Tips for Aspiring Wildlife Photographers

AN INTERVIEW WITH ALAN HEWITT

Alan Hewitt is a UK-based wildlife photographer, writer, podcaster, workshop leader, and a FUJIFILM

UK ambassador. He's been guiding photo safaris for us for many years, all over Sub-Saharan Africa. We asked him about his most memorable moments in the field, the contents of his camera bag, and his advice for aspiring wildlife photographers.

What got you into wildlife photography?

Living in the north east of England, we are blessed with so many rural and coastal landscapes. I enjoyed photographing these with an interest in the challenges of long exposures especially around water. But I always had an interest in natural history and longed for a telephoto lens to photograph the birds and seals. Eventually I could afford a long telephoto zoom and wildlife became my genre!

What is your most memorable photographic experience?

This is one of the most difficult questions to answer! We visit so many incredible areas in fantastic reserves with such a diverse range of species, to narrow it down is very difficult. In Timbavati, we had an incredible morning with a female leopard up a tree. She had a kill, a male impala with her too. Photographing her in the morning light as she looked around, rested Sometimes though, a fantastic

and fed, was amazing. Lions crossing one of the seasonally dry river beds in Timbavati, that's another amazing moment. It was the whole pride, lionesses, cubs and the two males stopped to rest right in the middle. Priceless! photographic experience doesn't need to be mega-fauna. In Botswana last year, we spent a wonderful hour at last light on the Limpopo River photographing a colony of very active white-fronted bee-eaters. It was a great opportunity to photograph some beautiful photogenic birds in action.

How has your approach to wildlife photography evolved?

Working in very different habitats. from the bushveld of the Timbavati to the vast savanna of the Maasai Mara then the rocky outcrops and dense mopane trees in Botswana has given me more of an interest to photograph species in a more contextual way. What I mean by that is to try and tell a natural history society, photograph animals to depict their habitat, relationships with the habitat and with other species. This often means a slightly wider view point rather than a very close portrait type of wildlife photography. I still do the latter, but when the opportunity presents itself I try to look for context.

Talk us through the contents of your camera bag.

My first wildlife photography set up, a Nikon D70 and 80-400mm lens. Now. I'm using the Fuiifilm X-H2S as my main camera together with either the XF50-140mm. XF100-400mm or 150-600mm lenses. I sometimes use a XF200mm and also some of the cameras and lenses in Fujifilm's GFX medium format line up. I'm a huge advocate of using a

monopod, especially from a safari vehicle when you have a long, heavy lens focussed on a subject waiting for a moment of action. You can pretty much guarantee that muscle shake will set in and as

soon as you take a rest, that's when that action will happen!

You've been running photo safaris in Botswana and South Africa for many years. What makes these so special?

Between the two locations, Timbavati (South Africa) and Tuli Block (Botswana), they have very different landscapes and habitats. Both offer incredible opportunities! In Timbavati, the number of vehicles is low and the wildlife density and diversity is amazing. We've done all of the 'Big Five' in just one game drive. In itself, that is quite something, but we also see so much more, like birds, antelopes, giraffes, hippos, hyena. It's a big list. Many of the areas in Timbavati are quite dense with foliage and this often makes getting closer to birds a little easier.

In Tuli Block, the landscape and foliage is massively different and the tourist numbers are very low, often iust us! I really eniou the diversity of the habitat, rocky outcrops, moping tree forests, the Limpopo River which provides wonderful crocodile opportunities, bathing elephants and a variety of birdlife too. In contrast, the vast Motloutse River is dry during the winter and Eagle Rock which towers above is usually home to nesting eagles. There are also some unusual aspects of Tuli Block, brown huena, bat-eared foxes are numerous and the national bird of Botswana... the Kori Bustard.

What advice would you give to aspiring wildlife photographers?

Learn how to use your camera with your eyes closed! Ok, so closing uour eues is not great for wildlife photography, but being able to make adjustments to camera settings without moving your eye from the viewfinder is important. Fieldcraft. too - if we can learn about our subjects we can often predict their behaviour. This means we may be able to stay one step ahead and get our cameras and lenses pointing in the right direction to capture action and behaviour. Being knowledgeable about species also helps you engage a much wider audience.







AN INTERVIEW WITH ANNA LUSTY

If you join us in Africa as a humanitarian photographer, you'll have the good fortune to be guided by Anna Lusty. Based in South Africa, Anna travels across the African continent to document the work of social impact and animal welfare organisations; initiatives that are doing impactful work on a grassroots level. We asked her about her motivation, insider tips, and what people can expect from joining our humanitarian photography workshop.

What ignited your interest in humanitarian photography?

What sparked my passion for humanitarian photography was the realisation of its immense power to inspire connection and drive change. Before diving into photography full-time. I worked in the non-profit sector, focusing on communications, fundraising, and donor relations. Photography was just a side project back then, but I quickly noticed how impactful strong visuals could be in capturing hearts and engaging audiences.

When I moved from the UK to South Africa, I started to explore how I could help non-profits share their stories through compelling imagery. It was clear to me - and still is - that many organisations weren't reaching their audience

because their visuals didn't match the strength of their mission. That gap fueled my determination to create authentic, powerful imagery that elevates their message and makes their work impossible to ignore.

What are your goals with your photographu?

My goal is to help humanitarian organisations visually tell their stories in ways that deeply resonate and inspire action. Through high-quality, ethical photography, I aim to capture the essence of an organisation's work their challenges, successes, and impact - while ensuring every image respects the dignity, privacy, and rights of the people and communities being portrayed. Ultimately, my photography is about empowering organisations to share their story with integrity and to elevate the voices of those they serve.

Who should consider joining a humanitarian photography workshop?

Anyone with a solid grasp of their camera, a deep interest in social issues, and a big heart should consider joining. This workshop is for those who are passionate about telling stories through their lens not for personal glory, but to create meaningful images that serve others. It's for individuals with the emotional intelligence to navigate sensitive situations thoughtfully and respectfully.

If you're open to collaborating, learning, and sharing with a group of like-minded people, this experience will be transformative. It's more than a photography trip; it's a journey into the heart of a country, offering an authentic connection to its people and stories in ways that go far beyond the typical tourist experience.

What can people expect from your workshops and shooting as a non-

profit photographer in an African context?

The experience is immersive, collaborative, and deeply enriching. We begin by spending significant time as a group discussing the spaces and organisations we'll be working with. This ensures everyone feels informed, prepared, and respectful of the context. Whether you're new to non-profit photography or looking to refine your skills, you'll receive as much guidance and support as you need to build confidence in this unique space.

Each photographer will always have a workshop leader or a representative from the organisation by their side, offering support and guidance whenever needed. This is not just about photographing to a brief; it's about taking the time to connect with your subjects, understand their stories, and appreciate the environment or community you're working in.

Expect an experience that challenges and inspires you, where you'll learn to create images with purpose, authenticity, and respect. It's an opportunity to develop your craft while forging meaningful connections with the people and stories you're documenting.

Can you reveal any photography tips?

One of the most powerful tips I can share is this: connect with your subject before you even pick up your camera. Take the time to build trust, create a safe and comfortable space, and truly engage with the person in front of you.

This connection not only shows respect but also brings authenticity and depth to your images. When your subject feels at ease and valued, it transforms the energy of the shoot - and you'll see the difference in the imagery you produce. A genuine connection always shines through the lens.
