I hope you'll join us.

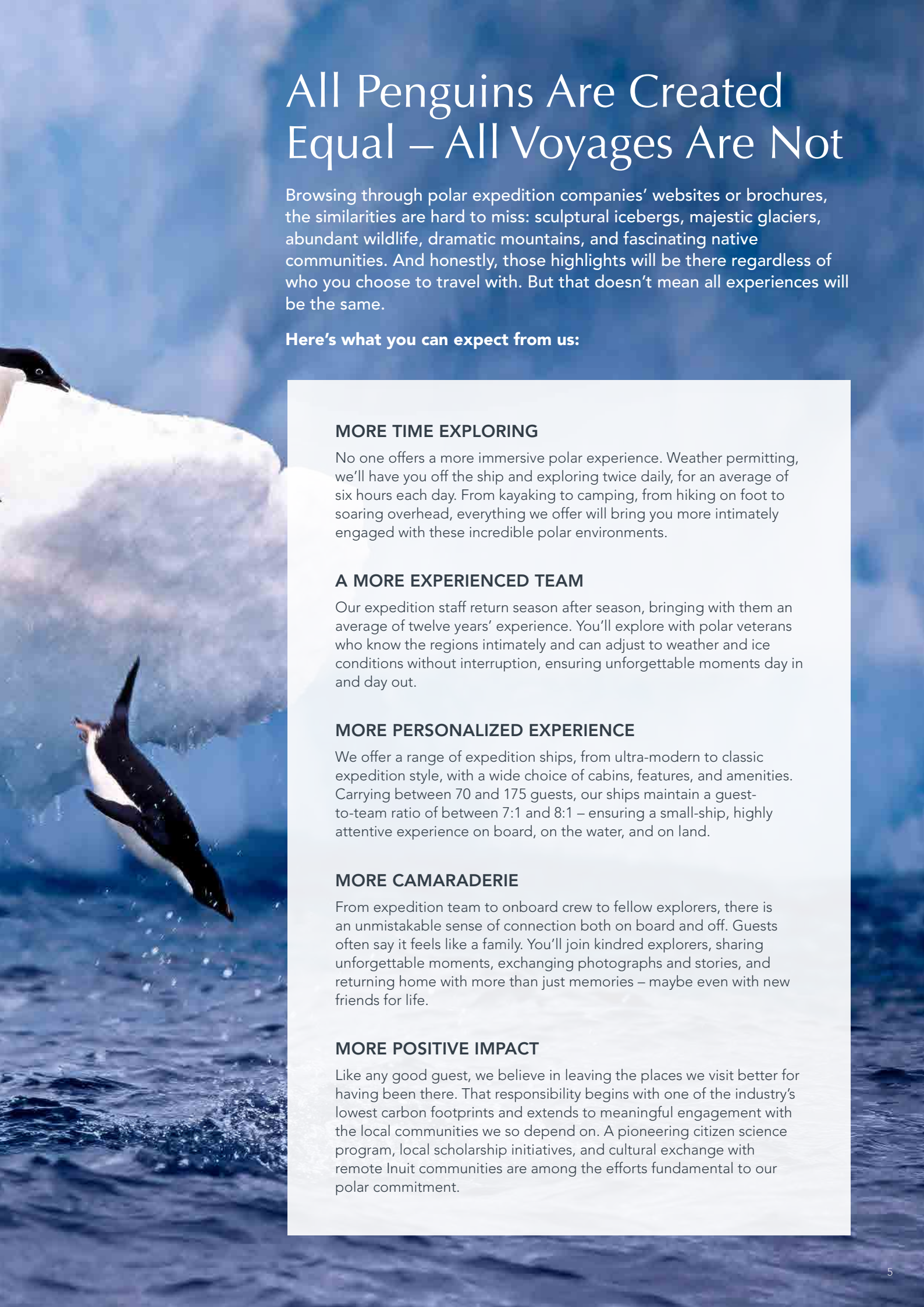

A Responsibility That Extends Well Beyond the Bow of Our Ships

We travel to some pretty amazing places, but we never lose sight of our responsibility to give, and not just take, from the incredible lands and people we so depend on. This responsibility is most acutely felt in Ushuaia, the southernmost city on earth, and our home port for the duration of every Antarctic season. Working with regional schools to develop scholarship and internship programs, engaging with international universities in post-graduate studies related to the polar cruise industry, supporting local, sustainable sources, and a ground team that is 100% Ushuaia-sourced, are some of the ways we're not just in the community, but an active part of it.

That same mutual respect and responsibility continues when we leave port. Visiting Inuit communities in Greenland, we work exclusively with local guides to not only support their livelihoods, but to ensure that we walk their streets and visit their landmarks respectfully. And we engage with local citizens, who volunteer to share their homes and stories with us, creating better understanding between our diverse cultures. Our smaller ships and lower per-passenger carbon footprint are other ways we respect the fragile environments we visit.



Our Ground Team: Always There for You, and for the Local Community

Our unstoppable Ushuaia-based ground team handles a wide array of critical tasks, ensuring every aspect of your pre-voyage experience is managed with care, from airport transfers and hotel check-in to pre-voyage Q&A sessions and getting you to the ship on time and fully prepared. They are the steady presence behind the scenes, anticipating needs, solving problems before they arise, and making sure your journey begins smoothly and confidently.

Deeply rooted in Ushuaia, they are active members of the local community. They partner with regional organizations, support educational and environmental initiatives, and help foster meaningful connections between our guests and the place we call home. Their knowledge of the region, their professionalism, and their genuine warmth reflect the spirit of our expeditions – thoughtful, responsible, and community-minded.





Some of the Community Programs We're Engaged In

CULTURAL EXCHANGE WITH INUIT COMMUNITIES

With a goal of increased understanding between cultures, we often coordinate with communities and their members, who organize intimate cultural events, demonstrations, and home visits, where tea, sweets, and a bit of local lore are shared.

BEACH CLEAN-UP IN USHUAIA

Our ground team works with civic organizations in regularly-scheduled clean-up efforts on local beaches, one of the many ways we participate in local efforts to serve the community.

SUPPORTING RINCONCITO DEL FIN DE MUNDO DE AYUDA Y CONTENCIÓN

We offer support to local women in need, through a range of initiatives, including local events and onboard auctions and raffles to raise money for clothing, food and school supplies for kids.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CHALLENGE WITH ESCUELA JULIO VERNE

In this year-long competition, students competing in teams of two are tasked with creating a presentation that is Antarctica-themed, and judged for both its creativity and scientific insight. The winning team receives an internship on a voyage to Antarctica.

CAREER STUDIES WITH UNIVERSIDAD DE TIERRA DEL FUEGO

In this post-degree program in development with Polar Latitudes Expeditions, students will have an opportunity to apprentice aboard our ships, where they'll learn about career opportunities in the polar cruise industry.

SHIP VISITS

We organize ship visits for a number of local groups, ranging from primary and secondary school students to local authorities, with presentations tailored to their educational needs, career aspirations, and political support.

ENSURING A BRIGHTER FUTURE FOR STUDENTS AND THE POLAR REGIONS

SOI (Students on Ice) is a Canadian nonprofit founded in 1999 that inspires young people through educational expeditions to Antarctica. These transformative journeys empower students to become informed leaders and advocates for a more sustainable future.

More than 4,500 students have participated to date, and many alumni now lead initiatives in business, science, education, and sustainability around the world.

A Pioneering Technology to Discover and Protect our Planet's Most Awe-Inspiring Citizens

A sudden whale sighting is a highlight of any polar voyage. But whale encounters with ocean vessels can put these marvelous creatures at risk. So, in 2024, Polar Latitudes Expeditions teamed up with Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution to implement WhaleSpotter, a first-of-its-kind whale detection system, on our Antarctic-bound voyages. This technology helps us identify whales approaching our immediate area, increasing your likelihood of being amazed; but even more importantly, ensuring that we keep our newest ship, Discoverer, at a safe distance.

A 10-YEAR PARTNERSHIP WITH WOODS HOLE OCEANOGRAPHIC INSTITUTION

WhaleSpotter is just one recent example of how we're partnering with Woods Hole to better understand and protect whales in the Antarctic region. Since 2015, we've been providing Woods Hole scientists with travel and other logistical support, an important part of our overall commitment to integrating science into our immersive travel experience. Another recently formed partnership with Oceanites aids their researchers in efforts to count and track penguin colonies, an important indicator of climate change and wildlife adaptation.

Partnerships like these allow science teams to conduct ongoing research that would otherwise be nearly impossible, while also enriching our guest experience through presentations, discussions, and observing scientific research in action.



Citizen Science: Playing a Part in Meaningful Research

Citizen science is a program we first pioneered in 2015; and in 2021 we became the first polar operator to officially join The Polar Citizen Science Collective, offering citizen science on every Antarctic voyage. Today, our guests support as many as 6 research programs; and into the future, as we expand our reach into the Arctic, North Atlantic and beyond, citizen science will continue to be an integrated part of our overall immersive approach to travel and exploration.

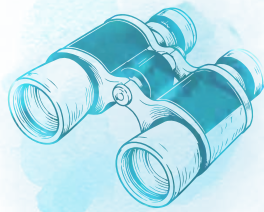
Often cited by guests as a highlight of their voyage, for those who wish to participate, citizen science offers the chance to engage in real, in-the-field data gathering, supporting a range of initiatives and organizations that are working hard on behalf of our beloved planet. This collaboration is critical in remote locations where intensive long-term observation and study would be challenging – if not impossible – by a single organization acting on its own.



How Citizen Science Works

Each citizen science initiative is unique and tailored to the data-collection needs of our research partners, offering a range of ways to engage.

01.



COLLECT

We collect data in any number of ways – through observation, by using a science tool like Secchi Disk, or even by taking photos with our own cameras.

02.



RECORD

We record what we discover, sometimes using an app or tablet, and sometimes by good old fashioned note taking, following strict scientific guidelines.

03.



SHARE

We then share this data with our scientific research partners, adding to an ever-growing body of data points, critical to understanding climate change and its effect.

04.



CONTRIBUTE

With every data point we collect, record and share, we are contributing to a more hopeful future for these magnificent places, and the planet we call home.

Our program is led by highly trained expedition team members, ensuring that our data meets the same standards required of any scientist.

Whether you're on the ship's bow observing seabirds, or on the water measuring phytoplankton, every project offers something fascinating.



Ongoing Projects Making a Difference

COLLECTING DATA FOR THE SOUTH GEORGIA BIG SEAWEED SEARCH

The goal of this project, led by scientists from London's Natural History Museum, is to study the seaweed diversity and distribution in South Georgia, assessing threats from climate change and invasive species.

The data you collect will continue to support future management and conservation of this critical marine environment.

SEABIRD SURVEYS FOR THE CORNELL LAB OF ORNITHOLOGY AND EBIRD

Using the eBird app, this project is building a long-term ecological monitoring program of seabirds in the Southern Ocean and along the Antarctic Peninsula. These recordings help researchers understand how birds use oceanic habitat, to help uncover new details about the lives of these remote species.

Gathering observations from many sources, times and locations creates a comprehensive picture of seabird distribution that was never possible before.

CLOUD OBSERVATIONS FOR NASA GLOBE OBSERVER

By observing and recording cloud cover and type timed to NASA satellite fly-overs, we help scientists understand how surface and air temperature are affected by cloud cover, and how clouds respond to a changing climate.

After nearly 10 years of citizen science observations, scientists can now identify patterns and gain a deeper understanding of clouds in the polar regions, and their impact on the environment.

SECCHI DISK STUDY FOR THE SECCHI DISK FOUNDATION

Secchi depth, a measure of the depth at which you lose water clarity, is an important indicator of the relative abundance of phytoplankton, critical to Antarctica's food chain. Using a Secchi Disk, our citizen scientists record and report findings to The Secchi Disk Foundation in the UK.

Secchi Disk data plays a key role in helping academics and organizations like the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) study global changes in phytoplankton.

ANTARCTIC SNOW ALGAE STUDY

When present, snow algae play a significant role in the local energy balance, since they increase absorption of sunlight by the snow. Evidence suggests that warming Antarctic temperatures may be intensifying snow algae growth.

Data collected in this study will help close data gaps and verify satellite mapping to understand how snow algae respond to a changing climate.

HAPPYWHALE

Like humans, whales are unique and recognizable. Happywhale is an easy-to-use platform that collects photos of these magnificent mammals for photo-ID studies and tracking. By submitting photos, guests contribute invaluable data to support research on how whales are recovering from exploitation, and how they are responding to climate change.

Happywhale has collected tens of thousands of images to date and has been instrumental in creating slow-down zones, protecting whales from ships in Antarctica and South Georgia



When Travel Meets Science, Great Things Happen



Dr. Annette Bombosch is a co-founder of the Polar Citizen Science Collective and our Lead Citizen Science Coordinator. Here are some highlights from a recent conversation with Annette.

Bringing travelers and science together

Back when I was doing my PhD, I could see that some scientists had a bit of an attitude toward travelers – feeling that the polar regions should be a place for science only. But I thought, what if travelers WERE doing science? I love the fact that citizen science accomplishes that.

Doing what researchers alone can't

I know how hard it is for any scientific organization to get data from the polar regions. Maybe you can get there two or three times each season. As an operator, we saw huge potential to help scale this, as we spend entire seasons in the polar regions, allowing for a great deal of data collection. That realization is what inspired the citizen science program.

Citizen science is real science

For this collaborative approach to work, all the data being collected across our multiple ships has to be done in a standardized way. Our citizen scientists are held to the same data-collecting standards as any other scientist. And the guides are highly trained.

Science needs citizens like you

When you're on the water collecting data, you are the only person, in a world of 8 billion people, in that exact spot at that exact moment, getting that information. It may seem like a drop in the bucket, but that data is added to an immense data set that can, over time, impact conservation, legislation, restoration, a lot of things.

A great big thank you from the whales

The work we do makes a real difference: Slow down zones that protect whales from passing ships, phytoplankton data that reveals shifting food supplies, new perspectives on how to study seabirds, and seaweed observations that helped inform the most recent South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands Marine Protected Area Management Plan.

What people love about the program

First of all, it's fun. It's the part of science that every scientist loves: the fieldwork. Guests appreciate the educational component, too, understanding how polar ecosystems are connected to our daily lives. And ultimately, citizen science, and all our science onboard, makes the voyage more meaningful for people.

One final thought

A lot of scientific research happens behind a desk, but we're doing the best part, in some of the most beautiful locations on our planet! What could be better?

A Day at the Poles

There's no 'typical day' in the polar regions – every day brings something new. That is why we love it. Still, here is a little taste of what our guests might experience while exploring the polar regions.

Early Morning

Wake up, surrounded by unique and brand-new landscape. As the morning unfolds, early risers begin to stir for hot coffee and pastries, others to the gym, and a few to the Observation Deck to soak up the view, while the Expedition Team busily prepares the Zodiacs for the day's adventure. Breakfast awaits in the main restaurant, where a generous buffet offers everything you need to fuel your day.

Late Morning

Once breakfast is over, it's time to explore! Activities typically take the form of Zodiac cruises on the water or landings ashore, sometimes in inhabited places such as villages or research stations, but more often in pristine wilderness. For extra variety, optional activities, workshops, and lectures will also be offered.



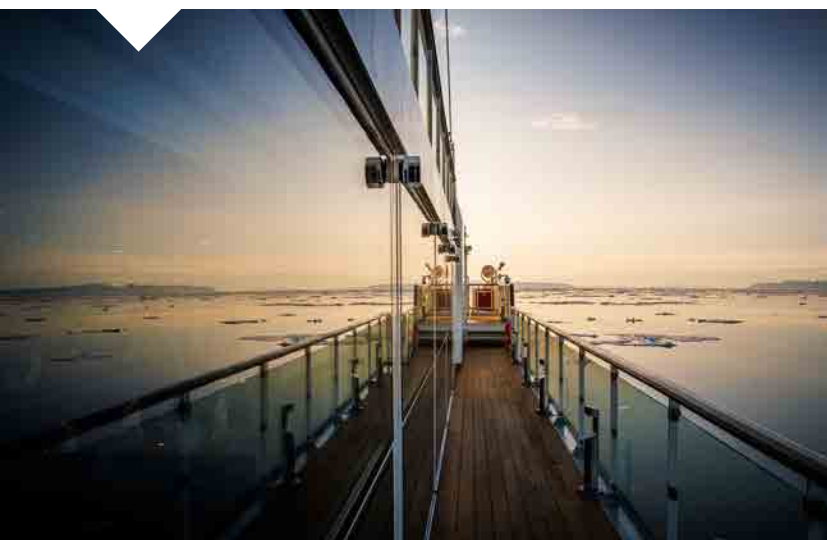
Early Afternoon

After your first exploration, lunch is served in all our dining areas on board, and occasionally on our outer decks. We offer both a la carte and buffet options, with menus changing each day and always including vegetarian, and special dietary options. After lunch, you can relax, soak in the views from our saunas, and slowly get ready for the second adventure of the day!



Evening

Wrapping up the day, you'll attend the Expedition Leader's Recap and Briefing, where you'll learn the next day's plans and highlights from the day. Next, dinner time! Gather with other fellow explorers and bond over delicious, ever-changing cuisine, laughter and shared once-in-a-lifetime experiences. Finally, spend a few hours to relax, before retiring to rest, ready for another day of adventure.



Afternoon

Our Captain has positioned the ship at the next landing site, where guests can once again enjoy a Zodiac cruise and/or a landing to experience the destination up close—perhaps on a longer hike or by meeting locals and learning about polar life.







The Arctic & North Atlantic

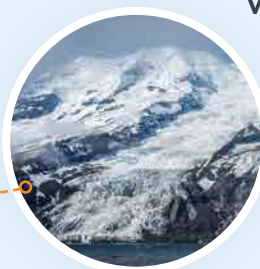

Iceland

When to Travel to Antarctica

While Antarctica is an explorer's dream destination throughout the travel season. Every part of Antarctica's season offers something extraordinary. From the raw, untouched beauty of early November to the golden calm of March, each period reveals a different face of the Peninsula, and a unique range of wildlife activity. Here's how to choose the right time based on your travel style and greatest interest.



Wildlife Enthusiasts

Best time: December to February

These are the liveliest months on the Peninsula. In December, penguin colonies bustle with nesting activity, while January brings the joy of watching fluffy chicks take their first steps. By February, whales arrive in large numbers, especially Humpbacks feeding in calm bays, making it an ideal time for close encounters. If you're drawn to vibrant animal behavior and abundant wildlife, this is your season.



Landscape Photographers

Best time: November & March

Light defines the experience during these months. November offers pristine, snow-covered landscapes beneath soft, dramatic skies, with long shadows and fewer ships in sight. March brings warm, golden tones and deeper contrast as the sun dips lower on the horizon. Both months feel quieter and more atmospheric, with powerful visuals that lend themselves beautifully to storytelling through a lens.



First-Time Explorers

Best time: December & January

Looking to see it all? These mid-season months strike the perfect balance. You'll experience active penguin rookeries, growing chicks, and increasing whale sightings, all while enjoying milder weather, relatively stable seas, and long hours of daylight. Whether it's your first time in Antarctica or your first major expedition anywhere, these months offer an ideal blend of comfort, activity, and wonder.



Whale Lovers

Best time: February & March

Whales are at their most plentiful and active toward the end of the Antarctic season. This is the best time to observe humpbacks feeding in large groups, spot curious orcas near the ice edge, and hear whale blows across calm seas. With quieter waters and fewer ships in the region, these voyages offer exceptional opportunities for close, respectful wildlife encounters and marine photography.
