

# REACTION TO REASON

TACTICS FOR DEVELOPING CRITICAL THINKING IN FIRE SERVICE TEAMS

## THE CHALLENGE

In the fire service, we train for action. But not every situation can be solved by following a checklist. When critical thinking is missing, crews:

- Rely too heavily on direction
- Miss warning signs
- Struggle to adapt under pressure
- Make preventable mistakes

Over time, this impacts safety, performance, and culture.

## THE OPPORTUNITY

Critical thinking turns reaction into reason. It equips firefighters and officers to:

- Assess risk quickly and accurately
- Adapt when conditions change
- Solve the right problem, not just the obvious one
- Make sound decisions with limited information

This is what separates compliant teams from capable ones.

## WHAT CRITICAL THINKING REALLY IS

Not more effort. Better judgment. Applying the right level of effort to the right problem at the right time with a clear understanding of impact.

## WHAT LEADERS MUST DO

Critical thinking is built, not assumed. Leaders create it by:

- **Explaining the why** behind decisions
- **Encouraging questions**, not just compliance
- **Using look-backs** to reinforce learning
- **Creating low-risk environments** to build judgment
- **Focusing on root cause**, not surface issues

If leaders do not model it, crews will not develop it.
