

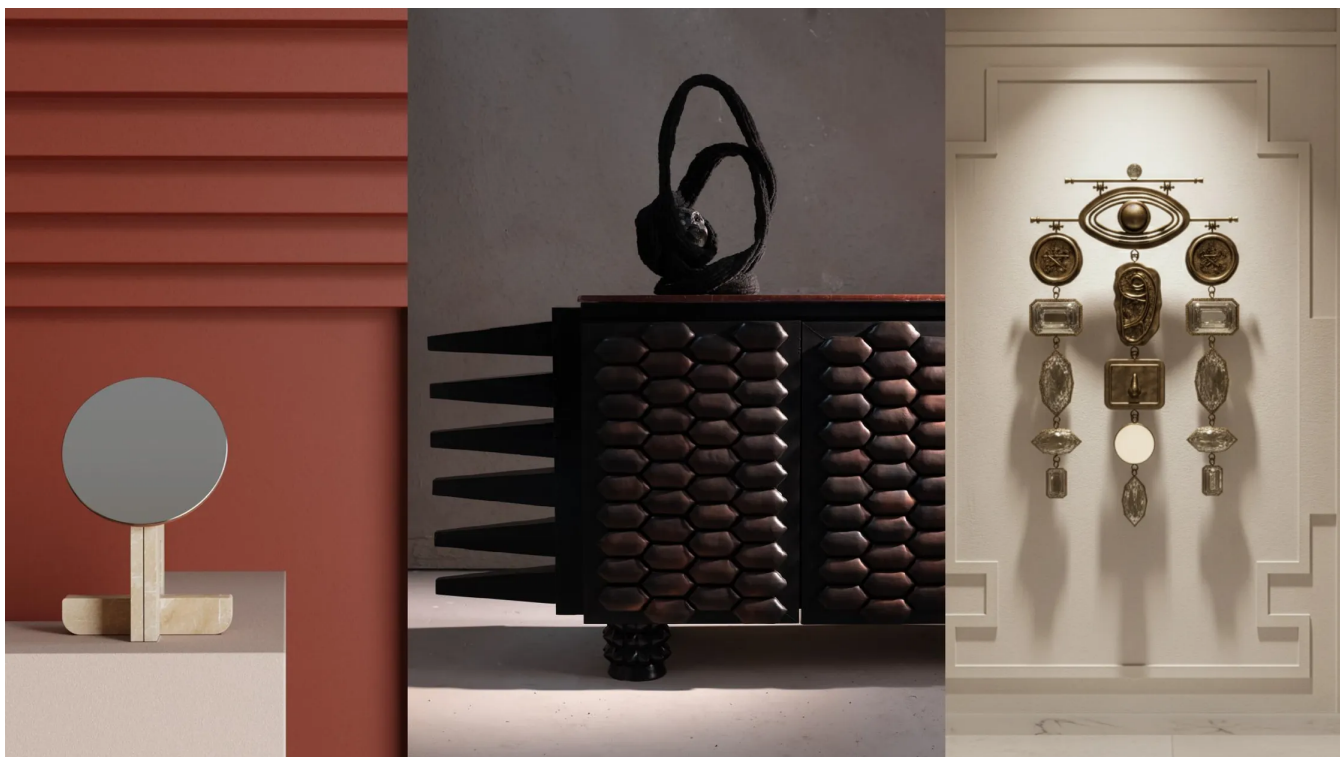

Arredatore Design Studio

A studio specialising in interior designing, Arredatore Design Studio was formed in 2008, in Kolkata, by Arunika Sarkar. Specialising in upscale residential and commercial interior design, Sarkar approaches each design opportunity as a blank slate, adding in layers of texture, art, history, tone and storytelling. Her distinctive warm modernist style is achieved through a mix of vintage, contemporary and custom pieces. Whether it's texture, tone, or history, every detail is intentional, and every corner tells a tale. Driven by the same ethos, she has now expanded Arredatore into the world of furniture design. Her debut piece, Canasta, is a postmodern bar cabinet that's playful, punchy, and full of personality. It will be showcased at the event.



Artisanal Abode

Artisanal Abode is a furniture design studio that envisions aligning creativity with craft-based design. It was born out of love for the uniqueness of handmade products, respect for Indian craftsmen and their largely untapped artisanal techniques. What started as a college project for founder Upasana Jain, has today taken shape as a boutique design house that combines diverse materials, artisanal workmanship with timeless form. Each creation is soulfully handcrafted, fusing traditional techniques and skills of production with modern design. It works with some of the finest craftsmen to reinterpret age-old techniques like bidriware, metalware, goldleafing, woodcarving, etc. It will display the Weaving in Metal collection reimagining the traditional craft of basket weaving in stainless steel, brass and copper.
