## **INTRODUCTION: MONETISATION PROJECTS**



#### **Uganda Refinery Project**

- Refinery of 60,000bbl/day planned to be developed located in Kabaale, Hoima
- Final Configuration approved
- 29 Sq.km of land acquired (5 sq. Km for refinery)
- FEED completed and approved.
- New investor identified Alpha MBM Investments LLC from the United Arab Emirates, negotiation of key agreements commenced in January and will take 3 months.

#### **East Africa Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP) Project**

- 1443km, 24-inch diameter heated and buried.
- Construction of the Thermal Insulation Plant in Tanzania is at 95%. Coating and insulation equipment installation is ongoing
- Construction licence was issued in January 2023 and February 2023 for Uganda and Tanzania sections respectively.
- Line pipes supplied by Panyu Chu Kong Steel Pipe Zhuhai Co. Ltd (PCK) and Corinth Pipe Works (CPW)
- In Uganda, civil works commenced in August 2023 at Main Camp and Pipeyard 1 in Hoima





#### **Legal framework**



- Uganda has one of the lowest finding costs the world with less than \$1 per barrel compared to global average of \$5-\$10
- High drilling success rate of 88% compared to the global average of 10%.

### **ACHIEVEMENTS**





- A total of US\$7.5 billion invested in the sector by the end of 2023 with US\$ 1.09 billion and US\$ 1.93 billion invested in 2022 and 2023, respectively.
- An additional US\$ 15 billion is expected to be spent over the following 23 years of development, operation and maintenance of the oil fields and other infrastructure (Both Upstream and Midstream)

## PETROLEUM AUTHORITY OF UGANDA

### Provision of goods and services

- Between 2017 to date 6 years, over 4,540 contracts valued at US\$ 4.955bn were awarded, of which 3,932 valued at US\$2.012bn (41%) were awarded to Ugandan companies as defined in the regulations.
- About US\$ 19.94 million went to community-based companies.


## **Technology Transfer**


Since 2017 to date, a total of 65 joint ventures have been approved by the PAU of which 31have secure 35 contracts worth USD 190,924,528.

- ☐ The PAU welcomes your participation in the country's oil and gas sector with a view to ensure that the petroleum resources create lasting value for Ugandan society.




