






This session is dedicated to a remarkable fact: There has never been such a plethora of opportunities for innovation in our business area. However, the future holds many challenges. For example, our value chains need to become faster, more resilient, more sustainable, and less prone to error while offering customers a better and more convenient shopping experience. How to address labour shortages in the supply chain industry

Prior to Covid, it was all about lean, just-in-time operations with no redundancy in the market.

Covid caused a surge in demand and buying behaviour, creating a need for e-commerce fulfillment, omni-channel solutions and re-thinking of supply chains. Chief Supply Chain Offers are getting a seat at the boardroom table, new roles are created in inventory and demand planning and Amazon has recruiters standing in the street holding up signs "wherever you work, we pay \$5 more per hour".

Three key takeaways:

- Leadership: interventions on how to lift people (encourage a career in supply chain, building a pipeline of future leaders)
- New talent: attracting new people into the industry (collaboration, we are connecting people in new ways, only 30% of women work full time in Australia and they are natural organisers)
- Alternatives: driving continuous improvement and efficiency to do more with less people (data, systems, process, automation)

Masterminding a Meerkat: the story of DHL's autonomous inventory management robot

Kent Rogers and Karl Brooks; colleagues with similar strengths in IT, created their inventory robot, Meerkat Inventory after witnessing so many go-live and operational challenges created by inventory problems. The new mobile robots opened the way for small platforms to deliver solutions never before possible.

At about the same time, DHL began a discovery journey in the innovation sphere. The global board launched a program in late 2017 called Start-up Lab It was charged with identifying then support ideas, which may not have been visible in the traditional management structure. The net was cast globally across all the divisions of DHL and the idea was to see what in-house innovations could be found.

Join Kent Rogers as he shares the wild ride Meerkat Inventory has been on over the past five years – from inception to go live. He will share the complexity and personal challenges of designing, building, testing and certifying a purpose built industrial inventory management robot and why the finishing touches are so important. (You can't expect a local stores person or inventory manager to understand how to make it work – they need to see simplicity and value in each solution otherwise it may become an expensive ornament.)

Three key takeaways:

- Organisations need to have an active approach to identify and support innovation. There are many small players who have really good ideas and no knowledge of how to get traction with a supporting entry into industry.
- Failure should be seen as learning and the organisation should look at trying to fail cheaply before the perfect solution is found. Traditional cost evaluations often close the door on good ideas which may take time to embed in the operation.
- Employees are often excited about the ideas in their area of work and are able to do research using their existing knowledge. It doesn't have to be in their current role. The challenge is to empower them to work through the challenges as there will always be many.

The cost of heat stress in the workplace and how big fans make a big difference

The warehouse, manufacturing and distribution sectors operate in high labour and often heat intensive environments. This can lead to heat stress, which is proven to result in lost productivity through lowered cognitive functions, absenteeism and lowered physical capabilities.

With climate scientists predicting an increase in heat waves of greater intensity, government bodies and global health authorities are recommending companies adopt adaptation measures as a matter of urgency to avoid severe economic impacts from labour productivity loss.

Heat stress can negatively affect businesses and its people at all levels. Big Ass Fans has a commitment to safety and comfort and has researched and developed methods to overcome these issues. This research has been carried out at both their research and development facility in the US, the largest facility of its kind, as well as working extensively with NASA to better understand thermal comfort.
