Located a short distance from SAHMRI is Lot Fourteen, a creative and innovation precinct that is all about nurturing talent and driving jobs in some of the world's fastest growing industries. Lot Fourteen brings together industry, government and academia in a cross section of industries including space, defence and hi-tech. It is home to world-renowned global companies, start-ups and the Australian Space Agency.

Adelaide is also home to the <u>Tonsley Innovation District</u>, a 61 hectare (150 acre) site where leading-edge research and education institutions, established businesses, and start-ups, business incubators, accelerators, government and the wider community come together to connect and collaborate.

### Access

Adelaide Airport is a 10-minute drive to the city centre. A major upgrade of the airport is currently underway to expand its main terminal and upgrade international arrivals, departures and create more retail and dining options.

#### Access

Brisbane Airport is a 20-minute trip to the city centre, accessible via a direct rail link. The airport opened a second runway in July 2020 allowing the airport to operate at the same capacity as Singapore and Hong Kong.

## Accommodation

Brisbane is home to over 21,000 hotel rooms across the city centre and an additional 1,400 rooms are in development and set to open by 2024.



As the tropical capital city of Australia's Northern Territory, <u>Darwin</u> is framed on three sides by the ocean. Darwin's strategic location enables key access to Asia and Europe with direct flights into Darwin International airport. Darwin is also the gateway to the iconic landscapes of Australia's Top End and Central Australia that feature World Heritage listed sites Kakadu National Park and Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park.



Australia's Northern Territory is acknowledged globally as having one of the most pristine marine environments in the world. The Northern Territory Government operates the Darwin Aquaculture Centre; a purpose built research facility providing staff dedicated to assisting the research and development of aquaculture ventures. Aquaculture in the Top End includes farming and processing of barramundi, crocodiles and the famous Australian South Sea pearls.



#### Access
