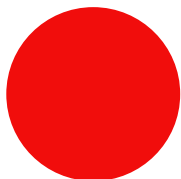

These simple guidelines will help the Show work well for both schools and agents.



VERY IMPORTANT

Do NOT approach schools with a red sticker on their name board

When you arrive

After entering the Show please go straight to the information desk to collect your Agent's Lanyard. You MUST wear the lanyard.

Which schools can agents' approach?

NOT schools displaying a RED STICKER on their name-board. All other exhibitors are willing to speak with agents.

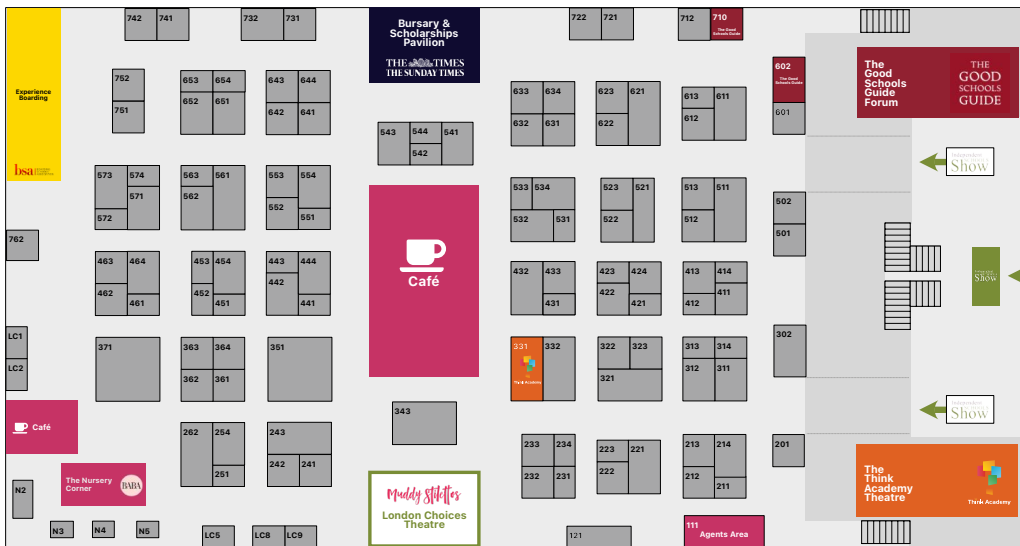
How to approach schools

1. You must wear your agent's lanyard.
2. Please identify yourself as an agent immediately in conversation with a school. This helps them to ensure that you speak with the appropriate member of staff and are given the information you need.
3. Please be aware that schools' primary focus will be talking to parents at the Show. When talking to schools be ready to step aside if a parent approaches.
4. If you see any unregistered agents please inform the organisers.

DIRECTIONS

Directions within park - use the entrance immediately south of Chelsea Bridge. Once inside the Park go along North Carriage Drive. Take the second exit off the small roundabout, signed Independent Schools Show.

TRANSPORT

Car

The Park is outside the congestion charge zone, but inside the new Ultra Low Emission Zone. [Check here](#) to find out whether your vehicle meets the standard.

Parking: there are pay & display places within the park and nearby.

Tube

The nearest tube stations are Battersea Power Station (Northern Line) and Sloane Square station (Circle & District lines).

Bus

These buses pass by or near the Park: 19, 44, 49, 137, 156, 319, 344, 345, 452

Go to the Park Entrance on the south side of Chelsea Bridge (see directions within the Park above)

British Rail

- Queenstown Road Station: exit station to right along Queenstown Road, walk 300m, Battersea Park is on the left (see directions above).
- Battersea Park Station: exit station to right along Battersea Park Road, walk 50m to traffic lights. Right into Queenstown Road, walk 150m. Park is on the left (see directions above)
- Victoria Station: take train to Battersea Park Station (see directions within park above) or take 44 bus from Victoria to Battersea Park.
