

Tile design installation – inc. new range, 'Time' At Clerkenwell Design Week, 21–23 May 2024






Domus will present a colourful exhibit of vibrant tile designs created by **Edward Barber & Jay Osgerby** throughout their ten-year collaboration with Domus brand partner, **Mutina**. Opening at Domus Clerkenwell as part of this year's Clerkenwell Design Week, London, 21-23 May 2024.

Celebrating a decade of creativity between the London-based design duo and Italian design house, Mutina, 'The Magic of Colour' conveys the spirit of experimentation, playfulness, and authenticity which continues to define the artistic partnership. The showroom design installation will feature new collection, Time, launching at Domus this Spring, plus fresh pastel toned colour additions to historic range, Mews.

With a progressive and experimental approach towards colour, pattern, and texture, Barber & Osgerby's celebrated designs for Mutina represent their exciting journey into the realm of surface design, comprising classic ranges Mews and Puzzle. Consistently pushing the boundaries between industrial design and architecture, the multifaceted nature of their work has enabled the creation of entirely new styles which explore notions of scale and composition across inventive colour palettes.





# New tile collection - Time

Conceived to commemorate a decade of creative collaboration with Mutina, new collection Time presents a soothingly tactile, richly coloured range of small format, modular shaped, throughbody porcelain tiles – representing the beauty of weathered surfaces formed over time.

A rich and varied tonal palette draws inspiration from the geology, geography, and landscape of different locales around the globe – including Etna Black, Dakota Grey, Dover White, Salta Red, Highland Green, Virginia Blue, Sahara Sand, and Atlas Brown – achieved through the infusion of inks, into the ceramic bodies via a water "washing" process.

Two finishes, 'Rough' & 'Smooth', reflect the physical transformation of surfaces over millennia, comprising a gritty, structured textural finish together with a soft, matt surface style, inviting a tactile exploration of touch, with the potential for combining in unique layout arrangements.

Each variant is available in three modular sized shapes, allowing the creation of infinite design layouts. From understated schemes using single pieces to imaginative layouts combining shapes, colours and textures, the incredibly versatile collection offers a multitude of compositional variations to cater for different project requirements.







