KEY INSIGHTS

- Just 11% of environmental professionals believe that the Government will meet its goal to become net-zero by 2050.
- The thing environmental professionals would like to change most about the sector is greenwashing.
- 59% of respondents think single use plastic items should be banned.
- 80% of organisations either have or will have a net zero strategy in place.
- Funding, rising costs, budgetary pressures and the current economic situation featured heavily in what people listed as the biggest challenges they are facing right now.

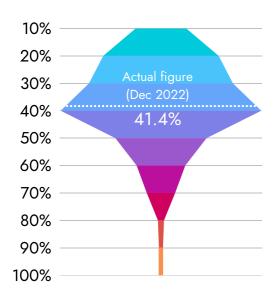
Greenwashing highlighted as the thing the environment sector would like to change the most.





Will the government meet its goal to decarbonise all sectors of the UK economy and become net zero by 2050?



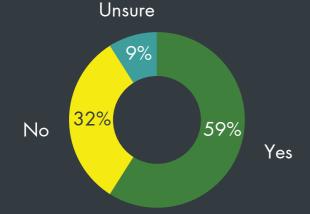


Without googling, rounded to the nearest 10%, what percentage of the UK's energy supply came from renewable sources in 2022?

Does your organisation have a net zero strategy to tackle its carbon emissions?

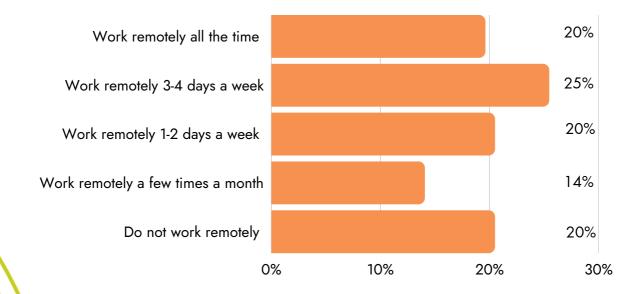




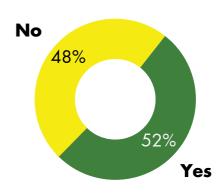
How do you predict your organisation will perform financially in 2023, compared to 2022?

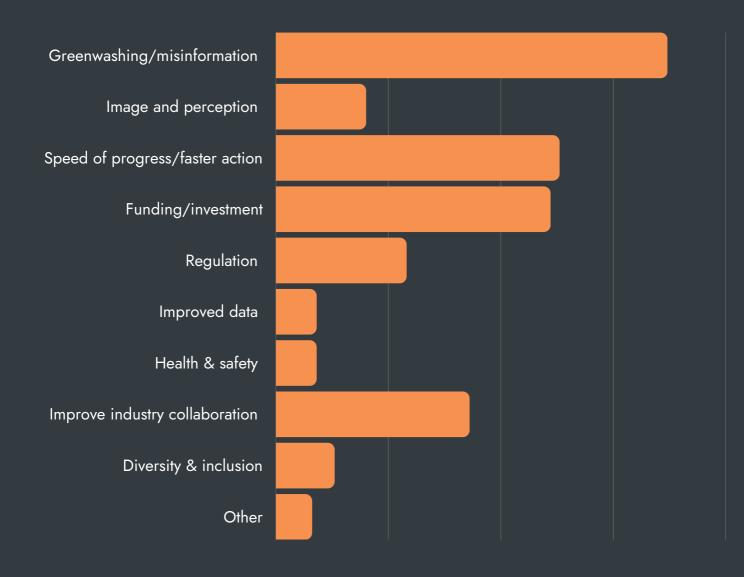

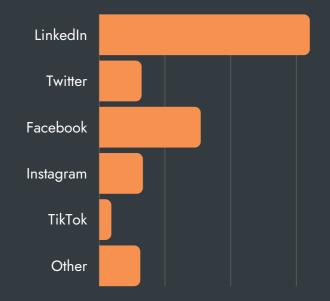
