Qualsafe Level 3 Award in First Response Emergency Care (RQF)

Fulfilling the competencies set out in the PHEM skills framework at level D, this qualification is perfect for those seeking a career in the emergency services, ambulance service, the event and security medical sector or those who work in high-risk workplaces. Over a 5-day period, learners will gain the knowledge and competencies needed to deal with a range of prehospital care emergencies, such as: managing a patient's airway, catastrophic bleeding, management of fractures, medical emergencies and more.



A bespoke 2-day FREC3 RPL Course

This new 2-day FREC3 RPL Course is for learners who hold an approved qualification that makes them exempt from attending 3 (out of 5) course days for the Qualsafe Level 3 Award in First Response Emergency Care (RQF) (L3 FREC) or allows them direct entry onto the Qualsafe Level 4 Certificate in First Response Emergency Care (RQF) (L4 FREC).

The Course brings clarity on the RPL route for learners and opens up new opportunities for our Centres.



Qualsafe Level 4 Certificate in First Response Emergency Care (RQF)

As the next step for those who have completed the Qualsafe Level 3 Award in First Response Emergency Care (RQF) or equivalent, this qualification provides learners with a wider scope of practice in prehospital care emergencies, allowing for greater employment opportunities.

Successful candidates will gain the practical and theoretical capabilities needed to respond to a wide range of prehospital care emergencies, such as: major incidents, fracture immobilisation, sick and injured children, and mental health issues. This qualification is specifically designed for those looking to progress their career within the NHS or independent ambulance services as an emergency care assistant, intermediate ambulance practitioner, event medical provider, associate practitioner or healthcare assistant.

The third step in our FREC® pathway, the Qualsafe Level 5 Diploma in First Response Emergency and Urgent Care (RQF) (FREUC5) allows learners to attain comprehensive factual and theoretical knowledge, technical and non-technical skills in broad contexts of out-of-hospital (pre-hospital) emergency and urgent care. It gives learners everything they need to further progress their career within a wide range of out-of-hospital emergency and urgent care settings.

Learners will attain and develop clinical and non-technical skills in the out-of-hospital emergency and urgent care environment required to deal with a wide range of prehospital care situations, such as medical emergencies, cardiac arrest, child birth and complex incidents.

How West Midlands Fire Service equips their teams using First Response Emergency Care (FREC®) qualifications



Qualsafe Awards' driving qualifications

These Ofqual regulated qualifications are developed and reviewed by industry experts and enable learners to prepare, drive and manoeuvre ambulance vehicles in differing emergency and non-emergency roles.

These interlinking qualifications meet the core requirements of emergency ambulance driving in NHS Ambulance Trusts, Independent Ambulance Services and the Voluntary Aid Societies whilst supporting the NHS.

Emergency Response Ambulance Driving Update Course

The Emergency Response Ambulance Driving Update course is an unregulated update course covering the latest best practice in ambulance driving, as defined by subject matter experts, the AACE Emergency Ambulance Response Driver's Handbook and NHS Ambulance Trusts.

Designed in preparation for the introduction of Section 19 of the Road Safety Act (2006), this course plugs the gap in ambulance driver refresher training, enabling ambulance drivers to retain competence.

It includes Highway Code updates, legislation updates, driver attitude and behaviour, routine and emergency response driving, use of exemptions, and motorway procedures.

Qualifications

Qualsafe Level 3 Certificate in Emergency Response Ambulance Driving (RQF) (CERAD)

Developed by industry experts, reviewed by the Driver Training Advisory Group (DTAG) and already being used to support frontline ambulance services in emergency response roles.

The CERAD qualification enables learners to prepare, drive and manoeuvre ambulance vehicles in both emergency and non-emergency situations, and can be delivered in the following vehicle categories:

- Class 2 Category B Solo Response Vehicle
- Class 2 Category B Motor Ambulance: 3250kg-3500kg
- Class 3 Category C1 Motor Ambulance Weight: Exceeding 3500kg



Qualsafe Level 3 Award in Patient Care Services: Ambulance Driving (RQF)

This non-emergency patient transport qualification confirms competence when driving an ambulance to the routine standards required by NHS Trusts and CQC registered ambulance services.

Learners who successfully complete this qualification will have demonstrated the safe and competent driving of an ambulance during routine driving conditions conducive to safe, smooth patient transport.

This qualification ensures safe, legal driving practices in accordance with the Highway Code, Road Traffic Act and Roadcraft.



Qualsafe Level 4 Diploma in Ambulance Driving Instruction (RQF)

This qualification teaches learners how to become an Ambulance Driving Instructor.

Successful learners will be able to demonstrate safe instruction at all times and gain a higher level of subject matter knowledge in emergency response ambulance driving instruction.

This qualification covers driving under routine and emergency response conditions.

1 Choosing your End-Point Assessment Organisation (EPAO)

Qualsafe Awards provides a personal and collaborative onboarding process which makes sure we are the right fit for you.

Getting Set Up with an EPA agreement with Qualsafe Awards

When you have chosen Qualsafe Awards as your EPAO, the next step will be to sign the EPA Agreement.

3 EPA Registration

Using our intuitive EPA Platform you can register your apprentices with ease – either individually or as a bulk upload.

Planning Meeting - Prior to Gateway

As part of your EPA journey with Qualsafe, we include a free planning meeting which gives you the opportunity to discuss your upcoming assessment day(s), commonly referred to as the EPA Event.

5 Gateway – Signing off the Apprentice for EPA

The employer, training provider, and apprentice will confirm that all Gateway requirements have been met by completing the EPA Gateway Declaration Form. This form will also confirm that the apprentice is ready for EPA.

(6) EPA Event Booking

Once the gateway evidence has been successful, the EPA Event can be booked!

(7) EPA Event

The assessment day has arrived!

Our Independent End-Point Assessors (IEPAs) will carry out the EPA Events either face to face or remotely.

8 EPA Results and Certification

Following quality assurance, we will upload all EPA results and inform the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education (IfATE) who will send the final apprenticeship certificate to the employer.



Ambulance Support Worker (Emergency, Urgent and Non-Urgent) (ASW)

Who is this apprenticeship standard for?

This apprenticeship is ideal for those taking their first steps in an emergency and urgent care role, supporting registered and non-registered healthcare professionals in a non-clinical capacity. This could include driving an ambulance while a paramedic looks after the patient or transporting non-critical patients.



Programme Structure

This apprenticeship will take approximately one year to complete. During this time the apprentice will learn about patient care, safely driving ambulance vehicles, assisting with delegated clinical tasks and interventions alongside soft skills such as working as part of a team, effective communication and conflict resolution.

With the knowledge, skills and behaviours gained through this apprenticeship, successful individuals will be competent and job ready as an Ambulance Support Worker.

End-Point Assessment methods

The End-Point Assessment consists of:

1. Simulated Observations 2. A Professional Discussion

Both are equally weighted and can be undertaken in any order. The apprentice does not have to pass one before being able to undertake the other.

Qualifications

Apprentices will need to complete two mandatory qualifications covering ambulance care and ambulance driving (emergency or non-emergency), with the combination being selected based on the specific role (this standard supports four different role types).

One accredited level 3 ambulance care qualification, from:

- · Qualsafe Level 3 Diploma in Ambulance Emergency and Urgent Care Support (RQF)
- · Certificate in Ambulance Patient Care: Urgent Care Services
- · Award in Ambulance Patient Care: Non-Urgent Care Services
- · Certificate in Ambulance Patient Care: Non-Urgent Care Services

and;

One accredited ambulance driving qualification, from:

- · Qualsafe Level 3 Certificate in Emergency Response Ambulance Driving (RQF)
- · Level 3 Award in Patient Care Services: Ambulance Driving
- Legacy IHCD driving awards for Emergency and non-emergency driving will be accepted where candidates can demonstrate current and relevant driving experience.



Associate Ambulance Practitioner (AAP)

Who is this apprenticeship standard for?

Ideal for those who want to work as part of the emergency and urgent care setting – providing high quality and compassionate care while working as part of an ambulance crew responding to 999 calls. Working at a level above that of Healthcare Support Workers, the AAP will assess, treat, and manage service users at the scene and either refer them to alternative care provisions, where treatment lies outside of their scope, or safely discharge them on scene.

Programme Structure

The apprenticeship lasts between 12 to 18 months, with candidates expected to be ready for Gateway at 13 months. During this period, candidates will gain a variety of skills, including airway, respiratory and circulatory management, use of medical gases, promoting mental health and wellbeing, and much more. In addition, they will gain soft skills such as effective communication, conflict resolution, and working closely and collaboratively with others.

This structure and the knowledge, skills, and behaviours apprentices will gain during this time meet the full apprenticeship standard set out by NENAS, which is widely accepted within ambulance services for the role of Associate Ambulance Practitioner.
