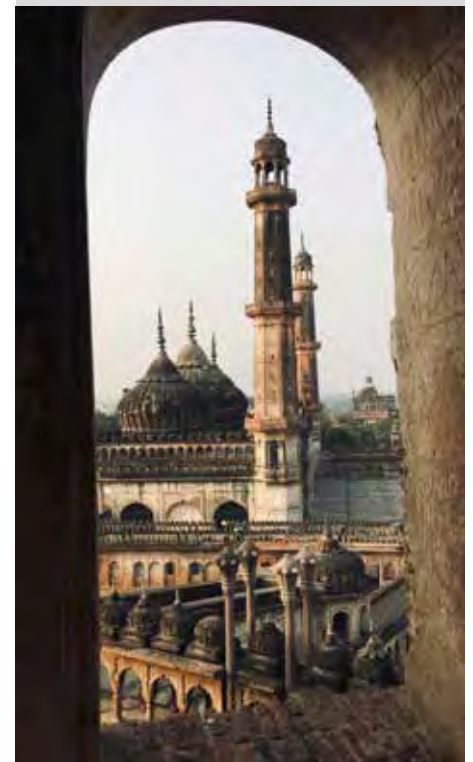

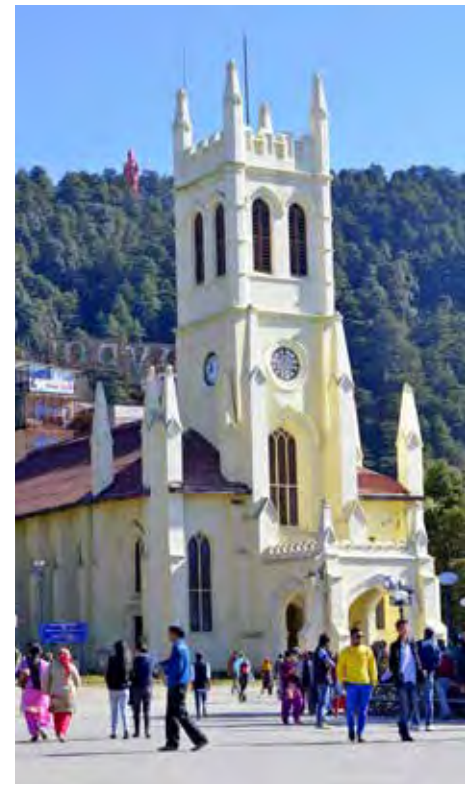

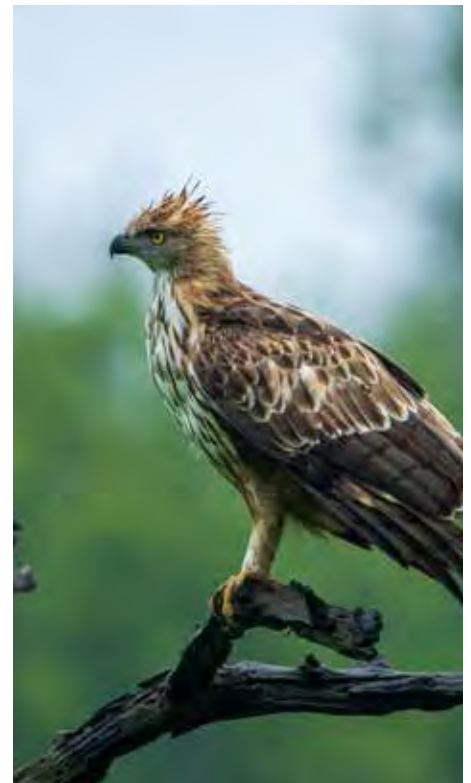

The forest is home to rich birdlife including exotic species like Sri Lankan Blue Magpie and Red faced Malkoha as well as a large variety of mammals, insects, butterflies, reptiles and rare amphibians.

Day 6: Sinharaja - Udawalawe

Another bird watching walk this morning before driving to Udawalawe National Park. Stay for two nights at Centauria Wild or similar. Visit Elephant Transit Home in the afternoon.

Day 7: Udawalawe

Enjoy morning and afternoon safaris in the park. Udawalawe National Park is a wonderful place to

see wild Asian elephants in their natural habitat. The park is home to approximately five hundred elephants. Other wildlife includes sambar deer, water buffalo, jackals and monkeys including the grey langur and the endemic toque macaque. A total of 183 species of birds have been recorded here, some of which are resident and the others, migrant. The endemic Sri Lanka jungle fowl, brown-capped babbler, Malabar pied hornbill and the Sri Lanka spurfowl are all excellent sightings for birdwatchers. Of the water birds, the rare osprey and Indian cormorant are also of note.

Day 8: Udawalawe - Yala

After a leisurely breakfast, drive to Lunugamwehera National Park for a game drive. Drive on to Yala National Park and stay for two nights at Cinnamon Wild or similar.

Day 9: Yala

Enjoy morning and afternoon safaris in Yala Park. One of Sri Lanka's oldest and largest national parks, Yala covers an area of 1500 sq km and has one of the highest densities of leopards in the World. We go on to Pokhara, whose surrounding ridges offer more astounding panoramas, before visiting Chitwan National Park in search of wild rhinos and other rare animals. A final night in Kathmandu, visiting the famous stupa of Swayambhunath.



Itinerary

Day 1: Kathmandu

Greeted on arrival in Kathmandu and transfer to the Nepali Ghar or similar for two nights. The remainder of the day is at leisure. In the evening, enjoy a traditional seven-course dinner at the Bhojan Griha.

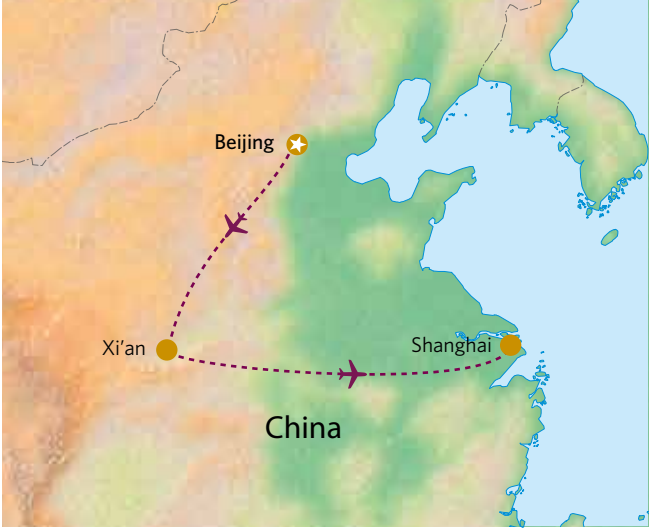

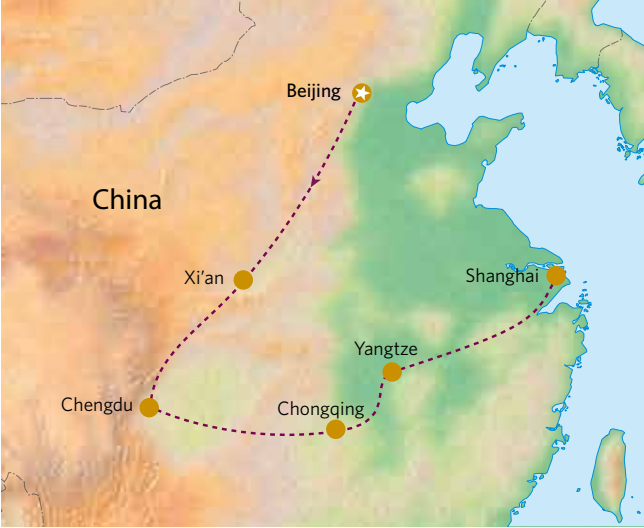

After breakfast, drive to the provincial capital of Dalanzadgad. Visit the South Gobi Museum and the local markets before driving on to Yolyn Am. Explore the nearby area and the gorge on foot to spot wildlife including squirrels, marmots, ibex, argali and birds of prey. Stay overnight Gobi Mirage or a similar ger camp.

Day 6: Khongoryn Els

Drive west to the sand dunes of Khongoryn Els. Stay overnight at Gobi Erdene or similar ger camp. Late afternoon drive to the Singing Dunes, and to climb up for a spectacular view. Visit a camel herder family, experience local hospitality in the family's ger, and there will be an opportunity to saddle up for a Bactrian camel ride.

Day 7: Khavtsgait - Bayanzag

Today, we head back east, stopping at Khavtsgait to explore the petroglyphs. Walk up a rocky outcrop and search the surrounding rocks for ancient engravings that dot the area. After lunch in the small village of Bulgan, drive on to Bayanzag for overnight stay at Gobi Tour ger camp. Later visit the spectacular sandstone formations, known as the Flaming Cliffs due to their deep red hue.



Day 8: Ongiin Khiid

Start the journey north towards Ongiin Khiid, the heartland of Mongolia. Stay overnight at Ongiin Nuut or similar ger camp. Afternoon visit Ongiin Monastery, dating back to 1760.

Day 9: Khujirt - Orkhon Valley

Visit the village of Khujirt en route before arriving at Orkhon Valley - a World Heritage Site. Stay overnight at Talbiun or a similar ger camp. In the afternoon go for a walk or a horse ride to see the Uurtiin Tokhoi Canyon. There is also an option of kayaking in Orkhon River.

Day 10: Orkhon Valley

Drive to Temeen Chuluu to see ancient Bronze Age burial stones. Drive on to Orkhon Waterfalls and stay for two nights at Galaa's Homestay or a similar accommodation.
