## SENSORY SENSITIVITY ACCOMMODATIONS

For neurodivergent attendees who may experience sensory sensitivity, we provide clipon badges as an alternative to traditional lanyards, which can sometimes feel overstimulating. This initiative ensures that all participants can feel comfortable and fully included during the event.

## **QUIET SPACE**

A Quiet Room is available at the London Vet Show in S8 Upper, providing attendees with a much-needed sanctuary from the bustling atmosphere. This dedicated space offers a safe retreat for anyone feeling overwhelmed or overloaded by the event environment, allowing individuals to step away from the noise, reduce sensory overload, enhance their wellbeing, and return to the show when they feel ready. The Quiet Room is a calm, welcoming space designed for relaxation and recharge, featuring dimmed lighting and comfortable seating. Open to all attendees, it is available in S8 Upper on November 14, 2024, from 8:15 AM to 6:00 PM, and November 15, 2024, from 8:15 AM to 5:00 PM.
