| 01 | Start with the challenge | Make the challenge, decision or opportunity clear in the title and description. |
| 02 | Bring evidence | Case studies should include context, the approach taken, the choices made and the result. |
| 03 | Share what was learned | We welcome honest accounts of what changed, what failed or what proved harder than expected. |
| 04 | Match the level to the audience | Be clear whether the session is a leadership discussion, technical deep dive or broadly accessible case study. |
| 05 | Keep it practical | Sponsored session proposals are strongest when they include a customer, a real project or independently supported implementation evidence. |

- Enterprise data integration and interoperability
- Knowledge platforms, RAG and semantic search

- Electrical systems, transformers, power quality and redundancy
- Building controls, automation and commissioning
- Modular construction, digital design and faster delivery
- Physical security and convergence with operational technology

BEST SUITED TO THIS STREAM

Current projects with technical specificity, measured results and clear design choices. *Generic product showcases or strategy-only presentations are less suitable.*

APPLIED / PRACTITIONER

Sustainable & Resilient Data Centre Operations

AUDIENCE

Operators, facilities teams, sustainability leaders, supply-chain partners, owners, occupiers and professionals entering the sector.

FOCUS

How do we operate it efficiently over its lifetime?

Explore how operators are improving efficiency, resilience and sustainability in live facilities.

TOPIC CLUSTERS

- Energy and water efficiency
- Predictive maintenance and automation
- Operational resilience and business continuity
- Supply-chain resilience, skills and workforce
- Asset lifecycle management and retrofit

BEST SUITED TO THIS STREAM

Cross-functional cases showing how technical and sustainability choices affect the running or improvement of a facility, without becoming a deep engineering session.
