Made of weatherproof neoprene, this ingenious top-loader is both enviably chic and practical. It has an adjustable telescopic handle, a lockable laptop compartment, handy side pockets and meets most airline cabin requirements too - not to mention that rollerblade wheels are designed to support the weight of a human, so you won't find anything sturdier on the market.

But that's not all, most of us carry around the equivalent of at least two house bricks (2.5kg+) on a daily basis and that's not good for our shoulders, backs or posture. A bag, carried by hand or over the shoulder, should ideally be no more than 1kg, any heavier and our bodies start to suffer.
