THE IMPACT OF LNG IN AFRICA (2023)

The Author looks after O&G for 11 African countries for Standard Bank and is very familiar with around 10 more (e.g. Egypt, Senegal, Mauritania). At date of LNG2023, the intention would be to cover salient African LNG developments (including liquifaction, regasification, financing and CO2 matters, together with relevant other areas, e.g. SSLNG, GTP). Among recent contributions, the Author is the lead writer of a Macroeconomic Study on Tanzania LNG (which may be published on 26 October 2022). The Author previously presented the attached at LNG2019 in Shanghai. At October 2022, the author expects that key LNG developments in July 2023 will include Mozambique (where onshore Force Majeure likely lifted by then), Senegal/Mauritania, Tanzania and from the importing side, South Africa, with some risks surrounding Nigeria LNG.
