



## **SPE Workshop: Refracturing: A Proven Resource to Maximize Economic Recovery POSTER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES**

A poster session provides the opportunity for in-depth exchanges of information and promotes an effective level of communication between a speaker and the audience. The poster display should be prepared as graphic support of a specific topic that can be examined by colleagues, who in turn directly question the poster representative about any aspect of the display. From colleague feedback, the poster representative gains reaction, input, and ideas. **The posters will be on display during the Networking Reception on Monday, 19 May. All poster owners should be prepared to attend during the reception to discuss and answer attendee questions.**

**To encourage discussion, the Technical Program Committee is focusing on poster presentations with related new and proven technology.** The poster display may include graphs, tables, photographs or illustrations. All the material should be sufficient size to be easily read. The poster should generally be prepared in the following manner:

- Company logos, trademarks or specific product names are acceptable
- No confidential information should be included, and posters content should be available for distribution at the end of the Workshop
- Identify topic by title, presenter, contact information, and affiliation
  - Place the title prominently at the top of the poster to allow easy identification
  - Presenter name and affiliation could be written below the poster title. Use of company logo is allowed for the purpose of affiliation only.
- Include a brief abstract that summarizes the poster objective
- Make the display as self-explanatory as possible
- Place the information sequentially, beginning with the problem background/main idea, method used, result, conclusion, recommendation, etc. If possible, number/label the different sections accordingly so that it will be easier for the viewer to understand and follow your display
- Include actual case histories
- Keep illustrations simple by using charts, graphs, contrasting colors, drawings and pictures to create interest and visually explain a point
- Use large font for narrative materials. Recommended 36-point for segment title and 24-point for text
- Posters should not exceed 36-inches tall and 48-inches wide. A poster hard board (36-inches tall x 48-inches wide) with easel will be provided by SPE. The poster will be secured to the poster board with Velcro or double-sided tape

**Bring the final printed version of your poster with you to the workshop when you check in at Registration on Tuesday morning. The posters will be on display during Monday's networking reception and during coffee breaks on Tuesday.**

SPE will provide mounting materials and set the posters on easels for viewing.

In the workshop wrap-up materials, released or edited posters (in PDF format) will be made available to the attendees on a protected SPE URL site. Please complete the online **Presentation Release Form** to indicate which of the following options you prefer:

- 1) to release your presentation,
- 2) to release an edited version of your presentation, or
- 3) to decline release of your presentation.
