#### The Evolution of Freedom

From its inception in 1999 to the latest iteration, the Freedom Ocean chair to launch later this year, guests will be able to experience first-hand how it's as relevant today as it was when it was launched. There will also be a sneak peek of the Freedom 25, set to debut this autumn Freedom 25 is a limited edition of 250 of the iconic Freedom Headrest. Each numbered chair has a unique Freedom 25 logo, aluminium Headrest support, handle and back adjust lever and is fully upholstered in high performance premium textiles.

Humanscale was the first manufacturer to launch a task chair made with ocean plastic when it introduced the Smart Ocean chair in 2018. Following that success, Humanscale introduced the Liberty Ocean and most recently Path which was launched globally last year. These products use recycled fishing nets, widely regarded as the most harmful type of plastic in the ocean. In this way, Humanscale directly supports clean oceans by using abandoned, lost and discarded fishing nets that damage delicate ecosystems and marine life that inhabit them. The new Freedom Ocean, which will be exclusively shown at CDW, further underscores Humanscale's dedication to conscious design principles. This April Humanscale announced its certification as a <u>B Corporation</u>™ (B Corp™), recognising the company's commitment to planet positive manufacturing, which means leaving the world better off, one product at a time.
