





The Enlit vision



We ask our community about pressing issues in the industry and combine our insights in an annual industry report.


Why?

- Dedicated interviews get more details







Why do we need to talk about workforce? (1)

- The energy transition could run out of people before it runs out of money
 - YES: 51% of respondents
- Workforce is not keeping up with changing needs of the energy transition



Why do we need to talk about workforce? (2)

83% Believe the lack of a coherent workforce strategy affects Europe's industrial competitiveness

75% Believe that a lack of skills puts at risk the industry's COP28 goal of tripling renewable energy



Key issue: headcount gap

- Recommendations
 - Make recruitment a strategic issue
 - Industry is recruiting with one foot in the past
 - Sell energy careers to the European public
 - Industry has not been vocal about the transition's career opportunities
 - Inspire the next generation of the energy workforce
 - Industry does not attract enough new entrants
 - Tackle under representation
 - Industry has a huge gender imbalance
 - Lobby for effective government policies
 - There are no policies to encourage recruitment into the energy transition

58% Of women believe candidates don't know about the energy industry's employment opportunities

Key issue: skills gap

Recommendations

- Improved industry-academia collaboration
 - Misalignment between university syllabuses and industry needs
- New approaches to in-house training
 - The workforce is ageing
- Improve digital skills
 - A lack of leadership on digital
- Promote the importance of manual roles
 - a chronic shortage of manual and technical skills
- Collaborate to help smaller businesses
 - SMBs cannot deploy training at scale
- Governments must play their part too
 - there is no central, guiding hand influencing crosssector collaboration

67% Believe that energy transition skills are not prioritised in Europe's industrial strategy

71% Believe the industry has underestimated the difficulty of gaining the right skills to deploy the energy transition
