HOW TO DRINK WINE IN A CAN

When drinking wine in can, it's best to pour half of the can (125ml pour) into a drinking glass/tumbler/vessel. This allows for you to fully immerse yourself into the wine drinking experience of smell and taste.

RIVER IS CALLING SPARKLING WHITE WINE

Made from Glera which is the traditional Prosecco grape varietal. Very light in colour with a fresh green hue. Has a tropical and citrus lift on the nose. The palate is lively, clearly spritzy and clean, loaded green apples and lime fruit and a grapefruit tang.

It's the perfect drink to quench your thirst after a long hot drive as you're pulling into camp.

OUTBACK IS CALLING SPARKLING RED WINE

Our traditional Aussie bubbles. With loads of Shiraz appeal up front in the form of ripe blackberry and mulberry fruit, that merge into a chocolate mousse like weight and appeal, before finishing with length, focus and a slight blackcurrant leaf undertone provided by Cabernet Sauvignon. A dash of fortified port adds generosity, complexity, intrigue, and charm! It's a velvet sledgehammer, drink responsibly!

If there ever was a campfire drink this is definitely it! Not for a session but perhaps a nightcap, as there is a load of anaesthetizing appeal in this can...

DESERT IS CALLING WHITE WINE

Our easy drinking sole, still white wine in the range. Made from a blend of Vermentino and Pinot Grigio. Light straw in appearance. Citrus driven palate, displaying juicy Meyer lemon and lime, a slight pear fleshiness, with a dash of zesty orange and tropical pineapple skin.

The can to crack once you've made it to your camp chair, dinner is nearly on and you're on the wind down

OCEAN IS CALLING ROSÉ WINE

A light salmon colour. The palate and nose are loaded with fresh berries, summer pudding, watermelon, fairy floss, strawberries and cream. The red berry load and acid structure on the palate is courtesy of a predominantly Grenache blend, whilst the line, length and dry tannin on the finish are thanks to Langhorne Creek Cabernet Sauvignon.

Maybe it's the name but this wine screams for the seaside, think hidden away beach, rock pools or the water lapping the side of your boat with the sun setting in the background. Who needs the South of France when you have unlimited Aussie coastline.

MOUNTAIN IS CALLING RED WINE

This wine is all about ease of drinking. Unpretentious and relaxed, it's about the reward for the challenge but not a challenge to drink.

Brilliant ruby red colour. Palate is medium bodied, and fruit driven. Full of generous dark berry and fleshy plum fruit thanks to a mostly Shiraz derived blend but with a vibrant lift and supple tannin thanks to a splash of Malbec.

You don't have to be on a slope or hiking a trail, it's just as satisfying whilst turning some sizzling meat on the BBQ or better yet on the campfire.

ISLAND IS CALLING FRIZZANTE WHITE WINE

Made from Glera in a sweeter style. Light and fruity. Tropical salad, fresh apples and finger-lime; hint of honeysuckle. Tingly on the tongue. Gentle island breeze.

The perfect cider replacement, the lunch refresher or just because the sun is out and beach is calling.
