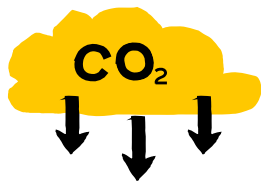


Solidaridad AT A GLANCE 2024

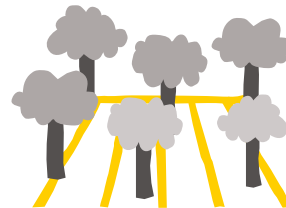

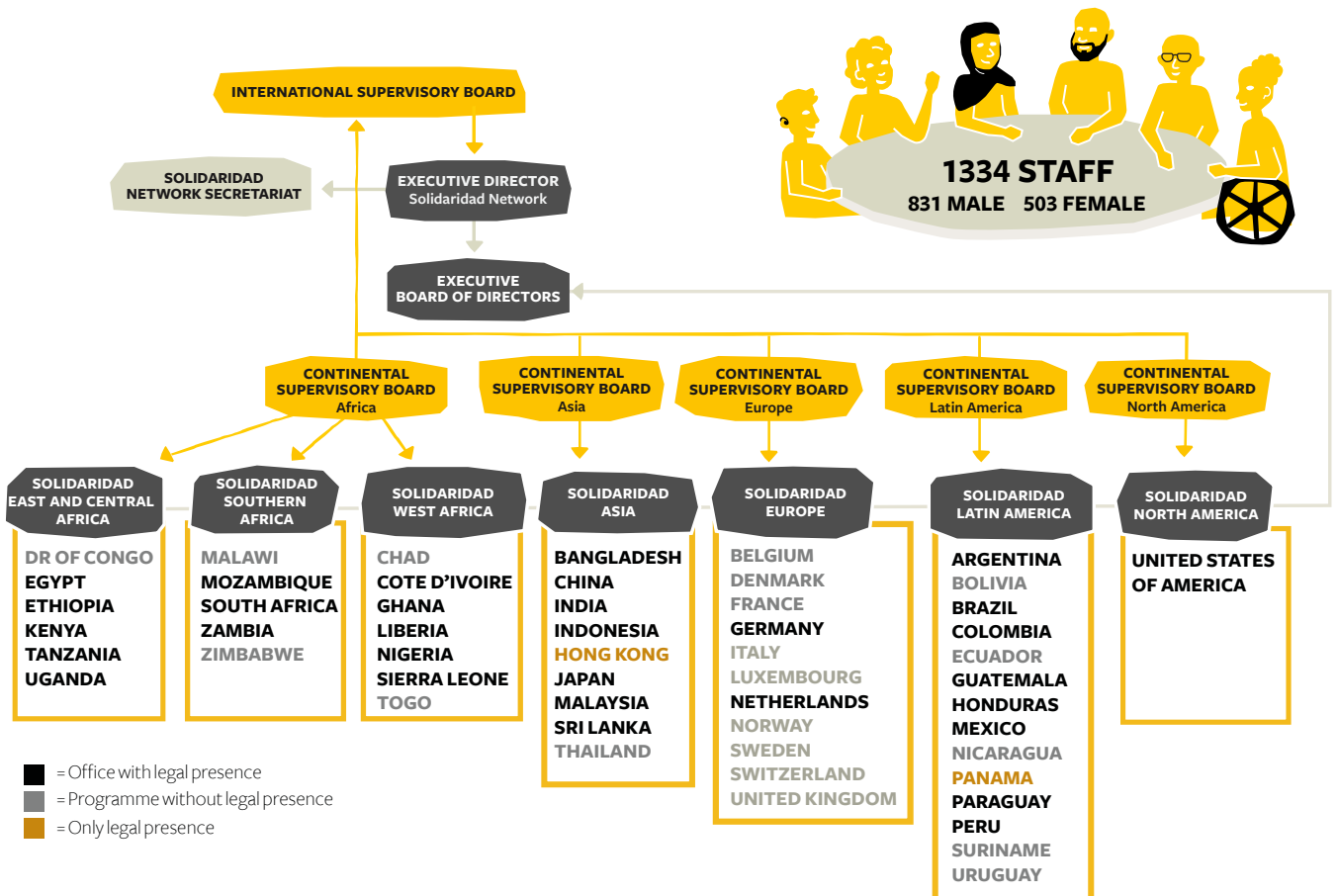
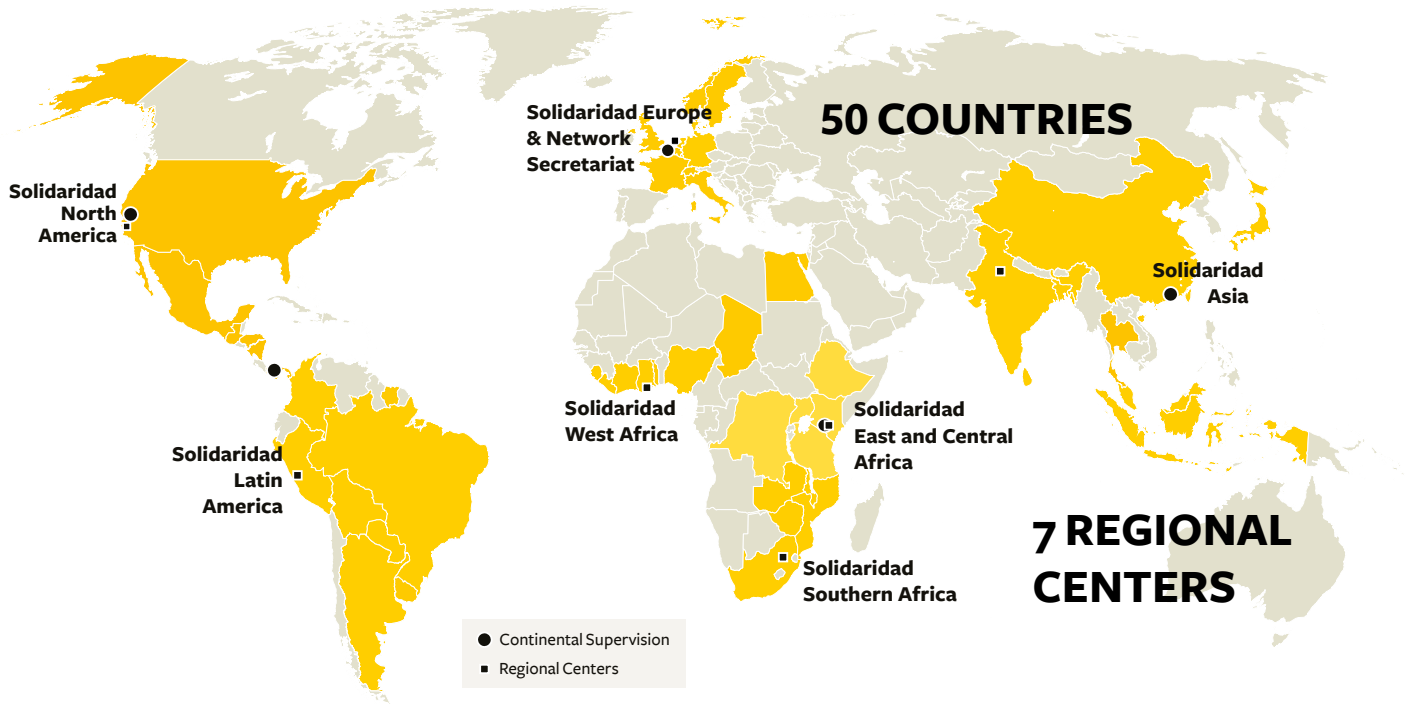

VISION AND MISSION

Our vision is **an economy that works for all**: a world in which all we produce, and all we consume, can sustain us while respecting the planet, each other and the next generations.

Our mission is to enable farmers and workers to earn a living income, shape their own future, and produce in balance with nature, by working throughout the supply chain to **make sustainability the norm**.

A GLOBAL NETWORK



A FEW EXAMPLES OF OUR WORK

107,850 coffee, tea, and food products farmers achieved on average a 16.5 percent increase in production through the adoption of good agricultural practices coupled with improved access to last-mile services, such as training, quality inputs, and financial assistance.



EAST AFRICA

In 2023, the tea programme in India supported the establishment of 24 farmer-producer organizations (with 1,489 growers), and 124 self-help groups (with 2,995 growers).

EUROPE

Through our advocacy work for smallholder-inclusive legislation in Europe, we influenced the Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive (CSDDD) and the Deforestation Regulation (EUDR).



SIERRA LEONE

In Sierra Leone, we completed the construction of the first-ever automated cashew nut factory, aiding efficient processing. Solidaridad trained a total of 4,968 cashew farmers in 360 Farmer Field Schools using 80 community facilitators.

With Cargill in Bolivia, we worked with 200 producers in adopting sustainable practices across 21,220 hectares of soy. In Paraguay, we worked with 445 producers, farm workers, and staff from the cooperatives, resulting in 6,998 hectares under sustainable management.



SOUTH AMERICA

43 civil society organisations were empowered with advocacy and lobbying skills enabling them to participate in regional and international sector dialogues and influence policy processes.



EAST AFRICA



ZAMBIA

Under the AFR100 agroforestry project in Zambia, a total of 136,772 trees were planted and 227,473 seedlings were grown, reflecting a significant investment in reforestation efforts.



THAILAND

Through the SoliTrace system, a digital continuous improvement system, we helped to achieve an average yield increase of 14.3 percent and nearly 1.9 billion litres of water savings with fruit farmers.

We organized the Climbing against Climate Poverty event in November 2023, whereby we activated over 35,000 people and collected more than 25,000 thousand euros in donations.



NETHERLANDS

We onboarded new producers into the ACORN platform in Colombia (9,514), Honduras (1,557), and Nicaragua (6,910), all of whom manage 44,317 hectares under agroforestry systems. In Peru, the first participating 376 farmers received payments for 161,665 US dollars for the carbon captured since 2021.

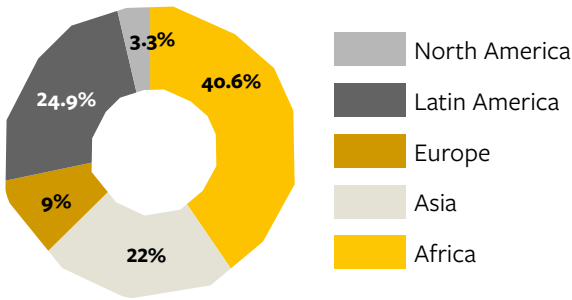
In West Africa, we trained 15,718 food crop farmers in sustainable practices such as climate-smart agriculture, post-harvest techniques and storage methods across the region.



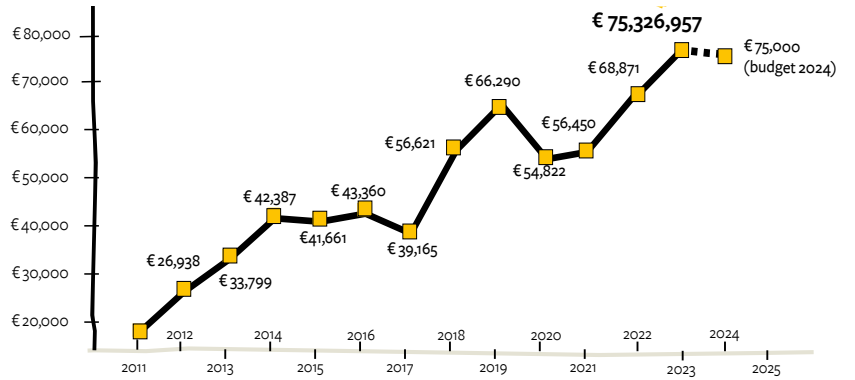
SOUTHERN AFRICA

We supported 3,258 producers with knowledge of post-harvest technologies and storage construction, and trained 916 farmers, especially women, on sustainable production. We registered 4,720 farmers, and organized training on financial literacy and village savings and lending principles.
