


## BORNEO WILDLIFE PHOTOGRAPHY TOUR





#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

Borneo is one of the last great strongholds of tropical biodiversity, a lush, ancient island where mist-shrouded rainforests pulse with life and evolutionary wonder. This tour takes you deep into Sabah, the Malaysian part of Borneo, where lowland jungles, winding rivers, and towering dipterocarp trees create a dramatic backdrop for wildlife encounters.

The region is home to some of the world's most iconic and endangered species, including orangutans, pygmy elephants, proboscis monkeys, and clouded leopards. With its mix of protected reserves, mangrove forests, and canopy walkways, Borneo offers photographers rare access to habitats that are both ecologically rich and visually stunning.

From the golden light filtering through Danum Valley's ancient trees to the eerie beauty of Gomantong Caves, every location on this itinerary reveals a different facet of Borneo's wild character. The Kinabatangan River, one of Southeast Asia's most wildlife-dense corridors, offers intimate boat-based viewing, while Tabin's mineral springs and mud volcanoes attract a wide range of species. Even the quieter moments - listening to gibbons call at dawn or watching hornbills glide overhead - are steeped in atmosphere. This is a destination where nature feels close, raw, and deeply alive, making it a dream setting for photographers who seek both visual drama and authentic connection.

The journey concludes with a stay in a modern, well-equipped hotel in Kota Kinabalu, offering a chance to relax and reflect on your photographic adventures. Across all destinations, your accommodation is designed to complement the natural environment while providing the amenities needed to recharge after full days in the field.









# HEALTH & FITNESS LEVEL REQUIREMENTS

This tour is designed to be accessible to most travelers with a moderate level of fitness. While the focus is on photography rather than strenuous trekking, participants should be comfortable walking on uneven terrain, navigating forest trails, and climbing steps or boardwalks in humid conditions.

Activities may include short hikes, boat rides, and time spent outdoors in warm, tropical weather, often with early starts and extended periods of wildlife observation. A reasonable level of mobility and stamina will help ensure you get the most out of the experience, but no extreme fitness is required - just a spirit of adventure and a readiness to embrace nature at its wildest.



## RECOMMENDED EQUIPMENT

We recommend the following equipment. If you'd like to discuss your specific gear, just reach out, and we'll be happy to advise.

#### Recommended Camera Gear:

- DSLR or mirrorless camera
- Range of lenses; ideally ranging from wide angle for landscape to telephoto for wildlife
- Tripod (useful)
- · Sturdy camera bag
- Enough spare batteries and memory cards (you'll be able to charge your batteries at our accommodation)
- Hard drive and a laptop / external drive
- Laptop with editing software

#### Essential Travel Gear:

- Lightweight, breathable clothing for humid conditions (long sleeves and trousers for insect protection)
- Light rain jacket or poncho quick rain showers are common
- Comfortable walking shoes or lightweight hiking boots with good grip
- Headlamp or flashlight for night walks and lodge use
- Insect repellent and sun protection (hat, sunscreen, sunglasses)
- Dry bags or waterproof covers for camera gear and electronics
- Binoculars (optional, but useful for spotting birds and arboreal wildlife)
- Power adapter Malaysia uses Type G sockets (UK-style, 240V)
