Named after renowned architect Ernö Goldfinger — the design master behind our Grade II listed Brutalist home — we decided to take its literal meaning as guiding inspiration: the material we touch, we turn to gold.





Superior sustainable materials

We source and select high-quality low carbon timber. This includes salvaged wood donated by our material partners, and virgin wood, sourced locally from trees that have been felled due to weather-related incidents, disease or urban development.

This not only saves the tree from being chipped or burned for biofuel, it sequesters carbon, and removes the need to cut down forests.



Wood and wellbeing

We love working with wood because of its beauty, natural capabilities, and its infinitely recyclable potential.


Wood is good for our health, too. Touching wood reduces stress, and studies conducted in Japan and Norway have shown that being surrounded by wood — even in our homes — has a positive impact on our wellbeing, enhancing our connection to the natural world.



Traditional craftsmanship

Everything we make is built to last a lifetime. With years of experience, our expert craftspeople favour using traditional tools and joinery techniques. This not only allows us to achieve the highest quality, but helps to keep these age-old craft practices alive.









Goldfinger Academy

We equip young learners to become the sustainably-minded designers of the future by working with schools across London. We introduce children to the world of craftsmanship and circular design — opening the door for them to consider furniture making and joinery as a career.

For local youth not in education, employment or training, we run an apprenticeship programme to help them create solid professional careers as expert craftspeople.

We also offer corporate away-days that enhance wellbeing and celebrate the joys of making, as well as public craft workshops. Free spaces are available for local residents who are facing financial hardship.

People's Kitchen

Since 2015, we have been sitting down with our local community once a month at our People's Kitchen, where we share a delicious meal cooked up from surplus ingredients.

When the pandemic hit in 2020, we transformed the People's Kitchen into a doorstep delivery of delicious hot meals as well as chats for vulnerable residents in our area.

Now back to our monthly sit-down meal, the People's Kitchen is a team effort by our in-house Sicilian café Panella, our dedicated team of Goldfinger volunteers and our generous supporters.

We've served over 12,000 restaurant-quality meals so far, and counting.
