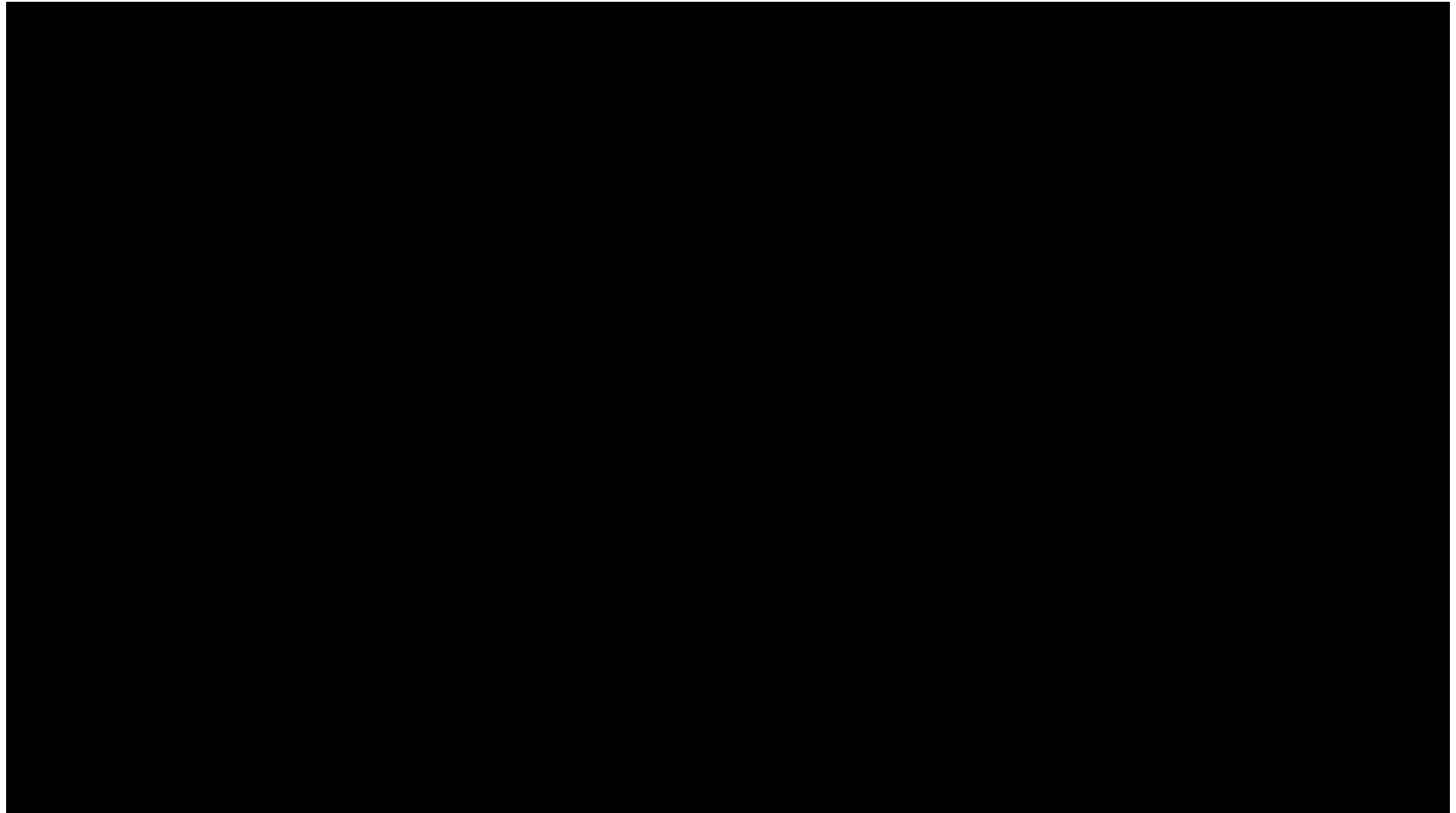

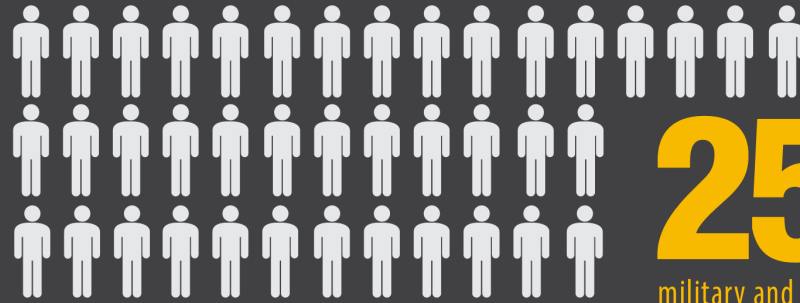

6 MAJOR SUBORDINATE COMMANDS

• DLA AVIATION

Manages the supply chain for aviation weapons systems repair parts, flight safety equipment, maps, consumable hardware, environmental products and industrial plant equipment.

• DLA TROOP SUPPORT

Manages the supply chains for food, textiles, construction material and medical supplies and equipment, including pharmaceuticals.

• DLA DISPOSITION SERVICES

Disposes of excess property by reutilization, transfer and demilitarization; conducts environmental disposal and reuse.

• DLA LAND AND MARITIME

Manages the supply chain for ground-based and maritime weapons systems repair parts, consumable hardware, small arms parts and fluid-handling systems.

• DLA ENERGY

Manages the supply chain for petroleum and lubrication products, alternative fuel and renewable energy, aerospace energy; provides fuel quality and technical support, fuel card programs and installation energy services.

• DLA DISTRIBUTION

Provides storage and distribution solutions and management, transportation planning and management, logistics planning and contingency operations; operates a global network of distribution centers.

The agency's primary liaison to U.S. Central Command and U.S. Special Operations Command, providing a unified DLA interface for warfighters throughout the area of responsibility.

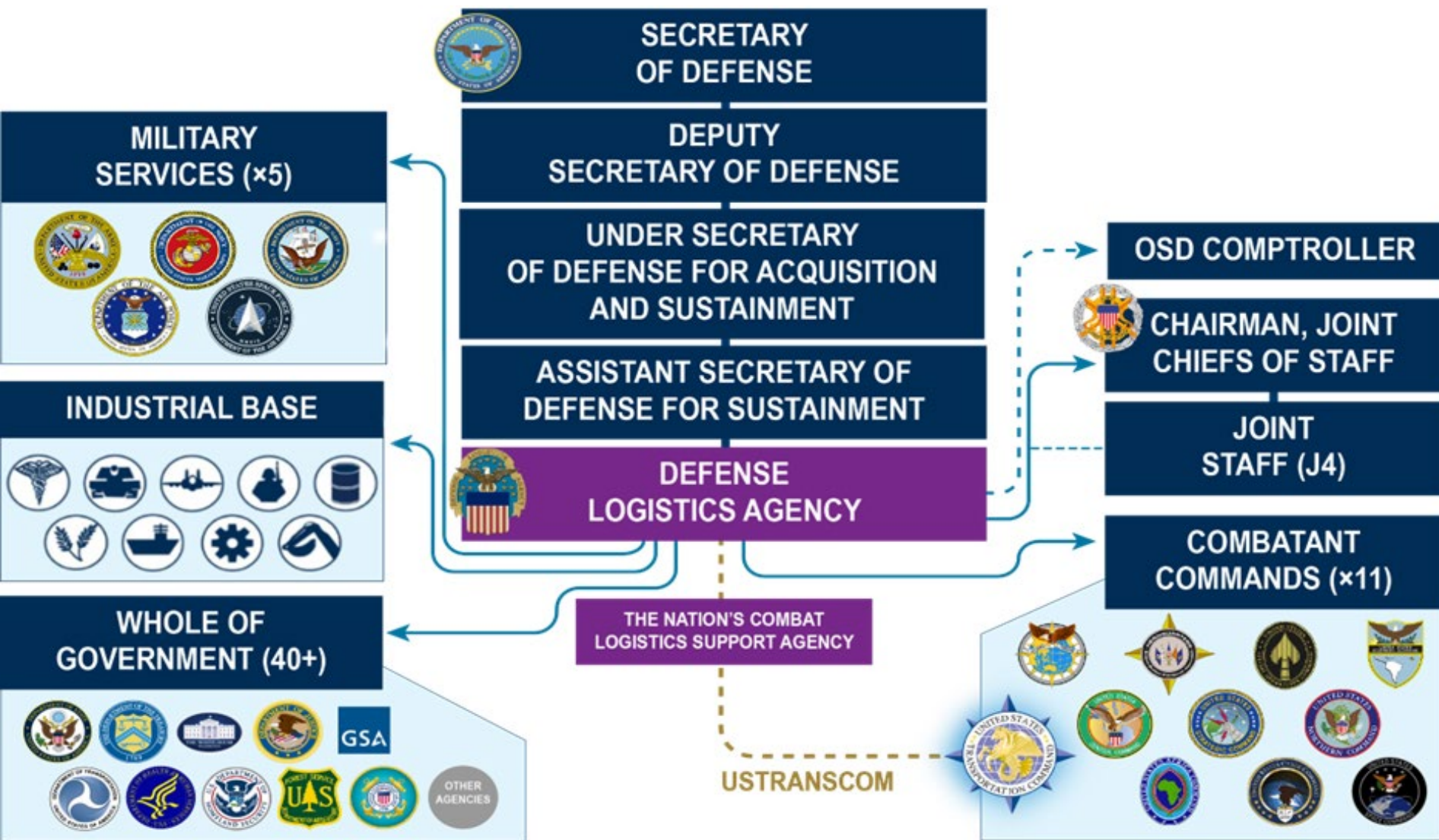
DLA INDO-PACIFIC

DLA Support Organizations

Nuclear and Space Enterprise Support Office:

Synchronizes the agency's efforts and resources to ensure responsive material support to the DOD Nuclear Enterprise, DOD Space Enterprise, and its strategic warfighters.

Strategic Materials: Acquisition, storage, sale, recycling and conversion of the critical raw materials operation and oversight of the national defense stockpile.

Enterprise IT solutions: Develop, deliver and sustain a full range of combat support IT solutions and data services for DLA and DOD to include document management, research and development and infrastructure/software as a service/cloud.

Office Device Management

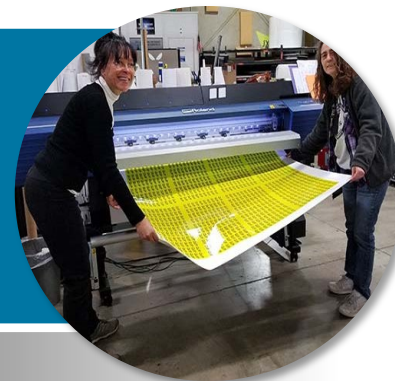

DLA Installation Management provides policy and operations for specialized support services to DLA Major Subordinate Commands, J/D Codes and tenant organizations to include:

DLA Human Resources (J1)

DLA Human Resources (J1) finds, hires, trains, and sustains a mission-ready workforce for DLA using world class policies, processes, programs, and tools. Within DLA, J1 provides:

- Strategic position management, recruitment and placement
- HR and performance management policy
- Pay and travel administration and policy
- Benefits counseling and administration
- Labor management and employee relations
- Leadership development, career management, and training
- Military personnel administration
- Organizational culture/climate program management



DLA J1 also provides HR management and services for other defense organizations and commands through the DOD customers team.

DLA Logistics Operations (J3)

J3 is responsible for end-to-end supply chain management of DLA's multiple supply chains, monitoring supply chain performance and providing logistics policy, guidance and oversight. The J3 team engages and advocates for customers to maximize readiness and combat logistics support by leveraging enterprise solutions. The Director of Logistics Operations also serves as the commander of joint regional combat support, directing DLA's three Regional Commands.

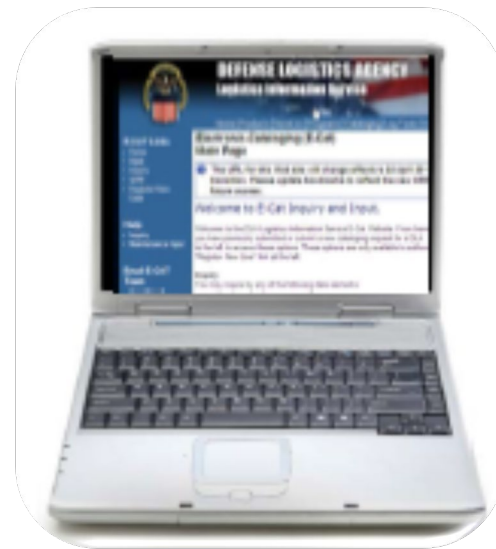
- Serves as the principal strategic, operational and tactical planner for DLA business operations and champions best business practices
- Operates the DLA Agency Synchronization Operations Center, which plans, monitors, tasks and integrates the DLA response to operations and contingencies
- Manages the Nuclear and Space Enterprise Support Office and the Customer Interaction Center
- Coordinates daily operation of DLA's six major subordinate commands
- Responsible for DOD and international cataloging policy, procedure and execution



DLA Information Operations (J6)

J6 leads and manages the confluence of information and technology as DLA embarks on a Digital-Business Transformation to provide innovative logistics IT to support effective warfighter outcomes.

- Considers day-to-day operations as job #1
- Sets strategic direction for IT at DLA
- Designs and delivers IT capabilities that power the DLA Business
- Delivers a seamless and secure IT experience
- Manages data as a strategic asset
- Shapes an IT culture of resilience and adaptability
- Operates the IT infrastructure and manages the IT portfolio
- Aligns technology to customer needs and agency priorities
- Trains and oversees IT professionals
- Monitors and protects DLA's network and IT assets





DLA Acquisition (J7)

J7 is responsible for the development, application and oversight of DLA acquisition policy, plans, programs, operations and systems.

- Oversees a DLA acquisition workforce of 9,000
- With J3 and the major subordinate commands, sets the acquisition agenda for the agency
- Interfaces with Defense Pricing and Contracting and other DOD and federal agencies in support of DLA acquisition programs and interests
- Serves as the functional process owner for DLA's procurement systems
- Leads the industry engagement strategy for the agency
- Assesses and mitigates industrial base risk via the Warstopper Program
- Drives efficiencies in the acquisition process



DLA Strategic Materials and the DLA Contracting Services Office also fall under J7.



DLA Finance (J8)

- Provides the full spectrum of financial management services and support to our customers, including accounting, budgeting, financial analysis, audit remediation and process management
- Serves as the principal financial advisor to the DLA Director
- Serves as the primary DLA advocate with the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) and the Office of Management and Budget
- Partners with many key DOD stakeholders and service providers





DLA Joint Reserve Force (J9)

J9 is made up of more than 660 trained reservists from the Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force – ready and available for contingency operations and a broad range of support requirements to include:

- Mission support to DLA supply chains
- Surge capability
- Joint exercise support
- Planning augmentation
- Defense support to civil authorities
- Support to regional commands



J9 advises the DLA Director in the development and application of Joint Reserve Force capabilities, readiness posture, and service-specific policies affecting utilization of DLA-assigned reservists.



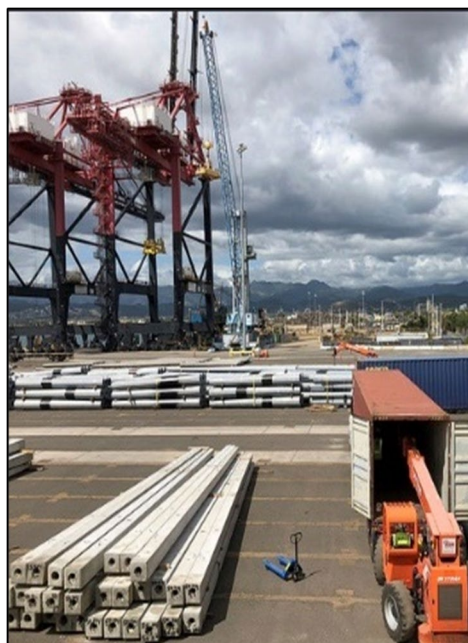
