Our <u>3rd Annual Conference</u> in 2023, *The UK Opportunity for Critical Minerals*, was our biggest to date. We welcomed over 300 stakeholders from across the globe to Burlington House in London for a day of insightful panel discussions and presentations on building supply chain resilience.



The event attracted a diverse audience that highlighted the multidisciplinary nature of critical minerals. Some of our esteemed speakers included: David Stewart, Agent-General for Queensland; Hon. Ralph E. Goodale, High Commissioner for Canada in the UK; Ranj Pillai, Premier of Yukon; Hon. 

The event welcomed 200 attendees and featured additional presentations & panels.





First Nation Mining Delegation to the UK | With support from the CMA (UK), the Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO) hosted Indigenous Canadian leaders at the Geological Society in London for a series of roundtable discussions on the indigenous history of mining and the importance of community relations.

CMA (UK) Midstream Paper Launch | Members of industry and government were welcomed at the Materials Processing Institute for the launch of 'Midstream Processing & Refining: Unlocking Security of Supply', a report which was well-received and widely shared among UK, US and French government.
