Designer-maker Tabitha Bargh will present both existing and new work at Material Matters London, including the launch of Poly 1 XL and Poly Table, expanding her collection of lighting made from reclaimed estate agent boards.

Bargh's practice begins with curiosity about materials and the possibilities they hold. She notices potential in overlooked and everyday materials, imagining new directions before testing, refining and developing them into sculptural contemporary lighting. Working with corrugated cardboard and reclaimed estate agent boards, she creates pieces that celebrate texture, structure and light while encouraging a different way of seeing familiar materials.

Through this process of exploration, Bargh reveals new possibilities within materials that are often overlooked or discarded. Her work invites us to reconsider their value and potential, demonstrating how familiar materials can be transformed into something both beautiful and unexpected.

At Material Matters London, visitors will see two distinctive lighting collections. CartOn explores the sculptural qualities of layered corrugated cardboard, while Poly transforms reclaimed polypropylene estate agent boards into bold pendant and table lights. Alongside the existing collection, Bargh will launch Poly 1 XL and Poly Table, extending the range into larger and more varied interior settings.
