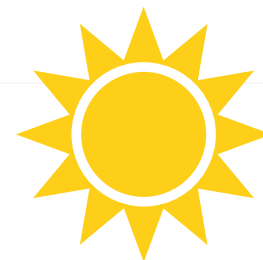

Abstract Submission Guidelines

The following guidelines are designed to help you prepare a strong and effective abstract for submission.

Language and Length: Abstracts must be written in English and limited to a maximum of 3,500 characters (including spaces)

Content Restrictions: Sales-focused presentations or product promotions will not be accepted. Submissions should offer technical insights, case studies, innovative research or practical applications relevant to the oil and gas sector

Supporting Materials: You may include additional materials (e.g., charts, tables, diagrams) as attachments to support your submission

Topic Selection: Please choose the topic area that best represents the focus of your abstract. Do not submit the same abstract under multiple topics. If your submission fits more than one area, select the most appropriate one

Multiple Submissions: Authors may submit more than one abstract across various themes or within the same category. However, each submission must be original and substantially distinct. Abstracts that are too similar in content will not be considered

Author Details: Each abstract must be accompanied by the presenter's short biography (maximum 600 characters) and a profile photograph for inclusion in the conference program

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
