## **Protocol Tips: Nigeria**

As the liaison officer hosting the official delegation from Nigeria, you'll need to exhibit a high level of cultural sensitivity to ensure a successful and respectful interaction. Here are some specific considerations tailored to your role:

*Preparation and Research*: You will find the biography of the leader of your delegation in this Handbook. Please feel free to research the Nigerian delegation's background, including the individuals' positions and roles. Understanding their specific interests and objectives will help you tailor your interactions effectively.

Formal Communication: Nigerian culture places value on formal communication, especially in official settings. Use appropriate titles and honorifics when addressing delegation members and maintain a respectful and professional tone in all written and spoken communication.

*Protocol and Hierarchy*: Nigerian society has a strong hierarchical structure. Be aware of the different levels of authority within the delegation and treat each member with the appropriate level of respect and deference.

*Time Management*: While punctuality is important in Canada, be prepared for a more relaxed approach to time in Nigerian culture. Be patient if schedules shift and show understanding if delegation members arrive slightly later than expected.

Business Attire: Dress in a professional and polished manner. Canadian business attire tends to be more formal, which aligns with Nigerian preferences for well-dressed individuals in formal settings.

Interpersonal Space and Contact: Nigerians often engage in physical contact such as handshakes, back pats, and hugs. Respect personal space but reciprocate these gestures if initiated by the delegation members and you feel comfortable about doing so.

*Open Dialogue*: Encourage open and inclusive discussions when meeting your delegation. To the extent possible in the circumstances, try to create an environment where delegation members feel comfortable sharing their thoughts and opinions.

Cuisine and Dietary Restrictions: Given that meals such as the Opening Ceremonies are part of the program, inquire about any dietary restrictions or preferences within the delegation. While dietary inquiries were made as part of the delegate registration process the information provided may be incomplete.

Flexibility and Adaptability: Be flexible in accommodating unexpected changes and cultural differences that might arise during the visit. Adaptability will help create a positive experience for the delegation.

Cultural Diversity: Recognize Nigeria's diversity in terms of languages, ethnic groups, and traditions. Avoid making assumptions about the delegation members based on general stereotypes and show appreciation for their diverse backgrounds.

*Cultural Taboos*: Avoid pointing with your finger or feet, as it can be seen as disrespectful. Be cautious when discussing sensitive topics like politics, religion, and ethnic differences.
