EHSTALKS: MOVING THE NEEDLE AND MEETING OBJECTIVES

EFFECTIVELY MANAGING SUSTAINABILITY & SUPPLY CHAIN STEWARDSHIP/ DOWNSTREAM DUE DILIGENCE PROGRAMS

Supply chain failures at Love Canal and other uncontrolled or poorly-managed waste sites in the USA resulted in "polluter pays" requirements in the CERLA/ Superfund Law (1980). Since its advent, Superfund has *extracted* over \$46 billion (through FY2020) from "responsible parties". Cost avoidance programs implemented by companies operating in the USA in reaction to Superfund evolved into best management practices focusing on downstream due diligence. "Polluter pays" schemes are rapidly expanding beyond the USA and North America to include mandatory European "Sustainability and (Supply Chain) Due Diligence" laws (imminent European Directive for implementation worldwide by 2027). Given this, Chris Bryant of 3M Company will comment on the challenges that industry faces in these areas.

Together with Jeff Sacre of CHWMEG, the session will address:

• External pressures: ESG reporting, financial incentives, and customer mandates.

- Internal pressures: Sustainability initiatives driven by workforce, investors, and Board expectations.
- Global legal requirements, including the impending EU Supply Chain Due Diligence Directive.
- Resource allocation to mitigate CERCLA-type risks in waste and recycling facilities worldwide.

EVOLVING LEADERSHIP IN EHS

In today's fast-paced and increasingly regulated world, EHS leadership is facing unprecedented challenges. PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT IN THE WORKPLACE: THE ANTHROPOMETRY OF WOMEN'S PPE

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is a critical component in preventing workplace injuries and fatalities, with countless lives saved each year by properly fitted gear. However, when PPE is not tailored to the specific needs of the worker, it can pose significant risks, especially for women in the workforce. Poorly fitting PPE can lead to discomfort, reduced effectiveness, and, in some cases, serious injuries, highlighting a critical gap in workplace safety measures.

In this eye-opening session, Jana Gessner, Global Head of EHS for PepsiCo, will spotlight the often-overlooked issue of ill-fitting PPE for women in EHS roles.
