



What makes your stand complex?

Complex structures require an additional inspection from our structural engineers. If your structure (ground mounted or rigged) contains any elements below, you must read all the information within the Exhibitor Technical Manual or Contractor Zone to understand your responsibilities and documentation required to make your stand plan submission.

COMPLEX GROUND MOUNTED STRUCTURE

- A double decker stand
- Walling over 4m from ground
- Includes stages and viewing platforms for public use
- Includes sound / lighting towers
- Includes temporary tiered seating
- Includes temporary demountable structures (identified as having input from an engineer or where the design requires structural calculations)
- Includes stairs, staircases, platforms or stages over 600mm high

COMPLEX RIGGING

- Any form of bespoke suspended load
- Any structure not purposefully manufactured to hang
- Has been modified or had any alterations made
- Has had independent eyebolts installed that have not been purchased with the system
- Has any elements added to a frame like lettering
- Proprietary systems or truss which has had timber attached, i.e. battens to fix scrim/material

If you have any queries about complex ground mounted structures or complex rigging, please reach out to the Organisers or their appointed stand plan inspection agency.

Please note that if your ground mounted structures or rigging are found to be complex onsite but was not declared pre-show, you will be subject to onsite inspection fees and review. If the review is deemed unsatisfactory, you will be required to carry out remedial not open to visitors until work is approved out of show opening hours.
