




PsyEdu - Our Aims

What are psychedelics?

From the Greek Psyche (mind/soul) + delos (manifest)

Physiologically safe & non-addictive substances (Nichols, 2016)

- but not risk-free!

- "...producing expanded consciousness through heightened awareness and feeling" (Osmond, 1956)
- Medicines or sacraments?





What are psychedelics?

<u>Classic psychedelics</u> (5HT-2A agonists)

LSD, psilocybin, mescaline, DMT, ayahuasca

Empathogens (serotonin agonists, DA/NA/Oxytocin) MDMA, MDA, 2-C series

Dissociatives (NMDA antagonists)

ketamine, PCP, nitrous oxide

Unique substances

ibogaine, 'mad honey,' amanita muscaria, 5-MEO DMT, Syrian rue...





















Figure 2: Drogs ordered by their overall harm scores, showing the separate contributions to the overall scores of harms to users and harm to others. The weights after normalisation (0-100) are shown in the key (comutative in the sense of the sum of all the normalised weights for all the eitheria to users, 46; and for all the criteria to others, 54). CW-cumulative weight, GHb-y hydrosybutyric acid. LSD-lysergic acid diethylamide.








How do psychedelics work?

It's complicated . . . Biochemically • Neurologically • Psychologically Mystically











During placebo experience




A high-dose psychedelic experience is like shaking up a snow globe, disrupting unhealthy patterns of thought and providing an opportunity for them to resettle differently

But more importantly... Not just for Mental Health diagnoses

Results from Healthy Normal trials and Retreats

- Health Behaviours: plant-based diets, giving up smoking, reducing alcohol, Nature-time, more emotional awareness and expression, attention to self-care, pro-social tendencies
- **Psychological shifts:** creativity, openness, flexibility,
- **Personal development:** social relations, personal efficacy, self-actualisation
- **Societal shifts:** greater autonomy, questioning of power structures and values
- **Planetary benefits:** pro-environmental behaviours








What is happening now In Australia

- As of July 1, 2023, MDMA for PTSD, psilocybin for TRD
- 2024: 9 named psychiatrists, 1000's on waiting lists, 10's of thousands waiting
- Training programmes burgeoning
- But costs are high £10-15,000 for 6-9mths treatment
- A LOT OF HYPE!!!
- Increasing numbers of adults are self-medicating






What is happening now In the USA

- Esketamine expensive
- MDMA & Psilocybin federally illegal but state/city laws decriminalised
- A LOT OF HYPE!!!
- **Increasing numbers of adults are self-medicating**





Ketamine - legal but off-licence, clinics a-plenty – serious safety concerns

• FDA fast-track BUT slower than hoped – 2025? (implications for UK/Europe)




So what can people do with the Cert?

 - Facilitating retreats with other orgs


 - Therapeutic sitting services (in the Netherlands) - Ketamine-assisted psychotherapy clinics

The PHP Network


- Formed in 2019: Education -


Who is it for?
