Variations in salary are also dependent on level of experience, age, responsibilities and location.

Agronomist (crop vet)



Overview of role:

Agronomist (crop vet)

An agronomist's role is to advise the farmer on the scientific aspects of growing crops and managing soils to ensure maximum productivity and help protect the environment.

Also known as an agriculturalist (crops), crop scientist, agricultural consultant, agronomy manager, or crop vet. Agronomists work to use chemical, physical and biological methods keep their crops healthy.

Architect/Building designer Agriculture and Horticulture buildings specialist



Overview of role:

Architect/Building designer

This type of specialist architecture or building design allows farmers and growers to have buildings that exactly meet their needs in terms of size, ventilation and energy efficiency.

Industrial architecture prioritises the practical use of a building over its exterior appearance, making it functionally ideal. These developments also face additional complications in gaining planning permission for buildings or landscaping prior to the start of any project.

Beekeeper



Overview of role:

Beekeeper

An apiary, often called a beekeeper, maintains and manages colonies of honeybees for the production of honey as well as to provide pollination services.

Beekeepers will also construct hives, replace combs, and collect and package any hive products including honey, beeswax, and pollen.

Overview of role:

Breeding technician/ Artificial insemination technician

A breeding technician is responsible for the successful breeding programme of cows within a dairy herd to high welfare standards and to ensure a sustainable farm business.

There are also roles that involve the artificial insemination of pigs.

No animals are injured during the act of mating

- No humans are injured by large potentially aggressive bulls
- Farmers get access to better bull genetics and more breeding options
- Al reduces the rate of transmission of STIs/STDs
- You remove the cost of keeping a bull on the farm

Using an understanding of the farmed and native flora and fauna of the British Isles allows a chef to produce highly prized recipes and food which showcase what British Farmers and growers can produce.

Could be self-employed or work in a specialist restaurant/ hotel/catering organisation. You will need to have good relationships with producers and may even grow some of your own produce.

Overview of role:

Commercial horticulturalist

Commercial horticulturists are involved in the growing, distribution and selling of food, crops and plants.

As a commercial grower, you'll usually specialise in field crops, protected growing (for example, under glass), soft and top fruit, hardy nursery stock or cut flowers.

Fieldsperson (pig breeding specialist)



Overview of role:

Fieldsperson (pig breeding specialist)

A fieldsperson advises pig farm managers on the latest techniques and management processes that will optimise breeding and production on their pig units.

May be employed by a large farming company or work as an independent specialist.

Livestock scanner



Overview of role:

Livestock scanner

The technician operates a scanner that uses soundwaves to build a picture of the animals' internal organs and any foetus developing within the womb.

Images are then sent to a screen, allowing the livestock scanner to see the number of offspring and any health conditions the animals may have.

Soil scientist

By carrying out research and using their findings to solve problems, soil scientists help to sustain biological infrastructures across the world.

As a soil scientist you'll gather, interpret and evaluate information about the chemistry, biology and physics of soil. Using the information obtained from this analysis, you'll inform and influence on diverse issues such as, agricultural production, biodiversity, climate change, environmental quality and human health land remediation.



Overview of role:

Animal nutritionist

The role of an animal nutritionist is to promote a better understanding of the effect of diet on the health, wellbeing and productivity of animals.

Most roles in this field are in agriculture, where you'll provide advice and information on animal nutrition, and design and evaluate the diets of the animals you work with. There are also roles in advising on the nutrition of zoo and companion animals (pets).

Food produced and sold in the UK must be accurately analysed for nutritional content, allergens and safety and this is performed by food scientists.

Much of the data generated in this process must then be presented on packaging and more recently on menus.

Farm manager (Crops) aka. Arable farm manager

The farm manager is responsible for successfully producing crops, such as wheat, barley or oilseed rape in a sustainable farm business that promotes good environmental practice.

To do this they must understand many aspects of plant science, good business practice and mechanical engineering.

Biomass farmer

Farmer, engineer or plant technician



Overview of role:

Biomass farmer, engineer or plant technician

Humans have always relied on plants for fuel. It's only in the last 200 years that we've utilised fossil sources to provide our heating needs, drive our industrial processes, give us light and power our vehicles.

Some energy crops are familiar such as oilseed rape and sugar beet for transport fuels, while others are less so, such as willows and poplars, grown as short rotation coppice, and miscanthus for heat and electricity.

Hedgelaying is a skill that has been practised for centuries. It has many regional variations in style and technique.

Hedgelaying is the process of partially cutting and then bending the stems of a line of shrubs or small trees, near ground level, without breaking them, so as to encourage them to produce new growth from the base and create a living 'farm animal proof fence'. Hedgelayers need to understand the internal structure of a plant's stem to carry out this technique effectively and keep the plant alive.

While some chemicals can cause environmental harm when developed and used incorrectly, modern chemists supporting the industry are acutely aware of the need to produce substances that promote crop growth without damaging the environment.

A successful calf rearer understands all the basic principles such as the best nutrition for growth, reducing stress, good housing and care. Calf rearers need excellent observation skills. They must look out for problems and prevent health issues in young animals.
