3. Involvement of senior political leadership by Letters of Intent (LOIs) signed by Defence Ministers.

4. Support from various actors across the NATO ecosystem.

Benefits of capability delivery through HVPs

- Sharing development/operational/maintenance costs;
- Increased purchasing power/economies of scale;
- Access to otherwise unaffordable capabilities;
- Sharing knowledge and expertise;
- Improving interoperability by harmonizing requirements;
- Enduring support from NATO staff;
- Continuous high-level attention through the CNAD due to LOis signed at Defence Ministers' level;

Allies and invitees join forces to develop NATO's future capabilities

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

Ministers from 25 Allied nations, plus Finland and Sweden, came together today (15 February 2023) to sign new major commitments to jointly develop and procure systems securing NATO's access to cutting edge technology. Progress is being made in a range of areas, including Ground-based Air Defence, Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear Defence, and Mobility/ Counter Mobility.





MOB/CMOB HVPs





Multinational delivery of various **MILENG vehicles and systems** (e.g. armoured engineering vehicles, breaching vehicles, mine clearing line-charges, unmanned engineering vehicles etc.).



MOB/CMOB Specialist Groups

Informal working groups established by the three MOB/CMOB LOIs.

- 1. Gap Crossing Specialist Group
- 2. Counter-mobility Specialist Group
- 3. MILENG Vehicles and Systems Specialist Group

How do the MOB/CMOB HVPs work?

1. INFORMATION SHARING

Sharing relevant information on national MILENG capability delivery plans (assets to be delivered, quantities, delivery target dates, key requirements).




2. EXPLORING COOPERATION OPPORTUNITIES

Cooperation opportunities are created if two or more nations are potentially interested in the acquisition of a given equipment. Three are currently 20 cooperation opportunities.



3. IDENTIFYING THE MOST PROMISING COOPERATION OPPORTUNITIES

The most promising cooperation opportunities are identified based on the maturity of the interested nations' capability delivery plans and the extent of overlap among national plans in terms of key requirements and planned delivery target dates. There are <u>currently 8 such cooperation opportunities</u>.



5. LAUNCH AND EXECUTION

National decisions on launching the capability delivery project carried out by NSPA or through a lead nation model.



If interested nations confirm their readiness to take forward a promising cooperation opportunity, the opportunity enters the preparation phase. More detailed set of requirements, roadmap, cost calculation, arrangement(s) covering legal, management and financial aspects, and securing national funds. There are <u>currently 3 capability delivery activities in preparation phase.</u>






Multinational capability deliveries under preparation





Potential multinational procurement through NSPA.

First draft of the project mandate has been created. Further coordination is required before commitments.



Multinational delivery of logistic bridges

Creating a flexible framework enabling the participating nations to ensure the availability of bridges through various delivery methods, supported by NSPA:

- multinational procurement;
- rent/lease;
- availability contract.



Multinationalization of the Universal Floating Bridge Adapter (UFBA) project

The aim is to facilitate the US-led development of UFBA by leveraging contributions from other nations/NATO and support from NSPA.

Permanent multinational framework for the enduring provision of MILENG assets

Creating a permanent **one-stop-shop** for delivering MILENG capabilities in a multinational way.

This framework will eventually **replace the MOB/CMOB Specialist Groups**.

As the most promising candidate for this new framework, the creation of a MILENG Project Group under the NSPO Operational Logistics Support Partnership (OLSP) is under preparation.

Once the framework is established, participating nations will benefit from NSPA staff dedicated to the enduring exploration, identification and preparation of MILENG-related multinational cooperation opportunities.



Key Takeaways

• The three **MOB/CMOB HVPs** were launched through the signature of LOIs in the margins of the NATO Defence Ministerial Meeting in February 2023.



• A number of **specific cooperation opportunities have been identified** and developed further in the first year.



- Three potential cooperation activities are already under preparation, and further promising opportunities are expected to enter the preparation phase in 2024.
- Further Allies and NATO partners are invited to consider joining the initiatives through addendums to the LOIs.
