Introduction

HQ MND-C Key Capabilities

- Plan and lead allied operations at division across the entire spectrum of tactical level land operations;
- Provide command and control to manoeuvre brigades and subordinated combat support and combat service support forces;
- Sustain operations without external support;
- Coordinate common training events and capability development of the affiliated forces of participating nations.
- Establish and maintain a robust communication network and connection to an existing network that ensures the exchange of classified data and voice communication within the Alliance.

Interoperability

Interoperability is the foundation of the ability to operate as a part of the Alliance and as a leader of a military formation across the range of military operations.

Dimensions:

- technical;
- procedural;
- human.

Challenge: C2 multi-national Land Forces on “own soil” at sovereign nation states in a high intensity conflict against a peer competitor synchronizing operations with National Home Defence Forces and other coalition forces not transferred to NATO.

Sophisticated C2 procedures, equipment and a high level of interoperability are worth nothing without a sufficient level of readiness.

Readiness fosters:

- Deterrence;
- Credibility;

and limits the risk of a strategic miscalculation by an adversary.

A sufficient number of in-place Land Forces ready to fight and the ability to reinforce rapidly provides the foundation for a credible deterrence.
