Lind & Lime Gin

We set out to create the very definition of what a London Dry Gin should be; to do something very simple, but do it to perfection. With juniper at its core, we use fresh lime peel and a hint of pink peppercorns to create a classic, benchmark expression that is balanced, dry and intensely refreshing.

Produced with 100% organic ingredients.

Distilled with 100% clean electricity.

Packaged with 100% plastic free materials.

ABV: **44%**

Tasting note: The neat spirit has strong aromas of pink peppercorns and juniper and has an incredibly creamy mouthfeel, with strong flavour intensity. Adding tonic releases the lime that has been bound up in the alcohol. This is vibrant and crispy and beautifully balanced with rich juniper and the gentle sweet spice of pink peppercorns.



La Garde Écossaise Champagne

Scotland's famous 'Auld Alliance' with France was forged through centuries of shared values and strategic interests. In the 1420's, 6000 Scottish soldiers, the flower of Scotland's youth, arrived in La Rochelle to fight with the French King Charles VIII against the English. Some of them would go on to fight with Joan of Arc, but most perished in the battle of Verneuil in 1424. Their bravery and service was not forgotten, and the Kings of France would go on to name their personal bodyguard La Garde Écossaise Du Corps Du Roi; the Scottish Bodyguards to the King.

Produced by G. H. Martell - Epernay

ABV: **12%**

Tasting note: The wine has a classic light yellow colour. On the nose, there are aromas of white fruits like peach and apricot, with a gentle citrus note.

On the palate, the delicate ripe stone fruits are there again, with a hint of green apple and the luxurious brioche character that defines a superlative champagne.



Port of Leith Distillery Oloroso Sherry

We sourced this sherry from Bodegas Baron; a very old producer with a very modern outlook. This oloroso wine will be used to season our oak casks for 18 months in Sanlucar de Barrameda before we ship them to Scotland and fill them with spirit.

Edinburgh's Port of Leith was once the epicentre of Scotland's whisky trade. Casks of sherry arriving into the harbour would be decanted into locally manufactured bottles. Whisky merchants then brought up the empty casks to store their spirit in the dozens of warehouses that once lined the shore. They soon discovered that it transformed their spirit and a major innovation in whisky production was born on our doorstep.

Sherry plays a crucial role in defining the character of many of Scotland's best-loved whiskies, and this sherry will define ours. So we thought it should be savoured and enjoyed while we wait for the whisky to mature.

ABV: **17.5**%

Tasting note: Figs and baked apples with hints of brown sugar and toffee on the nose. Medium bodied with a deep, fruity character of prunes and grapes, walnuts and hints of spice.



Port of Leith Distillery Tawny Port

Martha's Family Estate has been producing exquisite Tawny Port in the Douro Valley since the mid 18th century. For much of that time, their wines were sold to merchants in Porto to be bottled under other people's brands.

Our Port of Leith Distillery team couldn't quite believe their taste-buds when they discovered them. This Reserve Tawny has been matured for 6 to 8 years and retains incredibly pure and vibrant red fruit flavours with a beautiful nutty undertone.

Every one of our casks will come from a producer we know and admire. This began with the launch of our Oloroso Sherry in 2018 and continues with our ports; products that are forging enduring relationships.

ABV: **19%**

Tasting note: Despite maturing in oak for 6 to 8 years, this wine has incredibly youthful bright red fruit aromas on the nose. On the pallet, it's medium bodied, with cherries, plums and cassis, as well as gentle nutty notes giving it a delicious and beguiling complexity.



Port of Leith Distillery White Port

At the Port of Leith Distillery we want to produce outstanding single malt Scotch whisky. To do that, we need to find some very special barrels to mature our whisky.

Established in 1727, Martha's Family has specialised in producing the finest, complex ports from the Douro Valley for generations.

This White Port is a field blend of Malvasia fina, Viosinho, Gouveio and Donzelinho grapes. The wine is first fermented on its skins for a week before fortification with 1 part grape spirit to 3 parts wine. It is then matured for an average of 3 years in 10,000 litre old oak barrels.

ABV: 19%

Tasting note: Sweet grapes and vibrant blossom on the nose. On the palate, it has rich flavours of apricots and stone fruits, with a medium intensity and body.
