Welcome to BIEF 2026

The inaugural **Belize International Energy Forum (BIEF 2026)** brings together governments, utilities, investors, technology leaders, and development partners to shape the next chapter of energy competitiveness in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Hosted in **San Pedro, Ambergris Caye** BIEF 2026 offers a distinctive setting for high-level energy dialogue at a moment of profound regional transformation. The forum is held under the patronage of the **Minister of Public Utilities, Energy, Logistics & E-Governance of Belize and the Ministry of the Blue Economy and Marine Conservation of Belize**, underscoring its strategic importance within the regional energy agenda. Designed as a **high-level, action-oriented platform**, BIEF 2026 focuses on strategic dialogue, partnership building, and deal-making. Over two intensive days, decision-makers and market leaders will

engage in forward-looking discussions addressing the forces reshaping the energy sector — from reliability pressures and climate risk to digitalization, industrial electrification, and rapidly evolving demand driven by data, infrastructure, and economic growth.

An expectation is that current geopolitical energy issues will drive energy security to the centre of discussions on the regional strategy. In particular, much will focus on how to connect resilience, supply diversification, and sovereign energy planning with private capital markets and scalable technology providers. The Forum will explore options through which geopolitical and supply-chain shifts, together with the ongoing climate risks, are re-defining national energy priorities across the region, and the immediate actions that can be taken to close readiness and financing gaps.

A New Platform for Regional Energy Leadership

The energy landscape across **Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC)** is changing rapidly. Falling renewable energy costs, advances in storage and digital technologies, and shifting global markets are accelerating the transition toward more diversified and resilient energy systems. At the same time, climate exposure, financing gaps, and infrastructure constraints continue to challenge long-term energy security and competitiveness across the region.

Why energy security now?

Recent geopolitical shifts — from commodity market volatility to the reorientation of major gas and critical-mineral supply chains — are raising the cost of energy dependence and exposing critical infrastructure. The region must accelerate diversification (renewables, storage, distributed systems), build domestic manufacturing and hydrogen/export strategies, and scale regional cooperation to decouple

their economies and vulnerable island systems from fossil energy, which is becoming increasingly unpredictable in pricing and supply.

The **Belize International Energy Forum (BIEF)** responds directly to this inflection point. Conceived as a focused, senior-level convening, BIEF 2026 brings together public and private sector leaders to explore how clean energy systems can deliver **firm, reliable, affordable, and scalable power**, while strengthening regional integration and economic competitiveness.

Set against the backdrop of Belize's interconnected island and mainland energy systems — and its leadership in climate resilience — BIEF provides a uniquely relevant environment for meaningful exchange. More than a conference, BIEF is a platform for collaboration, where **policy, technology, and capital converge** to translate regional ambition into practical, bankable outcomes.

BIEF 2026 is designed to address these realities by focusing on the drivers that will define the region's next phase of energy competitiveness, including:







-  Grid reliability and system resilience.
-  Competitive clean energy technologies.
-  Capital flows and innovative financing mechanisms.
-  Digitalization, artificial intelligence, and smart infrastructure.
-  Regional integration across CARICOM and SICA.

Identify competitive technologies driving energy security and growth Showcase and evaluate the technologies shaping the region's next generation of energy systems — including solar, wind, geothermal, hydropower, energy storage, green hydrogen, and **AI-enabled grid solutions** — with a focus on scalability, reliability, and cost competitiveness.



Catalyze partnerships across the public and private sectors Facilitate meaningful collaboration among **governments, utilities, investors, developers, technology providers, and multilateral institutions**, creating pathways for project development, financing, and regional cooperation.



Assess market forces shaping LAC energy markets Examine the economic and policy dynamics influencing investment and development decisions across the region, from carbon pricing and commodity volatility to evolving regulatory frameworks, financing conditions, and long-term energy demand trends.



Deliver tangible outcomes and lasting impact Move beyond dialogue by generating concrete outputs, including strategic partnerships, project pipelines, and the **San Pedro Energy Competitiveness Declaration**, articulating shared priorities for clean energy, resilience, and regional integration.

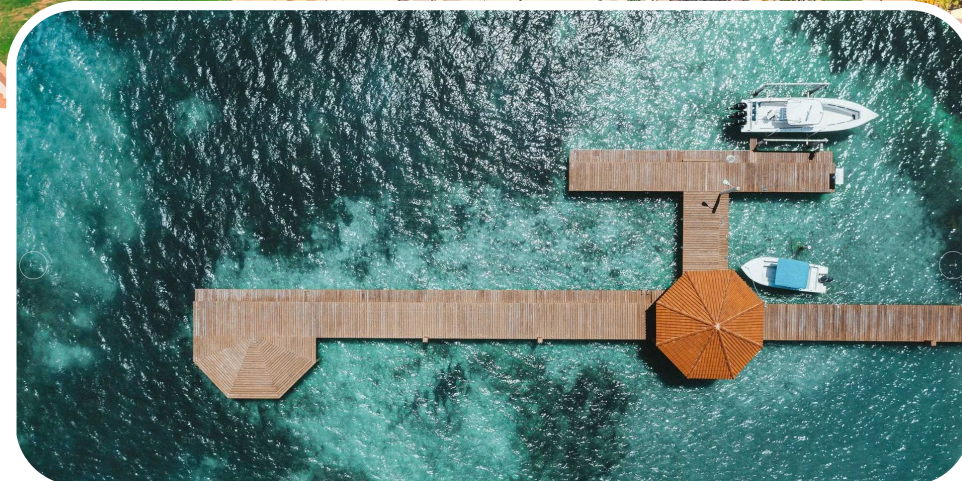
VENUE OVERVIEW

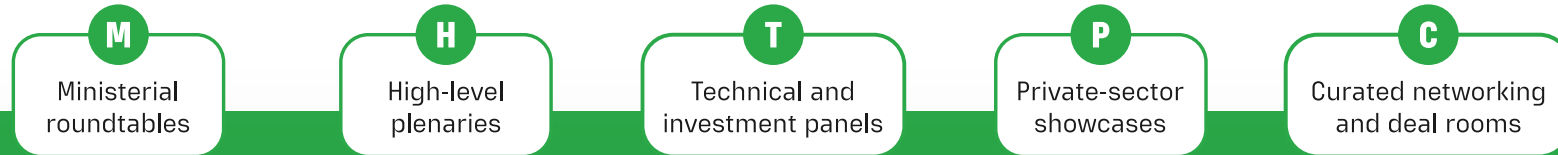
