From the thunderous drama of Murchison Falls to the misty intimacy of Bwindi's mountain gorillas, this itinerary is designed to deliver unforgettable frames and rare encounters.

Capture golden light sweeping across savannahs teeming with elephants, lions, and leopards. Glide past hippos and crocodiles on private boat safaris, and hike to panoramic viewpoints that beg for wide-angle shots.

Track chimpanzees in lush rainforest, photograph crater lakes against the backdrop of the Rwenzori Mountains, and document the vibrant life of local communities.

With two gorilla treks and one chimp trek, exclusive game drives, and guided walks, every day offers new compositions - from close-up wildlife portraits to sweeping landscapes and cultural vignettes.

Whether you're building a portfolio or simply chasing the thrill of the perfect shot, this safari is for you.

You'll track gorillas and chimpanzees in lush rainforests, cruise wildlife-rich rivers, and explore savannahs teeming with lions, elephants, and giraffes.

Along the way, you'll capture crater lakes, volcanic backdrops, vibrant communities, and rare birdlife - including the iconic shoebill stork.

Each destination offers a new visual story, with golden light, dramatic scenery, and unforgettable wildlife encounters.

This safari is built for photographers. Offering expert guidance, optimal shooting conditions, and exclusive access to Uganda's most captivating wildlife and landscapes.

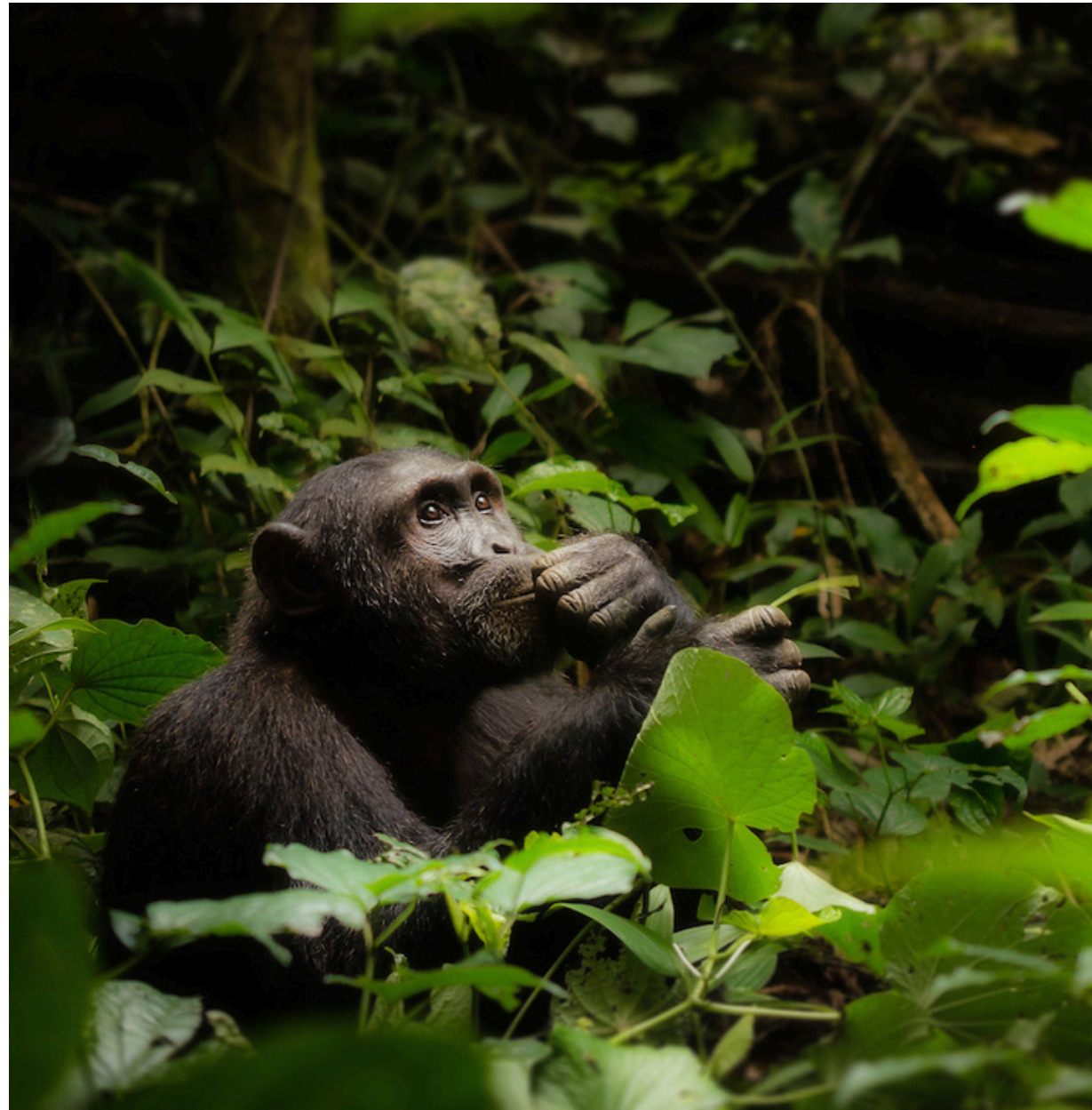

ACCOMMODATION & FACILITIES:

Throughout the trip, you'll stay in a selection of comfortable lodges and guesthouses chosen for their charm, location, and proximity to key wildlife areas.

The journey begins and ends at ViaVia Guest House in Entebbe, a relaxed and welcoming spot ideal for unwinding before and after your safari. In Murchison Falls, Hornbill Bush Lodge offers a tranquil riverside setting with views of the Nile and easy access to game drives and boat safaris. Chimpanzee Forest Lodge in Kibale provides a peaceful forest-edge retreat, perfect for early morning chimp tracking.

In Queen Elizabeth National Park, you'll stay in the self-contained tents at Bush Lodge for a rustic, immersive experience and as a bonus, it is well-positioned for wildlife photography. Gorilla Valley Lodge, located near Bwindi and Mgahinga, offers dramatic mountain views and a cozy base for gorilla trekking. At Lake Mburo, Rwakobo Rock Lodge sits atop a scenic hill with sweeping views of the savannah and frequent wildlife sightings right from your veranda.

Each property includes en-suite facilities, hearty meals, and warm hospitality, ensuring a restful and inspiring stay throughout your photographic adventure.

Meals:

Expect fresh, flavorful dining throughout your stay. Most lodges serve continental-style cuisine crafted to please international palates, with occasional opportunities to sample local flavors upon request. While traditional Ugandan dishes aren't typically offered, the menus are thoughtfully curated to ensure variety and comfort. Dinner is a relaxed three-course affair, perfect for unwinding after a day of adventure, while lunch is served as a satisfying two-course meal. Many of the lodges we work with pride themselves on sourcing ingredients from nearby farms (or growing their own) so every bite reflects the region's natural abundance.



HEALTH & FITNESS LEVEL REQUIRED:

This safari is suitable for travelers with a moderate level of fitness.

Most activities (including game drives, boat safaris, and guided walks) are relaxed and accessible. However, gorilla and chimpanzee tracking can be physically demanding, involving hikes through uneven terrain, dense forest, and varying altitudes.

Participants should be comfortable walking for several hours and navigating natural trails. While no technical climbing is required, a reasonable level of stamina, balance, and mobility will enhance your experience. If you have any health concerns or mobility limitations, we recommend discussing them with us in advance so we can advise on suitable adjustments.

RECOMMENDED EQUIPMENT

Recommended Camera Gear:

- DSLR or mirrorless camera
- Range of lenses; ideally ranging from wide angle for landscape to telephoto for wildlife
- Tripod/Monopod
- Sturdy camera bag
- Enough spare batteries and memory cards (you'll be able to charge your batteries at our accommodation)
- Power banks for charging equipment when out and about
- Hard drive and a laptop / external drive
- Laptop with editing software

Essential Travel Gear:

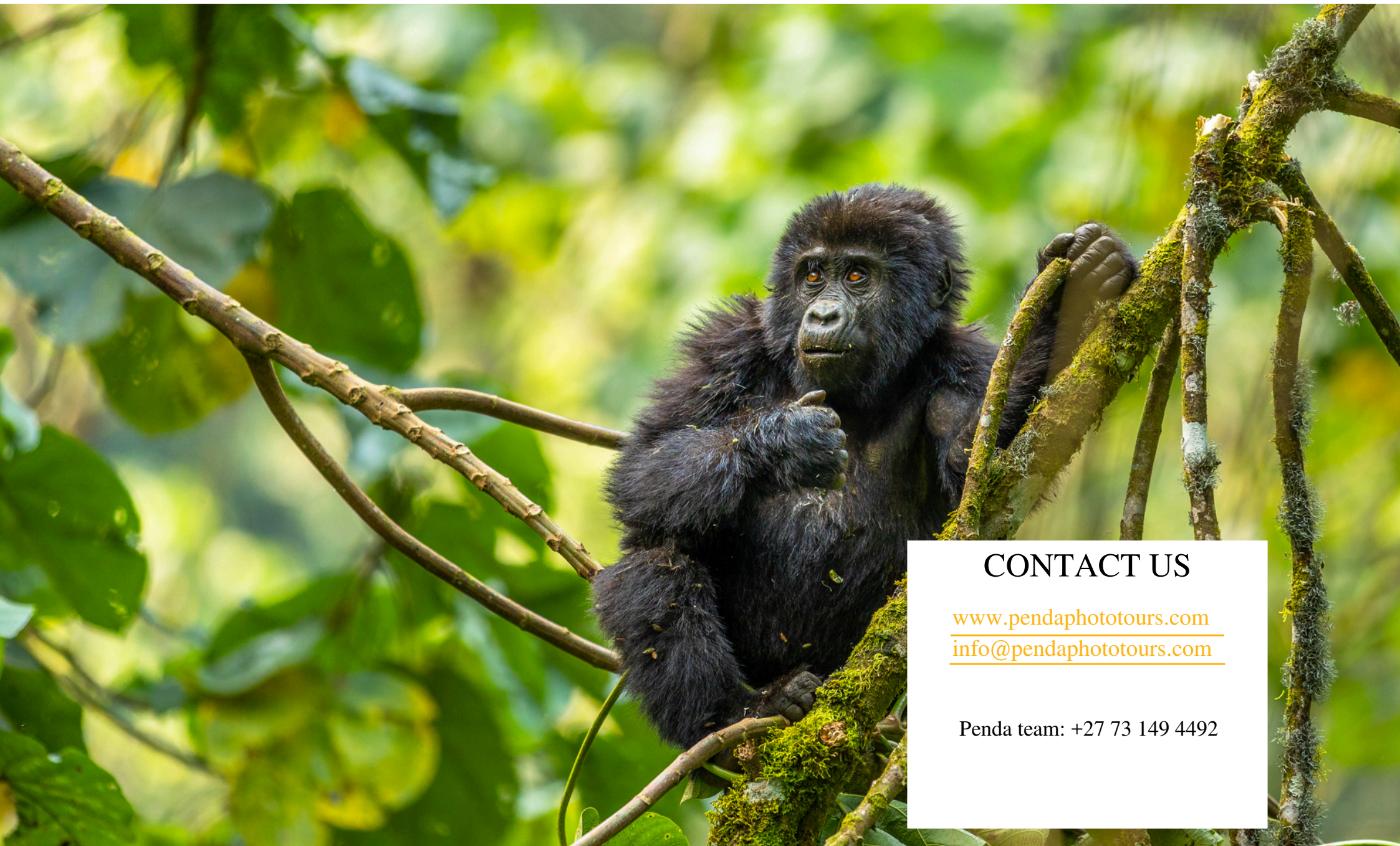
- Lightweight, breathable, and quiet fabrics (cotton recommended)
- Neutral tones like beige, olive, and khaki for blending in
- Avoid red, white and darker colours
- No camouflage clothing
- Casual evening outfit for relaxing at the lodge
- Warm jacket, fleece, or sweater for cool mornings and evenings
- Rain jacket for spontaneous showers
- Trainers or sandals for vehicle-based safaris
- Sturdy, broken-in hiking boots for walking safaris or trekking
- Comfortable lodge footwear
- Sunscreen (at least 50 fps), Sun hat, Lip balm & Sunglasses
- Binoculars
- Ziplock bags for litter
